1 MR. [REDACTED] This is Special Agent  
2 [REDACTED]. Today is Thursday, July 15,  
3 2021. The time is 2:15 p.m. My name is [REDACTED]  
4 [REDACTED] I'm a Special Agent with the U.S.  
5 Department of Justice Office of the Inspector  
6 General New York Field Office. And these are  
7 my credentials. This interview is with Federal  
8 Bureau of Prisons Mr. Daniels.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Hmph.  
10 MR. [REDACTED] And it is being conducted  
11 as part of an official U.S. Department of  
12 Justice Office of the Inspector General  
13 investigation. Today is July 15, 2021. The  
14 time is 2:16 p.m. The interview is being  
15 conducted at Metropolitan Correctional Center  
16 located at 150 Park Row. We are in the  
17 executive assistant's office. Also present is  
18 DOJ OIG Senior Special Agent [REDACTED]  
19 And the - also this interview will be recorded  
20 by me, Special Agent [REDACTED] Could  
21 everyone please identify themselves for the  
22 record and spell your last name. To start,  
23 again I am Special Agent [REDACTED]

25 MR. [REDACTED]: My name is Senior Special

1 Agent [REDACTED]

2 And these are my credentials. Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] can you, if  
4 you can, state your first and last name and  
5 spell them both for the record.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: My first name is [REDACTED]

7 [REDACTED] And the last name is [REDACTED]

8 [REDACTED] And my title is electronics  
9 technician.

10 MR. [REDACTED] So it's [REDACTED] without the  
11 S.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Without the S. No S.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I apologize for  
14 that. This is an official DOJ OIG  
15 investigation into the death of Inmate Jeffrey  
16 Epstein and the surrounding circumstances. You  
17 are being asked to voluntarily provide answers  
18 to our questions. Will you agree to a  
19 voluntary interview?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Please review DOJ OIG Form  
22 3-26226-2. The form states, U.S. Department of  
23 Justice Office of the Inspector General  
24 Warnings and Assurances to Employee Requested  
25 to Provide Information on a Voluntary Basis.

1 You are being asked to provide information as  
2 part of an investigation being conducted by the  
3 Office of the Inspector General. This  
4 investigation is being conducted pursuant to  
5 the Inspector General Act of 1978 as amended.  
6 This investigation pertains to job performance  
7 failure and security failure. I'm writing that  
8 in here.

9 MR. [REDACTED] And that doesn't mean  
10 your job performance failure. That means  
11 that's what the investigation is involving.

12 MR. [REDACTED] This is a voluntary  
13 interview. Accordingly, you do not have to  
14 answer any questions. No disciplinary action  
15 will be taken against you if you choose not to  
16 answer any questions. Any statement you  
17 furnish may be used as evidence in any future  
18 criminal proceedings or agency disciplinary  
19 proceedings or both. The waiver states I  
20 understand the warnings and assurances stated  
21 above and I am willing to make a statement and  
22 answer questions. No promises or threats have  
23 been made to me. And no pressure or coercion  
24 of any kind has been used against me. Please  
25 review the form. And if you understand it,

1 please sign where it says employee signature.

2 And print your name below it. Do you

3 understand the form?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I understand the  
5 form.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. [REDACTED] is  
7 signing the form. All right. Special Agent  
8 [REDACTED] is signing under line for signature of  
9 the Office of Inspector General Special Agent.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: And I'm Senior Special  
11 Agent [REDACTED] and I am signing as a  
12 signature of witness and I will write the date  
13 as July 15, 2021, and the time is 2:19 p.m. at  
14 the MCC New York.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Before starting the  
16 interview, I would like to place you under  
17 oath. [REDACTED] can you please raise your  
18 right hand? Do you swear to tell the truth and  
19 nothing but the truth during this interview?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

21 MR. [REDACTED] During the interview if  
22 you don't understand any of the questions I  
23 ask, please ask me. Please let me know. I'll  
24 rephrase it or I'll try to repeat it for you.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

1 MR. [REDACTED] I want to clarify. This  
2 interview is specifically regarding Inmate  
3 Jeffrey Epstein on August 9th and 10th and the  
4 circumstances that surround it. What is your  
5 current home address?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh [REDACTED]

8 MR. [REDACTED] What's your date of birth?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED] Date of

11 MR. [REDACTED] Your Social Security

14 MR. [REDACTED]: What is your current cell  
15 phone number?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Uh [REDACTED]

17 MR. [REDACTED] What is the highest level  
18 of education?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Uh some college.

20 MR. [REDACTED] What college?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Community college. Like a  
22 first year.

23 MR. [REDACTED] Do you know the name of  
24 the college?

25 MR. [REDACTED] La Guardia Community

1 College.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Is that in New  
3 York City?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And was there a specific  
6 major you were -?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Electrical engineer.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. What did you do  
9 prior to working for the BOP?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I worked at TSA. I was a  
11 transportation security officer.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And do you have any  
13 military service?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Four years. Active  
15 duty from 2000 to 2004. United States Marine  
16 Corps. I was a 2846 Regular Repairman.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: And was it an honorable  
18 discharge?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED] How long have you served  
21 with the Federal Bureau of Prisons?

22 MR. [REDACTED] Uh since March 24, 2013 to  
23 present.

24 MR. [REDACTED] March 24, 2013. And you  
25 were working at TSA directly before this?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

2 MR. [REDACTED] All right. What was your  
3 Enter on Duty Date?

4 MR. [REDACTED] To here is March 24, 2013  
5 I believe.

6 MR. [REDACTED] When did you graduate from  
7 BOP training?

8 MR. [REDACTED] don't know. That was  
9 probably, I don't know. Probably the following  
10 March. So maybe March of 2014.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And were you with  
12 the MCC the whole time?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no. I started off in  
14 Brooklyn as a correctional officer from 2013 to  
15 2015. And in 2015 to about 2017, I went to  
16 Terre Haute. And that's when I became an  
17 electronics technician.

18 MR. [REDACTED] : Where did you go?

19 MR. [REDACTED] : Uh Terre Haute, Indiana.  
20 So Federal complex.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Another prison. And  
23 that's where I became an electronics technician  
24 and I stayed there for about a year and a half.  
25 Then I moved back to New York City.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Did you come back to the  
2 MCC?  
3 MR. [REDACTED] MCC New York as an  
4 electronics technician.  
5 MR. [REDACTED] What year did you come  
6 back to the MCC?  
7 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe four or five  
8 years ago, so 2016 around that time - 2017.  
9 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.  
10 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure of the  
11 dates.  
12 MR. [REDACTED] And you've been here at  
13 the MCC since then?  
14 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I've been here since  
15 then.  
16 MR. [REDACTED] And what was your - what's  
17 your current position?  
18 MR. [REDACTED] Electronics technician.  
19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And what shift were  
20 you on?  
21 MR. [REDACTED] Uh.  
22 MR. [REDACTED] Normally. What's your  
23 normal?  
24 MR. [REDACTED] My normal day is 6:00 to  
25 2:00.

1 MR. [REDACTED] 6:00 to 2:00?  
2 MR. [REDACTED] Day watch.  
3 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.  
4 MR. [REDACTED] Just before we go on. As  
5 an electronics technician, when did you  
6 actually become that?  
7 MR. [REDACTED] Um of 2015 - in March of  
8 2015.  
9 MR. [REDACTED] And does that involve  
10 like specialized training?  
11 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh yes. What the Bureau  
12 gives you and my background because I did a -  
13 before I started with the Bureau I had about 15  
14 years in electronics with the military and  
15 government contractor and in the private  
16 sector. I did electronics for about 15 years  
17 before.  
18 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So what training  
19 did you receive specifically in that field?  
20 MR. [REDACTED] IN the Bureau? Or -?  
21 MR. [REDACTED] Just overall.  
22 MR. [REDACTED] Oh.  
23 MR. [REDACTED] Since you said you only  
24 did - you did college. I mean it doesn't have  
25 to be specifically.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Oh.

2 MR. [REDACTED] I mean just like in  
3 general.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Well I could troubleshoot  
5 certain cores at component level like a  
6 starter. Use hand tools.

