As you may know, DOJ OPR is conducting an investigation into certain allegations of professional misconduct relating to the USAO-SDFL handling of the Jeffrey Epstein matter, originating in 2006 as Leap Year, that was ultimately addressed through the Florida state plea and federal non-prosecution agreement. My colleagues and I have obtained and reviewed records from the USAO-SDFL, and now need to review, and probably obtain some copies of, FBI case materials. I understand that while the evidence is still held in Miami, much of the case file is at the FBIHQ Records Management Unit in order for response to various FOIPA requests.
