Center Lavender will grow to 2- 2.5 ' blooming

Option 1

We plant as originally planned

If you still have concerns then relocate them to eastern and southern edge to frame design and select new plant material while you are on sight

Option 2

Plant grasses and once established we trim them Both options do not effect irrigation install and area would not look like a construction sight for your visit.

Note existing grass are trimmed every year to 6 inches, grow to roughly 2.5'