7 MR. [REDACTED] So are you talking about  
8 like on the job experience?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Everything's pretty  
10 much on the job. And then in the Marine Corps  
11 I went for training for about a year in  
12 electronics.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. So one electronic -  
14 one year with the Marine Corps and then what  
15 about with the BOP? Did they provide training?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Um it's pretty much on the  
17 job.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

19 MR. [REDACTED] I went to one telephone  
20 school and that was about it. And a fire alarm  
21 training.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

23 MR. [REDACTED] But everything is pretty  
24 much on the job.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Thank you.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Anything else on that?  
2 MR. [REDACTED] Hm-mm.  
3 MR. [REDACTED] On August 9, 2019, were  
4 you working?  
5 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. August 9th. That's  
6 the Friday or the Saturday?  
7 MR. [REDACTED] Friday.  
8 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.  
9 MR. [REDACTED] And what was your position  
10 on that day?  
11 MR. [REDACTED] Electronics Technician.  
12 MR. [REDACTED] What schedule were you on?  
13 MR. [REDACTED] I believe 6:00 to 2:00.  
14 MR. [REDACTED] 6:00 to 2:00 meaning  
15 morning watch?  
16 MR. [REDACTED] 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.  
17 That's day watch. Or - yeah. Day watch.  
18 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And what does your  
19 position entail? What's your daily duties?  
20 MR. [REDACTED] I just well I make sure  
21 anything in the building as far as  
22 communication is working. So the first thing  
23 you do is check the phones, radios, telephones,  
24 radios I said, make sure the cameras are  
25 recording if they're working. And what ese.

1 Anything communication-wise. If anybody's  
2 having a problem, they usually get to me. Even  
3 something as simple as a voice mail. They'll  
4 say hey my machine isn't working and I go take  
5 a look at it. And where somebody's computer is  
6 not working. So.

7 MR. [REDACTED] And since you mentioned  
8 also daily when you come on the job at 6:00  
9 a.m., you check to see if the phone, cameras,  
10 everything is working?

11 MR. [REDACTED] I don't have to check.  
12 It's - there's no set standard or like okay you  
13 should come in and check it. You just like  
14 kind of look to see what's going on. You kind  
15 of know what hasn't been working and what's  
16 been working. You kind of make a checklist for  
17 yourself. There's no set standard of what you  
18 should do at that time. Now there is more stuff  
19 that you do. Day to day. Where before there  
20 was really no standard of okay you come in, you  
21 start, and this is the first thing you've got  
22 to go and do. And no. There was never  
23 anything written down as far as what should be  
24 done during your shift.

25 MR. [REDACTED] When did that change?

1 MR. [REDACTED] : After Epstein pretty much.

2 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED] : Yeah.

4 MR. [REDACTED] So that day when you came  
5 in, do you recall - I know it's been two years.  
6 Do you recall doing a checklist? Trying to see  
7 if everything was working.

8 MR. [REDACTED] I usually - because I  
9 don't get a radio in the morning. I usually -  
10 first thing I do is I call for the elevator so  
11 I know the phones are working.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

13 MR. [REDACTED] And then I go downstairs,  
14 turn on the radio, listen to radio traffic so I  
15 know the radios are working. And as far as the  
16 camera goes, I have - that time I had like the  
17 old system that had a, I had a screen at my  
18 desk. And make sure the um -. Because it went  
19 to analog matrix. It's going to sound a little  
20 confusing when I say analog matrix and digital  
21 matrix because the old system we had was a  
22 mixture of both. And kind of like the new  
23 system too. It takes the old analog cameras  
24 because we had a lot of old analog cameras. It  
25 takes all of that. And then it transfers it to

1 make it digital so you can start recording.  
2 And that's how you - we'll get a video and look  
3 back for video. But everything was analog. So  
4 I would have the analog system in my office.  
5 And I would pretty much look and see if that's  
6 working. If that was working I know I was  
7 pretty much good.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Now the analog - if -  
9 before it was converted over to digital.

10 MR. [REDACTED] Mm-hmm.

11 MR. [REDACTED] How would the analog be  
12 recorded?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Um the analog -. I wasn't  
14 here -. Well it's -. It's not really - well  
15 it is converted. It's used - well they use the  
16 encoder to take the analog signal and make it a  
17 digital signal and put it on a recorder.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And what was it  
19 recorded on?

20 MR. [REDACTED] The old hard drives. It  
21 was two of them - two hard drives.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Was it on a server or -?

23 MR. [REDACTED] It was pretty much like a  
24 server. Yeah. It was two computers pretty  
25 much.

1           MR. [REDACTED]           Okay. And once it was  
2 recorded, do you remember checking the cameras  
3 that day? Seeing if it was working?

4           MR. [REDACTED]           I checked them later in  
5 the day. I went up to the video room. Because  
6 we were having - the thing about this whole  
7 process was when I came here, the first thing I  
8 saw was the video room. And the biggest thing  
9 was all the equipment in that room was out of  
10 date. It was old. It was - I came from  
11 another institution. Like I said before where  
12 everything kind of wasn't modern but it was  
13 more up to date than this. And so like the  
14 camera system I had was maybe five to ten years  
15 old. And when I came here, this one was over  
16 ten years old and it was on 365 a day. Like 24  
17 hours for the like the last 12 years. The  
18 system was always on. And something as simple  
19 as shutting down the time and change - because  
20 you got to get recording times right. When the  
21 seasons change, you would have to wait like a  
22 whole day to shut down a recorder. It takes a  
23 whole day for it to come back up after shutting  
24 it down. And where I came from, that was not  
25 the standard. Like it should be like an hour

1 maybe thirty minutes. Maybe even ten minutes  
2 if it's a newer system. You shouldn't even  
3 have that much down time as far as the  
4 recording. So one of the first things I did  
5 when I came here was I addressed that - the  
6 recorders needed to be upgraded. And -.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Who did you address that  
8 with?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Um my Facility Manager. I  
10 talked to upper management.

11 But like during this whole time I was  
12 doing -. I actually started the camera project  
13 and that's why I was doing overtime around this  
14 time. And we had people come from other  
15 institutions. There was a camera project to  
16 upgrade the cameras. Everybody's fear was the  
17 actual cameras not the recording software of  
18 the cameras. But I stated over and over again  
19 the problem you're going to have is the  
20 recorders. And we even had the new recorders.  
21 They were in the warehouse. We have them  
22 stockpiled. They was ordered. But we were on  
23 the bottom of the list as far as install. So  
24 even though we had the new equipment, we  
25 weren't a priority to get anything installed.

1 So we had to wait until something happened.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: And you said there was a -  
3 you mentioned that to your Facilities Manager.  
4 Who was that?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: When I first got here it  
6 was [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp. \*00:13:22)  
7 and [REDACTED] was a facility manager. I  
8 think we were in between facility managers when  
9 this happened because we didn't really have  
10 anybody.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: So there was no one during  
12 August 9th and 10th there was nobody?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure if my new  
14 facility manager took over at that time. But I  
15 don't believe he was here. I think he came  
16 after. He was here visiting but I don't think  
17 he took the job.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: And you mentioned it to  
19 upper management too?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Who in upper management  
22 did you mention it to?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: My old AW - my Associate  
24 Warden - still - he's no longer - he's returned  
25 from the Bureau.

1 MR. [REDACTED] : Who is the old AW?

2 MR. [REDACTED] : Associate Warden [REDACTED]

3 (Phonetic Sp. \*00:13:53). That was his last

4 name. I forgot the first name. But I

5 mentioned to him and of course I talked to the

6 wardens about it.

7 MR. [REDACTED] : Who was the warden at that  
8 point?

9 MR. [REDACTED] : Um it was [REDACTED] And  
10 before [REDACTED] it was [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp.

11 \*00:14:04). Because they wanted me like to add

12 more cameras and do upgrades. And I'm like,

13 well you've got to spend money because this

14 stuff is old. Like you can't just start adding

15 cameras to old systems. It's not going to

16 work.

17 MR. [REDACTED] : And you said there was as  
18 project started around that time. Before  
19 Epstein's death?

20 MR. [REDACTED] : Before Epstein's death.

21 Yeah.

22 MR. [REDACTED] : How far before?

23 MR. [REDACTED] : I would have to look at  
24 documents. I'm not too sure. Me and pretty  
25 much - we have an engineering tech - [REDACTED]

1 [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp. \*00:14:25) - when we  
2 started. Because we had problems with the  
3 recorders before where we submitted paperwork  
4 to the regional office saying hey the recorders  
5 are going down. It's end of life. What can we  
6 do to upgrade? What's the steps? And that's  
7 why we got funded all the money that we got to  
8 start the project.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Before Epstein's death, do  
10 you recall what exactly the project entailed?  
11 What were you guys upgrading?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Uh we were trying to go  
13 from analog cameras to IP cameras and trying to  
14 upgrade the recorders. The recorders were like  
15 the main thing. Upgrading the recording  
16 system.

17 MR. [REDACTED] But not the cameras  
18 itself?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Not the cameras itself.  
20 Because they can still work. And they still  
21 work now.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Were majority of the  
23 cameras working during that time?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Pretty much all the  
25 cameras were working. Maybe we had maybe ten

1 probably that weren't working. But for the  
2 majority all of the cameras were working. They  
3 weren't being recorded - that was the problem.

4 MR. [REDACTED] So the cameras were  
5 working but it wasn't actually --

6 MR. [REDACTED] Recording yeah.

7 MR. [REDACTED] -- recording into the -.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Now think. I know it's  
10 been two years. Do you recall which were the  
11 ten cameras were that weren't working.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: I have no idea. I would  
13 have to look at that list there.

