FYI – I spoke to Jennifer Freeman just now. She represents [REDACTED]. We did not get into the facts of the case. I confirmed that [REDACTED] was not in immediate danger. Jennifer said that she was [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] I explained that we do not have authority to grant visas for these purposes, and typically when we have a witness in a foreign country, law enforcement will go to the foreign country to interview the witness, and we are only really able to parole witnesses into the country for trial testimony (a process that takes a substantial amount of time). I explained that T visas are available to victims of severe trafficking who are present in the United States and are cooperating with law enforcement. I told her that there wasn't really anything that we could do at this stage to get [REDACTED] into the country, but I told her she could call me if she thought of ways that we could assist (but reiterated that we may not be able to assist, but are available to discuss).

I am going to reach out to C-20 to have agents reach out to Jennifer to learn more about the facts of the case and to obtain any materials/evidence that might be helpful. Jennifer has said that [REDACTED] is not in a position to be interviewed at this point.

Thank you for being in touch, and for your assistance to [REDACTED]—and also thank you to Paul for assisting and facilitating. I've spoken with the human trafficking coordinator in our office, [REDACTED], who is our point person for these types of circumstances and I'm copying her so she can reach out to you directly. My general understanding is that we are very limited in our ability to affect immigration processes in particular, and that ordinarily it would go through law enforcement and/or the normal visa process, and it sounds like those are perhaps in progress, but [REDACTED] will know much better than I whether there are applicable exceptions to the normal prohibitions on our direct involvement. Thank you again for contacting us, and I certainly hope for a positive outcome for [REDACTED].

Dear [REDACTED] -
We reach out to you at the suggestion of Professor Paul Cassell who we understand has been in touch with you about our client, [REDACTED], a victim of long-term, sadistic sex trafficking in Israel, the United States, and Canada, and who appears to have information relevant to the Epstein investigation and other sex trafficking crimes in the U.S. and elsewhere.
We need immediate assistance obtaining entry into the U.S. for [REDACTED], [REDACTED] who has been sex trafficked for decades by her uncle, a powerful member of what we understand to be a well known Russian crime family, a Greek Orthodox Church priest reportedly known for abusing children, and others. As part of this

trafficking, there is pictorial and other evidence that [REDACTED] was raped at approximately age five in a NYC location that may have been 9 East 71st Street in Manhattan, Jeffrey Epstein's mansion.

In recent months, [REDACTED], who [REDACTED], has been subjected to increasing peril. Her traffickers have raped her, burned her, cut crosses on her abdomen, delivered threatening photos (e.g., photos of her own child sex abuse), and made clear that if she did not comply she would be seriously injured or killed.

For the last several months, Dr. Silberg and attorneys with the Marsh Law Firm PLLC have sought assistance from law enforcement without success. [REDACTED] repeatedly left tips on the FBI hotline, and briefly spoke with [REDACTED] from the Epstein SDNY Taskforce. [REDACTED] talked with several FBI agents as well as agents from Homeland Security, making images available to them. She was advised that they had enough information, did not want further information, and would be back to her. [REDACTED] provided Dr. [REDACTED] with additional images, which Dr. [REDACTED] transmitted to C3P, the Canadian Center for Child Protection, and both Dr. Silberg and C3P sought to share the images with U.S. law enforcement.

One of the photos depicts the rape of [REDACTED] as a child in or about 1997, with her face visible, in a room with a blue couch and a window facing the street. While the image outside the window is blurry, it appears to be consistent with the view from an upper floor room at the front of Epstein's mansion, which overlooks the Frick Museum across 71st Street between Madison and Fifth Avenues. [REDACTED] has provided other information evidencing that she was raped at Epstein's mansion -- she has said that the house was "big", was owned by a "rich" man, was located at "9 71", had a large, arched front door topped by a scary man's face and flanked on either side by women's faces, had a large, adult doll on a chandelier inside the house, had photos of what looked like important people around the house, and contained many bedrooms. The "bigger girls" were placed in other bedrooms. [REDACTED] recalls hearing the names "Jeffrey", [REDACTED], "Joseph Karo", "Yoav Gil", and others during her time at the house. Presumably law enforcement would be able to sharpen the image to determine whether the room overlooked the Frick Museum, and compare the information she has provided with the information known about the features and contents of Epstein's mansion and the perpetrators, to help determine whether she was raped there.

While [REDACTED] may make it difficult, prior to sufficient treatment, for her to talk directly with law enforcement, Dr. Silberg has received substantial evidence, including the photograph described above, written communications from [REDACTED], the names of other traffickers at Epstein's mansion, photographs of current wounds on [REDACTED] body and as a child, the names of perpetrators pictured in some of the photographs, current phone numbers of perpetrators who communicated with [REDACTED], and conversations with perpetrators.

We beseech you to do whatever you can to help [REDACTED] promptly enter the U.S. in order to enable us to deliver such information to law enforcement. While we realize a T1 visa may not be suitable at this time, a B2 tourist visa for medical care for a limited time may be, so that she can take advantage of medical treatment available through Polaris, or perhaps there is another option. Time is of the essence -- we are very concerned that the Russian crime family will track her down and take action against her and perhaps also those who have assisted her.
