Good questions. In my case I'm interested in reaching (mostly) younger scientists and scholars who are genuinely skeptical, meaning before their worldview has collapsed into whatever is most expedient for their social or financial security.

Science has just begun to tackle the question of consciousness. The esoteric and mystical traditions have been immersed in it for at least 5,000 years. At this point, based on the preponderance of evidence from psi research, I am inclined to believe that consciousness is indeed fundamental, in some way. Perhaps it's not a full-blown idealism, but something along those lines.

In any case, the topic is important because what we think consciousness is forms the basis of our personal sense of self, which in turn shapes civilization. If our thinking is wrong (as in "we are merely meat machines, period"), then there's reason to suspect that civilization may be headed in the wrong direction. And that would not be good for anyone.