14 MR. [REDACTED] How about during that time  
15 in the SHU. Were the cameras working?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. The cameras in SHU  
17 were working. They were recording. Well they  
18 were working. They weren't recoding. But they  
19 were working.

20 MR. [REDACTED] So what is that? Explain  
21 that to me.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you like - if -  
23 so like I said. We had an analog system and a  
24 digital system. The old system would never  
25 show me like the recorders failed. Like if

1 there was an error on the old software. Like I  
2 would have to physically be in the room to say  
3 hey. Because the room was upstairs on the  
4 third floor. Which I didn't have access for.  
5 You would have to go in the room and then you  
6 go see like - because there's a redundant  
7 drive. So you have like an A side and a B  
8 side. And say if the A side isn't working, you  
9 have one drive goes bad. That's not a problem.  
10 As soon as the second drive goes bad, that's  
11 when you run into problems. And after the  
12 second drive runs into problems, that's when  
13 you stop recording. And once that happens, you  
14 have to take the drive out, and we have to  
15 scrounge around for old drives and see if those  
16 will work. During that time I actually - prior  
17 to that I actually purchased maybe 24 drives to  
18 actually redo a whole bay - like A or the B  
19 side. I was actually going to do that.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Did you know at that point  
21 that SHU cameras weren't recording?

22 MR. [REDACTED] At that point towards the  
23 end of the day I did. I believe I did know at  
24 the end of the day.

25 MR. [REDACTED] On August 9th during the

1 day?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. And I called --

3 MR. [REDACTED] It wasn't the 10<sup>th</sup>?

4 MR. [REDACTED] -- SigNet. That's my  
5 point of contact. I usually - any time I have  
6 a problem or something's not working because I  
7 wasn't really familiar with the whole system.  
8 I had like a newer system. It kind of worked  
9 the same, as far as the software side goes, as  
10 far like as like the hardware, it was  
11 different. So I would always have to call them  
12 for like tech support. Like okay I'm having a  
13 problem today. Can you document it? You know  
14 it builds our case when I have to submit stuff  
15 to Regional Office. Me just saying it's not  
16 going to work, that's not going to fly. And  
17 usually they help me troubleshoot through the  
18 whole process of what I should have to do - A,  
19 B, C, okay take this drive out, put that drive  
20 in. And like previously, probably six months  
21 before that, we actually had a mother board -  
22 which was my main computer - like go out. And  
23 I had to actually replace that and they had to  
24 walk me through it over the phone. I went to  
25 scrounge round parts from another institution

1 to get it working. I know I'm giving you like  
2 a lot of stuff but -.

3 MR. [REDACTED] So let's step back. So  
4 you said the - it wasn't working. There was  
5 possibly a work order already created. Right?

6 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Possibly. Yes.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Who approved the work  
8 order?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Um that has to go through  
10 my general foreman or facility manager.  
11 Whoever's in charge.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Do you think - do you  
13 recall if this was before Epstein's death or  
14 after?

15 MR. [REDACTED] This was probably before  
16 Epstein's death. There was a few work orders  
17 before Epstein's death.

18 MR. [REDACTED] And if these work orders -  
19 . Are these work orders still maintained? A  
20 copy anywhere?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: They should be in the  
22 facilities folder somewhere.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Who would have access to  
24 it now?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Um my facility manager,

1 she'll know where they're at. And the  
2 engineering tech would pretty much. Well I'm  
3 not saying engineering tech. But the facility  
4 manager should know if those records are kept  
5 or they're maintained.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: And when this work order  
7 was created, this work order specifically  
8 addressed the fact that the SHU cameras weren't  
9 recording?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: No. No. All of the  
11 cameras. It's not going to just be SHU. It's  
12 going to be all the cameras.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: All the (Indiscernible  
14 \*00:18:28) cameras.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So at that point,  
17 how come some cameras recorded? He said  
18 there's redundancy. So there's either going to  
19 --

20 MR. [REDACTED]: A side and B side.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: -- A drive or B drive?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: How come some recorded on  
24 -?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Oh there's going to

1 be another problem too. Okay. So there's an A  
2 side and a B side. And it's supposed to be  
3 redundant but it's not redundant because it's  
4 not really redundant when one side goes bad so  
5 it just knows to record channels. Let's say  
6 one through 50 is on this side. And 51 through  
7 100 is on this side. Everything is working.  
8 It doesn't work. Okay. I can take over for  
9 this one because it's not working. But as soon  
10 as that one goes, I can kind of record over  
11 here. As soon as the second drive goes, I have  
12 to just record what I'm recording. I can't no  
13 longer help out the other drives.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So some channels  
15 inside the SHU were recording on one drive?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Some were on the other  
18 drive?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED] So the ones - which drive  
21 was the one that stopped recording altogether?

22 MR. [REDACTED] I believe it was the first  
23 drive. So like the A side. Like the first.  
24 Because the SHU cameras are on the first -  
25 they're like the first 50-some cameras. Well

1 not the whole 50 but they're on that side. In  
2 this string.

3 MR. [REDACTED] But some were also on the  
4 B side?

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. On the B side.  
6 Yeah. And that's just because they wired it  
7 the way they wired it.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. I'm going to show  
9 you a map of the SHU. I know this is kind of  
10 old. I'm not sure if this is still exactly how  
11 it is.

12 MR. [REDACTED] You have the updated one  
13 right in front of him.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Updated one. Okay. I  
15 kind of wanted you to mark off where the  
16 cameras were (Indiscernible \*00:19:47) right  
17 here on the --

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: -- big one. So let's -  
20 I'll give you both.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh that's fine.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: See if - let's point it  
23 over here.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So.

25 MR. [REDACTED] You recognize this? Where

1 this is?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. That's the Special  
3 Housing Unit.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Is this -? How many  
5 levels are there?

6 MR. [REDACTED] EL: There's an upper tier and  
7 a bottom tier.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: The one you're looking at.  
9 Is that the upper tier or lower tier?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: This is 9 South upper  
11 tier. Yeah.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Upper tier. Can you point  
13 out -? Do you -? I know you were -.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Approximately. I know  
15 where all the cameras are. Okay. So at the  
16 end of each tier there's a camera here.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: So which tier is that?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh G tier.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: You said at the end of  
20 each tier?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Each tier. There's one  
22 camera looking this way - looking to the front  
23 of the grill. This is the grill.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: So G tier. J tier.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: J Tier. L Tier. And M

1 should be.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: And that camera. What  
3 would it have shown?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Um it would just show  
5 whoever's coming on to the Tier to do rounds or  
6 whatever they're doing on the Tier.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And as per your  
8 recollection, on August 9th, were those cameras  
9 actually working? Running?

10 MR. [REDACTED] The cameras were working.  
11 The recording no.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Where else in the  
13 SHU are there cameras?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Also there's one in the  
15 common area I think. Oh the - let me see.  
16 Okay. So you have one over here like looking  
17 at the common area over here. And then you  
18 have another two like looking this way.

19 MR. [REDACTED] So you're pointing to the  
20 right of L Tier?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

22 MR. [REDACTED] To the right of L Tier.  
23 And that would oversee -?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Like the common area this  
25 way. Yeah.

1 MR. [REDACTED] And would that also -?

2 What's over here?

3 MR. [REDACTED] That's the officer's  
4 station.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Use this and just have  
6 him mark on there. So if you could, these  
7 numbers don't match up but the tier - the  
8 letters should be the same. So can you just -?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Here. So this is L Tier.

10 MR. [REDACTED] And can you just mark -?

11 MR. [REDACTED] M Tier is the top tier.

12 So.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Can you mark maybe like a  
14 circle and then point like an arrow toward the  
15 direction that it would be recording?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Oh.

17 MR. [REDACTED] That it would be viewing.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Uh.

19 MR. [REDACTED] And this is on August 9th  
20 and 10th we're talking about.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Just um. Okay. So.

22 MR. [REDACTED] So if you said at the end  
23 of each tier, just where they were actually -.  
24 Just maybe you can put like a star or whatever  
25 you decide to make for the camera. And then

1 like an arrow pointing in the direction that  
2 they would be recording.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So (Indiscernible  
4 \*00:21:53). Second one (Indiscernible  
5 \*00:21:55).

6 MR. [REDACTED] Keeping the (Indiscernible  
7 \*00:21:55) by arrow pointing in the direction.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Yep.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

10 MR. [REDACTED] The common area. This is  
11 H. And I believe they're on top of this tier.  
12 There's a camera over here looking this way.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Is that the upper tier or  
14 lower tier?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Uh upper tier. There's a  
16 camera on the upper tier - on the outside of  
17 the upper tier looking that way.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Is that the one that's  
19 like outside of 10 South?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

21 MR. [REDACTED] And -.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Do you mind, on that  
23 camera that you just said that's outside of 10  
24 South. Can you just put 10 S there so we know  
25 what you're talking about?"

