Dear Ms. [REDACTED] and Mr. [REDACTED]:

I write to follow-up on the letter sent to you late last week by [REDACTED], Esq., co-counsel to Jeffrey Epstein. We are herewith providing various documents that were previously submitted to the Palm Beach State Attorney's Office in connection with its investigation of Mr. Epstein.

Enclosed are the following materials:

- The Palm Beach County Police Report concerning Mr. Epstein's former employee [REDACTED] burglaries of Mr. Epstein's home and the related installation of surveillance cameras.
- The Palm Beach County Police Report documenting the drug arrest of [REDACTED] in response to which [REDACTED] offered to provide information about Mr. Epstein in exchange for leniency.
- The Report by Victoria's Secret internal security personnel documenting allegations of numerous thefts by then employee [REDACTED].
- The Report of the polygraph examination of Mr. Epstein by [REDACTED], a polygraph expert frequently used by the Palm Beach County State Attorney's Office. In addition to his report, [REDACTED] himself was made available to the State Attorney's Office for

questioning. Though the Palm Beach County Police Department was also invited to attend, they declined to do so.

- Print out of the MySpace.com profile of [REDACTED] in which, among other things, Ms. [REDACTED] represents herself as 18 years of age at a time when she was not.
- Print out of the MySpace.com profile of [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] as she calls herself, in which among other things Ms. [REDACTED] admits to various frauds and frequent illegal drug use.
- Print out of the MySpace.com profile of [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] [REDACTED] as she calls herself, in which, among other things, there is discussion of illegal drug use.
- A credit card receipt for the purchase of a [REDACTED]. That purchase coincides with an incident reported by [REDACTED] in which she admits she voluntarily and on her own initiative gave Mr. Epstein a "birthday present", consisting of [REDACTED] and Mr. Epstein's girlfriend [REDACTED] Mr. Epstein's presence. The date of the receipt shows that Ms. [REDACTED] was over the age of 18 at the time.

Note, though we did supply airplane logs to the State Attorney, we understand you have a complete set of those records. For that reason, we have omitted those. If you require a copy we are of course prepared to provide it.

As [REDACTED] noted in her letter, we very much look forward to meeting with you on February 1, 2007. We believe we have, in addition to these materials, compelling arguments that no federal crime was committed and that the State Attorney's exercise of discretion in determining whether and what charges to bring against Mr. Epstein was fully supported by the evidence.
