2. If not, is there still a dispute over the terms of how he is interviewed?
3. If the DoJ wishes to speak Prince Andrew as a 'witness' or a 'subject' in the investigation?
4. If the DoJ wishes to speak to Prince Andrew in the US or UK?
5. How the DoJ responds to claims by Prince's Andrew's supporters earlier this year that US prosecutors have made misleading public statements about his alleged refusal to cooperate with investigators.
6. If the DoJ has obtained the original – rather than a copy – of the widely publicised picture purporting to show Prince Andrew with his arm around the waist of alleged sex trafficking victim [REDACTED] (17) in London in March 2001.

Please provide answers to these questions within the next 24 hours.