1 MR. [REDACTED]: 10 S. Um before you get  
2 to 10 South, there's actually - that's the  
3 camera that you guys probably saw the  
4 recording. That's the 46 door.

5 MR. [REDACTED] That's the one that you  
6 just wrote 10 S next to?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no. It's actually --

8 MR. [REDACTED] Oh.

9 MR. [REDACTED] -- up the stair. There's  
10 not one

11 MR. [REDACTED] So that's not that one.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. You can't put it on  
13 the drawing because of where it's at.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So the one that  
15 you just drew actually - where is that in real  
16 - relation to 10 South?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Um that would be like the  
18 top of H Tier I believe.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So can you maybe -  
20 hm. How are we going to differentiate the fact  
21 that you said a different one is 10 S. Uh the  
22 one that we have - that's recording?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Oh.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Can you write --

25 MR. [REDACTED] That's not 10 South then.

1 MR. [REDACTED] -- that?

2 MR. [REDACTED] That's not 10 South. I  
3 crossed it out. So that's going to be - so  
4 let's say H Tier number one. And this will be  
5 H Tier number two. And this would be K Tier  
6 number one. And I'm not sure where the second  
7 one is. I don't think it's this one. I think  
8 it's maybe this one on this side. That's one  
9 I'm saying is K two. On this one. And this  
10 will be M Tier number one. Looking that way.  
11 And the - so this would be L Tier. One. Let  
12 me get G on there.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Where would the officers'  
14 station be?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the officers' station  
16 will be next to M Tier like right in this area.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Can you put a box there?

18 MR. [REDACTED] I believe it's right here.

19 MR. [REDACTED] And put OS for Officers'  
20 Station?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Was there a camera pointed  
22 directly at the officers' station?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I believe there is  
24 one out here in the common area.

25 MR. [REDACTED] And this is on August 9th

1 and 10th. Right?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I'll just write uh  
3 common area. And that's there. And for the 46  
4 camera. Because it's not on the drawing, I'll  
5 just write it up here. Top of 10 South.

6 MR. [REDACTED] That's perfect. And  
7 that's the one you're going to mark as 10 S?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. Ten.

9 MR. [REDACTED] And that's the one and  
10 only that we have that was actually working?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. That's the 46 door.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Now where would the  
13 entrance be? Where inmates are moved in and  
14 out of the SHU?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Uh that's the um - the  
16 front entrance right here by the elevators.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Was there a camera there?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no. There's only a  
19 camera in the hallway. There was no cameras in  
20 there when they're moving back and forth.

21 MR. [REDACTED] If someone had to come in  
22 and out of the SHU and control had to buzz  
23 them, was there a way control buzzes who was --

24 MR. [REDACTED] Uh yeah.

25 MR. [REDACTED] -- coming in and out?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: The way that the doors  
2 worked at that time was - because we changed  
3 some of the cameras. But before control pops  
4 the door, they pretty much acknowledge that -.  
5 Well before - especially with 9 South. 9 South  
6 is different because the officer has the key on  
7 their hip to - there's an inner door inside  
8 here. And they won't even - well they're not  
9 supposed to - crack the outer door without  
10 somebody in SHU calling for that door. So I  
11 can't go up to 10 South - or 9 South - right  
12 now and say hey, let me get the 27 door.  
13 Somebody from SHU has to call for the 27 door.  
14 Because the inner door they have the key before  
15 you come inside of 9 South.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: But there was no cameras  
17 at that point?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: No. There was a live  
19 feed. There's always a live feed.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: But nothing recording?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Nothing recording. I mean  
22 the live feed goes to the control center. And  
23 the control center officer sees who is at the  
24 door. And they will pop the door.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Where would that camera

1 be?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Um that camera would be  
3 ... in the hallway. I think that camera was  
4 looking this way. So 9 Sally. I just labeled  
5 it 9 Sally. And it just like looks down this  
6 way.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So you pointed out  
8 there's one on each tier. That would make it  
9 six cameras.

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

11 MR. [REDACTED] There is one in the corner

12 --

13 MR. [REDACTED] In the corner.

14 MR. [REDACTED] -- of H tier?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah I believe so.

16 MR. [REDACTED] That would make it seven.

17 There's one in the corner of -.

18 MR. [REDACTED] I'm not too sure about  
19 that one. I think there's one in that corner.  
20 But I know there's one definitely in the common  
21 area. I know these two are definitely here.  
22 That other one I'm not too sure about. Because  
23 I don't remember seeing that.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. That's eight  
25 cameras and then there's one in the Sally.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

2 MR. [REDACTED] And where's the 10 S  
3 camera?

4 MR. [REDACTED] It's up here.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So nine cameras  
6 total that you're aware of. That should have  
7 been recording?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Um. Recording, yes. All  
9 the cameras were working though. Because you  
10 could see.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Where could you see it  
12 from?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the live matrix.

14 MR. [REDACTED] On a matrix?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Who had access to the live  
17 matrix?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Um whoever would have a  
19 keypad. Not a lot of people have access to  
20 that. So like SIS would have it - at the time.  
21 Um control center would have it. And um  
22 lieutenant's office don't have it. So it's  
23 SIS, SIA, I have access, and that's pretty much  
24 about it. And then our command center.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Is there something that

1 they would have to key in to see? Or is it  
2 just running?

3 MR. [REDACTED] No. You would have to key  
4 in the cameras to see the actual camera call  
5 up. You have to call up and hit the button and  
6 know what camera it is to call up.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Did anyone like the SIS  
8 office or even the control have like the  
9 cameras - you know like the feed just running  
10 on their screen at all times?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. But they would have  
12 to go through all the cameras. They usually  
13 just - it just sits on one camera. It doesn't  
14 keep scrolling through all the cameras.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Do you have  
16 anything on that?

17 MR. [REDACTED] A lot. Yes. A lot.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Go ahead.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Um. And maybe you  
20 answered some of this and maybe just being a  
21 layman I didn't understand. But so going back  
22 to the beginning. How many cameras are in the  
23 MCC? Or were there in August 9th and 10th?

24 MR. [REDACTED] I would have to look  
25 through those right now.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Well approximately.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Old partner would always  
3 tell me there's like 200. I probably think  
4 like 150 if that.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: All right.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even think it was  
7 150.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: And you said at the time  
9 there were approximately ten that were not  
10 working?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: What does that mean -  
13 "not working"?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: It probably needs to get  
15 re-, umm out of focus, just the video is  
16 probably grainy - not the best video.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: So they're on but they  
20 were -. So differentiate for me, because you  
21 said that there are cameras in the SHU were  
22 working but they weren't recording.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh-huh.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: So what's the difference  
25 between working and not working when you're

1 talking about that?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So if you have a  
3 camera working, you can see the video, but it's  
4 not recording. That's a totally different  
5 problem.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So the ones that  
7 you say that are not working. There's a  
8 problem with what you're seeing.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

10 MR. [REDACTED] But they are recording or  
11 they're not recording?

12 MR. [REDACTED] It could possibly they could  
13 be recording or can't be recording.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: All right. And then when  
15 we just talked about the SHU. There's  
16 approximately ten --

17 MR. [REDACTED] Ten, ten cameras.

18 MR. [REDACTED] -- cameras in the SHU?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

20 MR. [REDACTED] And the cameras in the  
21 SHU. Only one out of ten was not re - only one  
22 was recording?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Only one. Yes. Because  
24 it was on a different recorder at the time.  
25 Yes.

1 MR. [REDACTED] And on August 9th you  
2 said that you knew some were not recording. Is  
3 that what you were saying?

4 MR. [REDACTED] I knew yeah something was  
5 going on. I went up to the room and I was  
6 about to change everything out and I didn't  
7 have access. So I had to leave for the day.

8 MR. [REDACTED] And that is on August  
9 9th?

10 MR. [REDACTED] August 9th. The end of  
11 the day.

12 MR. [REDACTED] And that was the very  
13 first time you knew that they were not  
14 recording?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Um. That day, yes.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Towards the end of the  
18 day.

19 MR. [REDACTED] And did you know all of  
20 them were not recording at that time? Aside  
21 from the one?

22 MR. [REDACTED] I didn't know exactly  
23 what wasn't recording on the recorder.

24 I don't know exactly. Which ones weren't  
25 working. I just knew that a recorder was down.

1 MR. [REDACTED] And how did you know  
2 that?

3 MR. [REDACTED] As soon as I went in I saw  
4 the drives. Because the drives, usually  
5 they're green when everything is working and  
6 amber like when there's an emergency or  
7 something's wrong. And I saw that there was a  
8 few ambers. So like it wasn't recording. Then  
9 I called SigNet, the company. And they said I  
10 have to start rebuilding. And what start  
11 rebuilding means is I have to pull that hard  
12 drive out and start putting fresh hard drives  
13 in. And then the system knows like it put a  
14 new hard drive in, it starts to sync up, and  
15 does this thing where it starts to go through.  
16 It does it all of its checks and starts  
17 recording. And that would pretty much take a  
18 day.

