V.I. WEATHER SUMMARY

There will be a mixture of sunshine and cloudiness during the day today. High temperatures will reach the mid 80's to 90 with easterly winds of 15 miles per hour. On Thursday, a tropical wave is forecast to enter the

northeast Caribbean bringing an increase in shower activity. The wave is moving to the west at 20 miles per hour and upper level winds are not favorable for development.

Across the coastal waters, mariners can expect winds to 18 knots and six foot seas. Small craft should exercise caution across the offshore Atlantic waters and local passages. North to northwest swells generated by Katia will continue to affect the Atlantic waters and all local passages through tonight. Boating and surf zone conditions will remain hazardous for at least the next 24 hours.

IN THE TROPICS

Tropical Depression Fourteen:

On the latest projected path, the storm's center is expected to remain to the northeast of the Virgin Islands when it passes on Saturday night. The latest projections keep the storm's center about 81 miles northeast of St. Croix around 7 pm Saturday; 41 miles northeast of St. John at 8 pm Saturday and 51 miles northeast of St. Thomas at 9 pm Saturday. The weather system would be a strong tropical storm with top winds of 70 miles per hour when it passes the territory.

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