19 MR. [REDACTED] That takes like a whole  
20 day to do that?

21 MR. [REDACTED] A day, yes. And I was at  
22 the stage of pulling everything out. That was  
23 probably going to take a couple days to pull  
24 all the drives out and start recording again.

25 MR. [REDACTED] And did you make that

1 notification that the cameras in the SHU were  
2 not recording to anyone?

3 MR. [REDACTED] I believe I told my  
4 supervisor.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And who would have been  
6 your supervisor at the time?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Uh - there was really -  
8 like I don't think there was nobody here.  
9 Because we were in like the middle of a project  
10 and that was kind of chaos. So .

11 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Did you - but at  
12 that time though you knew basically all the SHU  
13 cameras were down but one.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: No I didn't know anything  
15 about the SHU cameras.

16 MR. [REDACTED] No-no-no. I'm talking  
17 about the SHU cameras specifically.

18 MR. [REDACTED] No. I didn't - I don't  
19 know what's on the recorders. At that time I  
20 didn't know what was on the recorders. I just  
21 knew -.

22 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So when you  
23 went in, you knew that some recorders - some  
24 cameras weren't recording and you didn't know  
25 which ones.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Ones, yeah.

2 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So about how  
3 many were amber where it was showing you that  
4 they weren't recording?

5 MR. [REDACTED] That was like half of  
6 them. So I'll say 50 to 60 cameras are  
7 probably not recording.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: So there were a ton in  
9 that -.

10 MR. [REDACTED] Mm-hmm. In that slot that  
11 weren't working.

12 MR. [REDACTED] And is there anything  
13 that - was that - that just all happened on  
14 that one day on August 9th?

15 MR. [REDACTED] It happened before.  
16 Multiple times before.

17 MR. [REDACTED] It had happened before.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Before. Yes.

19 MR. [REDACTED] So you have actually  
20 troubleshoot it in the past?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Before yes. Same  
22 problem. I have to rebuild drives and I mean  
23 hey this isn't working. I've got to rebuild  
24 the drive. There's really nothing I can do. I  
25 just put the drive in and wait.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Make sure it comes back  
3 up.

4 MR. [REDACTED] So this was the end day  
5 you said so around like 2:00 p.m. you're  
6 thinking?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Um. 1:00 something.

8 MR. [REDACTED] One something?

9 MR. [REDACTED] One something, yeah.

10 MR. [REDACTED] All right. And then  
11 being that it happened before, was there  
12 anything that you're supposed to do if like -  
13 hey, I've got to notify like the captain -.

14 MR. [REDACTED] There was no -. At my old  
15 jail, I'm not trying to throw anybody under the  
16 bus but at my old jail, if anything wasn't  
17 working and I was the contact, I couldn't leave  
18 the jail. Like if the fence - because we had a  
19 fence system - or cameras aren't recording. I  
20 would have to fix - stay there until okay, I  
21 need a part. This is what we're doing. Send  
22 notification. This place is run a lot  
23 differently. And I've said stuff from before.  
24 And my old supervisor, but just like oh go home  
25 Daniel, don't worry about it. And I'm like

1 well if I go home, nobody's going to fix it.  
2 And at that time I was the only person that  
3 knew what was going on. It was bad practice  
4 when I got to this jail.

5 MR. [REDACTED] So did someone tell you  
6 not to fix it and to go home on August 9th?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Um I'm not too sure. I  
8 believe so. I'm not going to say yes or no  
9 because I don't really remember that day too  
10 much.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Z: Were you -?

12 MR. [REDACTED] : But I did make a  
13 notification that it wasn't working.

14 MR. [REDACTED] To who?

15 MR. [REDACTED] And I was going to be back  
16 the next day because I was doing overtime.

17 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So you were  
18 coming back on August 10th?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. The next morning.  
20 Because I came at 6:00 a.m. the next morning to  
21 do overtime.

22 MR. [REDACTED] p and is that when you  
23 were planning to fix it?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Fix it yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED] So you were going to

1 start the next day and fix -.

2 MR. [REDACTED] And I had the drive too at  
3 that time. I do remember that.

4 MR. [REDACTED] And you said you made the  
5 notification. Who did you make the  
6 notification to?

7 MR. [REDACTED] To my supervisor. I don't  
8 know exactly which supervisor it was but I know  
9 I made a notification.

10 MR. [REDACTED] So you're positive you  
11 made it?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

13 MR. [REDACTED] And how would that  
14 notification have been made?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Probably verbally.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Because it's not something  
18 I would broadcast over the radio or like go on  
19 a phone. I would like call you in a room  
20 because I don't want anybody to know that.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Can't record video.  
23 That's not a good thing.

24 MR. [REDACTED] And I apologize. I think  
25 when I asked this question, I'm not exactly

1 sure what you meant by this. But were you  
2 supposed to advise somebody like the captain or  
3 the warden that the cameras were down?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Uh you -. Because the way  
5 the recorders work, the cameras are the  
6 captain's property. So you have to notify the  
7 captain. Hey, the cameras aren't recording.

8 MR. [REDACTED] And was that your job to  
9 notify him?

10 MR. [REDACTED] No. I notified my  
11 supervisor and they notify the captain. If I  
12 see the captain, I'll say something to him or  
13 I'll tell the lieutenants. But other than  
14 that, I don't say anything about cameras being  
15 down.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So as far - so  
17 you're positive you did notify your supervisor?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I notified somebody.  
19 Because they have to know because I told them I  
20 was going to come back the next day.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: You just don't know who  
22 it was.

23 MR. [REDACTED] I'm not too sure, no. I  
24 don't want to say -.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Is there ? How can we

1 find out who would have been your supervisor at  
2 that time?

3 MR. [REDACTED] It's documented somewhere.  
4 Whoever my supervisor at the time.

5 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So that  
6 person would have then been responsible to  
7 notify someone such as the captain --

8 MR. [REDACTED] Captain.

9 MR. [REDACTED] -- or the warden?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Because if the captain  
12 was out, or no, he did work on the 9th. Right?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Mm-hmm.

14 MR. [REDACTED] So that means that around  
15 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., if you notified your  
16 supervisor --

17 MR. [REDACTED] Supervisor.

18 MR. [REDACTED] -- that supervisor should  
19 have then notified the captain.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. And then I got  
21 approved for overtime for the next day. So  
22 somebody knew I was coming back.

23 MR. [REDACTED] Oh and is that  
24 specifically why you were approved for  
25 overtime?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no I was coming back to  
2 do the project. But they knew I had the drives  
3 because I was going back and forth with my  
4 computer service guy. Because he knows more  
5 about hard drives than I do. So he was - we're  
6 getting parts in. Why don't I just do this,  
7 and I remember that part of the day.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Now what would cause all  
9 of those cameras to actually fail like that?  
10 The recorders.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the recording. The  
12 system was old. And it needed to be upgraded.  
13 It was very old.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Was it - could it have  
15 anything to do with people tampering with the  
16 system?

17 MR. [REDACTED] No.

18 They can't tamper with it. You have to go  
19 in a room it's behind a locked key - a photo  
20 (Indiscernible \*00:35:34) key in the door.

21 MR. [REDACTED] So there's no reasons to  
22 believe

23 MR. [REDACTED] There's two doors too.

24 MR. [REDACTED] -- that those cameras?

25 MR. [REDACTED] Because you go thought the

1 front door and then there's a secondary door to  
2 go in the room.

3 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So you said  
4 the cameras are working and they're in this  
5 room. Is anyone actually in that room looking  
6 at the cameras?

7 MR. [REDACTED] There used to be and  
8 that's an SIS tech. I think maybe Tay was  
9 there as the SIS tech for that day.

10 MR. [REDACTED] Now when you're - so  
11 would he have known that they weren't  
12 recording?

13 MR. [REDACTED] No. um his job is pretty  
14 much to look at like the live feed and um maybe  
15 look at the recording. But they do stuff a  
16 little bit different here so I'm not too sure  
17 exactly what his function was.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Now would they also have  
19 seen this amber -?

20 MR. [REDACTED] No. they don't go back in  
21 the room.

22 MR. [REDACTED] So there's a different  
23 room?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. It's a different  
25 room altogether. They just look at the

1 monitors in the room at the time.

2 MR. [REDACTED] So by looking at the  
3 monitor, would they be able to have known that  
4 the cameras were down?

5 MR. [REDACTED] No. As far as recording,  
6 no. they would just have the live feed.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

8 MR. [REDACTED] And everything looks good.

9 MR. [REDACTED] So for them they would  
10 have no idea that there was actually --

11 MR. [REDACTED] Oh yeah a problem.

12 MR. [REDACTED] : -- no SHU cameras --

13 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

14 MR. [REDACTED] : -- weren't recording?

15 MR. [REDACTED] And then the software too.

16 Even if you look at the software at the time,  
17 it wasn't even telling you that there was a  
18 problem. You would think it was actually  
19 working.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Right. So to your  
21 knowledge the only people that definitively  
22 knew that the cameras were down were you and  
23 your supervisor?

24 MR. [REDACTED] The supervisor. Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED] And do you know if your

1 supervisor actually made the notification to  
2 anyone else?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't recall. I don't  
4 know who you talk to.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: After the fact did you  
6 ever find out if he did or didn't?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't remember. There  
8 was a lot going on.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Were you ever questioned  
10 with regard to what happened with the cameras?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Who questioned you?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Um oh the next day because  
14 I was here. I had to talk to the warden about  
15 what was going on with the cameras.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: And do you remember what  
17 -?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: And then the FBI too. The  
19 next day

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And otherwise he  
21 was not present for that?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: The next day?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: No. There was nobody  
25 here.

1 MR. [REDACTED] So you have spoken to  
2 both the warden as well as the FBI with regard  
3 to the camera situation?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: The next day. Yes I did.  
5 What was going on.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: And did you -?

7 MR. [REDACTED] And then I had to get in  
8 contact with the vendor. And they had to  
9 explain stuff to the FBI too. Because what I  
10 was saying wasn't making any sense.

11 MR. [REDACTED] They weren't following  
12 what you were telling them?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Because they just  
14 sent like a regular field officer. They didn't  
15 send anybody technical. So what I was saying  
16 was kind of just a little bit overboard. And  
17 dry.

18 MR. [REDACTED] And possibly when you  
19 were talking and I wasn't - maybe all these  
20 questions were answered but I'm not sure.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

22 MR. [REDACTED] So that's why I'm trying  
23 to put it into layman's terms. All right. So  
24 it -. You said it happened before. Do you  
25 know if it ever happened before whereas all but

1 one camera in the SHU went down?

2 MR. [REDACTED] I don't even know what  
3 would have went down.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No?

5 MR. [REDACTED] It would have been a whole  
6 bunch of cameras not recording.

7 MR. [REDACTED] At the time that you knew  
8 that the approximately 50 to potentially 75  
9 cameras weren't working, did you know what  
10 cameras weren't' working? Or just that a lot  
11 of cameras weren't working?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Just a lot of cameras  
13 weren't. And I wasn't going to sit there and  
14 try to figure out what's -.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Sure.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

17 MR. [REDACTED] So when you're making  
18 that notification to your supervisor, you're  
19 just saying like hey half the cameras are down?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Was down. Yeah. You've  
21 got to decide what you're going to do.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And they, at that  
23 time, said don't worry about it. Go home. You  
24 can fix it tomorrow?

25 MR. [REDACTED] That was the standard

1 practice. So I believe it went along those  
2 lines.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And you said at another  
6 institution that would have never -.

7 MR. [REDACTED] That would never fly. No.  
8 No. Can't have that. You've got to fix it.  
9 If it's not working then you have to stay.

10 MR. [REDACTED] No do you believe that  
11 you should have had to have stayed?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I believe so.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: And did you request to  
14 stay to fix it?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Um. I think I did but I  
16 think I pretty much made a notification but  
17 since I was going to be back the next day, it  
18 didn't make sense for me to stay. Because  
19 there was really nothing I could fix that day  
20 anyway. Even if - and I think I - before I  
21 left, the two drives that were bad, I started  
22 replacing them. I think I might have taken  
23 them out to let them start rebuilding.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So was there  
25 anyone in the SHU that could have known that

1 those cameras were down?

2 MR. [REDACTED] No.

3 MR. [REDACTED] No?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Because I don't talk to  
5 anybody in custody as far as the cameras go  
6 out. That's why I go directly to my  
7 supervisor.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So the fact that - you  
9 know, Epstein, you're most notorious --

10 MR. [REDACTED] Mm-hmm.

11 MR. [REDACTED] -- inmate at that time -  
12 is, you know, dies the night that the cameras  
13 are down. Is there any - reasonably if there's  
14 any kind of - is there any suspicion  
15 surrounding the circumstances?

16 MR. [REDACTED] No. It was just whatever  
17 happened - happened. It was really no  
18 tampering with the devices or somebody turned  
19 off the power or -. No.

20 MR. [REDACTED] So to you it's just  
21 completely coincidental?

22 MR. [REDACTED] Just coincidental.

23 MR. [REDACTED] All right. And again you  
24 said that no one could have tampered with those  
25 cameras to made them go down?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

2 MR. [REDACTED] That's correct? That no  
3 one could have?

4 MR. [REDACTED] No one could have. No.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. All right.

6 MR. [REDACTED] And because - another  
7 thing about the cameras too they're - the way  
8 the SHU cameras are they're - the power supply  
9 is for the old analog cameras are in a - one of  
10 my closets. You would have to go in there,  
11 kill the power, and then go into mess with the  
12 recorder. Like it's too much stuff to try to -  
13 one person to think about trying to tamper with  
14 it. It's just a lot.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

16 MR. [REDACTED] And like as soon as I put  
17 in the new recorders, all the cameras came up.  
18 So the cameras weren't tampered with at all.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Right. The cameras  
20 themselves. But what about that room that you  
21 said that's where you fix them at. Who had  
22 access to that room?

23 MR. [REDACTED] I would have -. It would  
24 be SIS because that was their room. At that  
25 time, I really didn't have access. And that

1 was part of the problem too. Because they were  
2 leaving for the day and I didn't have access  
3 to the room. I didn't have a key at that time  
4 to go in the room.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Because it's their  
7 property room also.

8 MR. [REDACTED] But you went in to be  
9 able to see that they weren't recording?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. Because somebody  
11 was in the room. SIS was upstairs. Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED] So SIS allowed you in the  
13 room?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Were they in the room at  
16 the time

17 MR. [REDACTED] Nah. I usually just go in  
18 the back room by myself. I don't -.

19 MR. [REDACTED] And then you just ask  
20 them if they can go in? Or is it - what do you  
21 mean? There's like an SIS office and then  
22 there's a room within the SIS office.

23 MR. [REDACTED] The SIS office. Yeah.  
24 They have the main room but then it has a video  
25 room and behind the video room, that's where

1 the recorders are.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So is that room  
3 that you're talking about where the recorders  
4 are - is that also secured?

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Or is it just -?

7 MR. [REDACTED] It's secured. Yes.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So there's the SIS room  
9 that's secured. And then there's also the TV  
10 monitor room that's also secured?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Where the recordings? So  
13 did you have access to the -? Who would have  
14 had access I guess to the - where the  
15 recordings would have been stored?

16 MR. [REDACTED] I guess anybody in SIS  
17 with a key for SIS.

18 MR. [REDACTED] But only SIS?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Only SIS.

20 MR. [REDACTED] All right. Is there any  
21 reason to believe anyone in SIS could have  
22 manipulated those - that system? Or taken the  
23 cameras?

24 MR. [REDACTED] You'd have to know what  
25 you're doing and I would kind of know if

1 somebody messed with it. It's not really  
2 something you go in there and start  
3 disconnecting. Like the only way to really do  
4 anything in that room is to start disconnecting  
5 stuff. And it's a spaghetti mess.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Starting to disconnect the  
8 stuff is not going to - it's going to be  
9 tampered with, and you'll see somebody did  
10 something.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Is there anyone other  
12 than SIS who could have gotten into there?

13 MR. [REDACTED] I don't believe so. No.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Does the captain, AWs,  
15 and the warden have access to that room?

16 MR. [REDACTED] They don't probably even  
17 know anything that goes on in that room. The  
18 only time I will tell them is like to do  
19 maintenance. I'll complain and show them the  
20 room. Hey, you've got to clean this up or -.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: But do they have access?  
22 Can they get into the room?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Uh they would have to get  
24 24 hour keys from SIS or somebody would have to  
25 give them access to get into that room.

1 MR. [REDACTED] : But only SIS has it?  
2 MR. [REDACTED] : From what I know, yes.  
3 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.  
4 MR. [REDACTED] : Only SIS can get in that  
5 room.  
6 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.  
7 MR. [REDACTED] : Why did you happen to go  
8 in that room that day?  
9 MR. [REDACTED] : I don't know. I just make  
10 rounds and I do stuff. Somebody said something  
11 to me or I was thinking about it. Because I  
12 think I ordered the drive and I just wanted to  
13 see where I was at to see what I was going to  
14 get started on. And plus we were doing a  
15 camera project, so I was just trying to get a  
16 lot of things like organized and see where we  
17 were at. And what I was actually going to do.  
18 MR. [REDACTED] : So I have to ask as part  
19 of it. Did you happen to stop doing upgrade  
20 work on it, unplug, or take down the  
21 redundancy, or anything that worked --  
22 MR. [REDACTED] : No.  
23 MR. [REDACTED] : -- that happened to stop  
24 working at that point?  
25 MR. [REDACTED] : No. I just - it - because

1 we were having problems from before. And the  
2 problem just happened again. Like just  
3 coincidence.

4 MR. [REDACTED] And nothing to do with the  
5 work you were doing on it?

6 MR. [REDACTED] No. Because I didn't  
7 touch the recorders.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So not just the work you  
9 were doing on it. Did anything you do cause  
10 the cameras to go down?

11 MR. [REDACTED] No. Not that day. No.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. In the past it had  
13 though?

14 MR. [REDACTED] If I'm messing with a  
15 recorder, it can throw some stuff off. Or if  
16 I'm - yeah - moving drives around - that's why  
17 I don't have to notify. Hey, the drives are  
18 bad. Because if I start moving stuff, I don't  
19 know what's going to go down or not work or -.  
20 Yeah.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED] The system is very old.

23 MR. [REDACTED] But that day on August  
24 9th when all the SHU cameras went down, that  
25 had nothing to do with you? It was just

1 coincidental that they went down?

2 MR. [REDACTED] As far as the recording,  
3 yes.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So when you  
5 specified as far as the recording, can you tell  
6 me why you said that? Is there anything else?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Because people believe  
8 that when cameras don't work, like the camera's  
9 not working. The camera could be throwing out  
10 video because the live feed - like I said -  
11 goes to the control center. They see the live  
12 video when they're popping the door. So  
13 there's live video going - getting fed. It's  
14 just the digital side of it. The recording  
15 side is not working.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Was there a camera towards  
18 the back

19 MR. [REDACTED] What back room?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Is there a camera in the  
21 SIS office

22 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no. Now there is.  
23 There's a camera going towards SIS. But before  
24 there was no camera. It would just be the  
25 third floor - 3 Sally is someone was going in

1 that general direction. But you can't even  
2 make out who's going by there - the video room.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Was there anyway to know  
4 who went in and out of that room?

5 MR. [REDACTED] No.

6 MR. [REDACTED] There's a key entry or -?

7 MR. [REDACTED] No.

8 MR. [REDACTED] : Two follow-up questions.  
9 One, has this probable been rectified?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED] : And when was that  
12 rectified

13 MR. [REDACTED] Uh whenever they came and  
14 did a walkaround. We added cameras like to the  
15 SIS room. Of course we upgraded our recorders  
16 but there's cameras to see who goes in that  
17 general area. Like if you go in the room,  
18 you'll see who's going in the recording room.

19 MR. [REDACTED] And was that like a year  
20 or two ago? Or how long after the August 9th  
21 incident?

22 MR. [REDACTED] That's probably like a  
23 year after that. Because we were doing a lot  
24 of other stuff before that.

25 MR. [REDACTED] So in sometime in like

1 2020, have the cameras gone down since then?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Mm.

3 MR. [REDACTED] And when I say the  
4 cameras, I mean the recordings.

5 MR. [REDACTED] When I have to do  
6 maintenance. I have to notify somebody like  
7 the cameras are going to go down. They make  
8 sure the jail is locked down and -.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Only intentionally?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: They've never gone down -  
12 .

13 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. We've had um - uh -  
14 see I can't really say that because we've had  
15 issues because we're putting in IP cameras.  
16 Where - the IP cameras are like little  
17 computers. And they overload the system  
18 sometimes when the software isn't right. So it  
19 bogs down the system. And we've had problems  
20 where the recording stops, but we have a  
21 redundant recorder but not all the cameras  
22 would go down per se.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

24 MR. [REDACTED] And the reason I'm saying  
25 that also is because a lot of the cameras -

1 it's like a mix and match of old cameras and  
2 new cameras - analog cameras and like more  
3 computer-based cameras - IP cameras. So right  
4 now when the system fails the old analog  
5 cameras for the most part are going to work.  
6 The problems are going to be the newer cameras  
7 on the tiers. The older cameras would always  
8 pretty much be recording. If we ever had an  
9 issue.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: And we've had a few  
12 issues. Yes. But they're usually with the  
13 newer cameras not with the older ones.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Interesting. Okay. And  
15 as far as - just to make sure we are clear -  
16 which of the cameras in the SHU actually were  
17 recording on -.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the 46-door camera.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: And that's the one  
20 outside of 10 South?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. That's - and the  
22 only reason I know that is because the first  
23 day they came, they were looking for video.  
24 There was no video. And they were like, you've  
25 got to find video.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Who is "they"?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Um FBI.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: And then um so I stayed  
5 later the day and the night and I was trying to  
6 look to see what was recording. And that's  
7 when I figured out that the 46-door was  
8 actually recording on 10 South.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: The 9th or the 10th?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Um.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: The 10th is the day that  
12 he was found.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: I think it was in that  
14 morning the next day. When I came in first  
15 thing in the morning.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: So on Saturday it looks  
17 like?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Saturday. Yeah.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Now -.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Because I had to think  
21 about what was going on. And also during that  
22 day they made me move over - the cameras that  
23 were recording - put them on different  
24 recorders. It was like a mess.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Now were there any

1 cameras, recordings, or hard drives or anything  
2 that were sent to try to have the recordings  
3 recovered?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Uh well the whole thing  
5 with everything not recording that day was the  
6 way the system works. And we want to work with  
7 the vendor and FBI because they had to talk to  
8 - the way the system works is if the two drives  
9 are bad it's not going to start recording  
10 video. It's not going to go on a different  
11 drive were you're going to see bits and pieces  
12 of video from that day. You might see old  
13 video. But as far as new video from that day,  
14 whenever it went bad, you're not going to see  
15 any video.

16 MR. [REDACTED] So we had received  
17 information saying that video was attempted to  
18 be recovered by the FBI.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

20 MR. [REDACTED] What is meant by that?

21 MR. [REDACTED] They've got other stuff  
22 that they could probably do but, yeah, nothing.

23 MR. [REDACTED] But did they obtain  
24 anything? Any hard drives or -?

25 MR. [REDACTED] They took all the hard

1 drives. They took everything. They took the  
2 whole recorder - the whole recoding system.  
3 They took the next day.

4 MR. [REDACTED] But there's no way it was  
5 recorded - it was -. So if they say it was  
6 corrupt and it was unable to be retrieved, what  
7 does that mean in layman's terms?

8 MR. [REDACTED] There's no video. It's  
9 probably garbage. Just yeah.

10 MR. [REDACTED] But there's nothing.  
11 Does that just mean that there's no recording?  
12 Why would they use the word "corrupt"?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Because it's pretty much -  
14 you know, a computer is like one to zero. So  
15 probably when they finally get to that they  
16 couldn't retrieve anything. Nothing like you  
17 could see or make tangible. Like no real  
18 video.

19 MR. [REDACTED] See that's two different  
20 things. Right? It's not like they didn't  
21 retrieve anything. That just means they found  
22 the file. They just couldn't open it.

23 [REDACTED] They can't see it. Yes.

24 [REDACTED] That means something  
25 recorded.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Not necessarily. It  
2 could be garbage. Garbage can record and you  
3 think that's a good thing but it is not a good  
4 thing. It says it was recording. That's why I  
5 say that when a camera is bad or good, like I  
6 can have a camera that just looking at this and  
7 you're saying okay it's good but it's not  
8 looking at the whole room. This is nothing.  
9 This is garbage. It doesn't. The camera just  
10 knows it's working until I fix it and then it  
11 records the whole room. Then you know it's  
12 working.

13 MR. [REDACTED] When you went in on the  
14 10th to take a look at the video, did you  
15 actually see the recording files? Or did you  
16 not see any files at all?

17 MR. [REDACTED] I just know the drives  
18 were bad. And I think I tried to -. Yeah  
19 because they're like ex'd out when they're not  
20 working. So you're not going to see any  
21 recording files. You'll see the live video but  
22 you won't see anything recording.

23 MR. [REDACTED] So you use the software?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED] To try to open the files.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

2 MR. [REDACTED] But you didn't actually go  
3 in and try to find the actual base files for  
4 the recording from that night?

5 MR. [REDACTED] No.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

7 MR. [REDACTED] So was the cameras  
8 connected to a network?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

10 MR. [REDACTED] Who had access to the  
11 network?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Mainly whoever had a  
13 password to look at the Nice Vision. Usually I  
14 give out the passwords or a, computer services.

15 MR. [REDACTED] At that point who had  
16 access?

17 MR. [REDACTED] Oh um. I think most of  
18 the lieutenants had access. The warden had  
19 access. SIS had access. I had access. And I  
20 believe computer services. And maybe a few  
21 staff members here and there. But they just  
22 looked at live video - nothing recorded or  
23 (Indiscernible \*00:50:08) video.

24 MR. [REDACTED] SO that was my next  
25 question. Could they have done anything when

1 they logged in to manipulate the -?

2 MR. [REDACTED] No. You can't stop the -.  
3 The newer system you can. The old system you  
4 pretty much have to go in there and manually do  
5 it. Like you can't just -. You would have to  
6 go on the recorders and -. Yeah. I don't  
7 think anybody here knew - knows how to do that.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Did anyone outside the  
9 institution have access? Like because it was  
10 on the network, does like someone at the  
11 central office or anyone have access to or no?

12 MR. [REDACTED] From what they told me  
13 there's no back doors to it. So.

14 MR. [REDACTED] So it was a closed  
15 network?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Closed. Yeah. Closed.  
17 Yeah. In house thing.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Do you know if any  
19 situations about, came up in the past where it  
20 required that someone in the central office  
21 needed to log in to see the video? And they  
22 were able to do it remotely?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Nah. I don't know if the  
24 old system. The new system you can do that.  
25 The old system. I'm not sure. I don't believe

1 anybody from the region or anybody saw video on  
2 the old system.

3 [REDACTED] As far as when you left  
4 on August 9th. You knew that a number of  
5 cameras were down. When you came back on  
6 August 10th, do you know if it was the same  
7 cameras that were down?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. It was the same area  
9 cameras that were down. It's the same  
10 recorder. Just -.

11 MR. [REDACTED] So there weren't  
12 additional cameras that were down?

13 MR. [REDACTED] No. That would go down  
14 and come back up. No.

15 MR. MATULEWICZ: All right. So when you  
16 left on August 9th, it stopped recording. No  
17 additional cameras went down --

18 MR. [REDACTED] No.

19 MR. [REDACTED] -- between August 9th and  
20 August 10th when you returned.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

22 MR. [REDACTED] All right. And did you -  
23 do you know if anyone had any access to those  
24 cameras from 6:00 a.m. to let's say 10:00 a.m.  
25 on August 10th?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Well I left probably 2:00  
2 that afternoon. I don't believe there's  
3 anybody that would have to go in that room to  
4 do anything.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Were you in that room  
6 almost the whole time?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you know of anybody  
9 else that went into that room?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Um just the SIS tech that  
11 was there. But he doesn't go in the back room.  
12 He usually just goes in the front room.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: And when he leaves that's  
15 pretty much it. I don't - there's no reason  
16 for anybody to go in the back room.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: All right. So -.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: It's their evidence room  
19 too so they kind of don't let just anybody -  
20 just walk back there.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: After the incident were  
22 you the first person back there?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Um yeah. I believe so  
24 yes. And nothing looked tampered with. It all  
25 looked like the day I had left it - it looked

1 the same way.

2 MR. [REDACTED] And it's SIS tech, that  
3 was back there, his name is Tay?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Tay. Yeah. I believe  
5 it's Tay.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Can you spell that?

7 MR. [REDACTED] T-A-Y. He's retired now.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Oh, okay.

9 MR. [REDACTED] T-A-Y?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

11 MR. [REDACTED] The only camera that you  
12 said that was over that door in the SHU when  
13 you viewed it. Was it grainy or what it a good  
14 view?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Eh. I look at the cameras  
16 enough I can make out something. Most people  
17 would say it was grainy. But you can make out  
18 enough to see if anything was going on.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. I've got nothing  
20 more on that line.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Nope. (Indiscernible  
22 \*00:52:52)

23 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Now on July 23rd.

24 MR. [REDACTED] July 23rd. That's before?

25 MR. [REDACTED] No sorry. I take it back.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Talk about the phones

3 now.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. As part of your

5 job.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Right. Do you maintain

8 the phones in the system?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Yes I do. The phone

10 switch or the PBX. I maintain it.

11 MR. [REDACTED] As part - do you recall

12 after this incident. What's the = was a

13 preservation done off the phone recordings in

14 the -?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I believe my warden at the

16 time asked me to look up to see who um was

17 making phone calls or who possibly in SHU was

18 getting phone calls that night. And I did find

19 something.

20 MR. [REDACTED] This is Warden N'Diaye?

21 MR. [REDACTED] N'Diaye. Yes.

22 MR. [REDACTED] And you did find

23 something

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED] What did you find?

1 MR. [REDACTED] It was a phone call on the  
2 tier that they believe Epstein was taking a  
3 shower. Because he - I guess he got a shower  
4 and somebody gave him a phone call. I believe  
5 they found the phone call. That's what I  
6 believe. I'm not too sure who did what but.  
7 There was a phone call made.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Did you provide a copy of  
9 that over

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED] -- to the DOJ?

12 MR. [REDACTED] No. I gave it to my  
13 actual supervisor. The warden.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Was that a recorded call?

15 MR. [REDACTED] No. it was just a log to  
16 see how long the call was. Like when the call  
17 starts and when it ends. There's no recording.  
18 It's a legal call. So legal calls are  
19 protected. You can't give you know out the  
20 legal call information.

21 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.

22 [REDACTED] But you see who dialed it  
23 and how long that call was.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Now is every phone in the  
25 facility recorded? Other than legal calls?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the inmate phones are  
2 recorded. Yes.

3 MR. [REDACTED] What about from CO to CO?

4 MR. [REDACTED] No, that's not recorded.

5 MR. [REDACTED] None of the - let's just  
6 say an inmate has access - can get to the CO  
7 phone. If they make a phone call.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Well you try not to give  
9 them access to it.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: But they're never recorded  
11 for any reason?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Nah.

13 MR. [REDACTED] So when the SHU is  
14 talking with control or control is talking with  
15 R&D. Those calls aren't recorded.

16 MR. [REDACTED] No. There's just a log to  
17 see how long the call was - the duration - but  
18 that's pretty much it. What phone picked up  
19 and what phone hung up or -.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Are those logs maintained?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

22 MR. [REDACTED] For how long?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Uh I just had this a  
24 little while ago. Probably like a month.

25 MR. [REDACTED] That's all it is?

1 MR. [REDACTED] That's all it is. Yeah.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall if that was  
3 ever -? A copy of all the logs for that day?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I believe I gave a  
5 copy to somebody. Somebody with access. So  
6 I'm pretty sure I gave them call logs with  
7 everything.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So this is back then?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I gave logs - call  
10 logs.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall if it was  
12 all of August 9th and 10th? Or it was just for  
13 -?

14 MR. [REDACTED] It was probably a few  
15 days.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Do you still maintain  
18 those since you gave them?

19 MR. [REDACTED] No I just gave them. No  
20 reason for me to hold on to them.

21 MR. [REDACTED] So you physically gave it  
22 to them as opposed to via email or anything?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Nah. Um. Did I scan  
24 them? I might have emailed them. I'm not too  
25 sure.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Can you do us a favor?  
2 When you're done can you just check your outbox  
3 around those dates --  
4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Okay.  
5 MR. [REDACTED]: -- and see if you have  
6 those logged?  
7 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.  
8 MR. [REDACTED]: You don't recall who you  
9 provided it to? Right?  
10 MR. [REDACTED]: SIS or whoever's in charge  
11 of SIS. They were asking me for phone logs.  
12 MR. MATULEWICZ: All right. So SIS would  
13 have them then?  
14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.  
15 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.  
16 MR. [REDACTED]: If you want, it's on that  
17 line.  
18 MR. [REDACTED]: No. That's - so no. So  
19 only inmate calls are recorded; no staff member  
20 calls?  
21 MR. [REDACTED]: No staff member calls are  
22 recorded.  
23 MR. [REDACTED]: And that's throughout the  
24 entire institution?  
25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. What about coming  
2 in and out of the institution. Are they  
3 recorded?

4 MR. [REDACTED] What? What do you mean?

5 MR. [REDACTED] So if like R&D is  
6 speaking with the court or Marshals. Would  
7 they be recording?

8 MR. [REDACTED] No. that's not recorded.  
9 No.

10 MR. [REDACTED] So nothing coming in and  
11 out.

12 MR. [REDACTED] No. It's just when the  
13 inmates are talking on the phone. Their phone  
14 calls are recorded. Because they get that  
15 little warning to say you know you're being  
16 monitored. But that's about it.

17 MR. [REDACTED] And I thought when I  
18 called BOP facilities that it did say that this  
19 line is being recorded. Is that not the case?

20 MR. [REDACTED] No.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. Sometimes they just  
23 throw that in there to -. But it's not the  
24 case.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. It's a shame but.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Anything else on that  
4 topic? I'm going to move on.

5 MR. MATULEWICZ: No.

6 MR. [REDACTED] So that was August 9th.  
7 You left that day, what time?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Um maybe the end of my  
9 shift 2:00 or maybe like an hour later.

10 MR. [REDACTED] 2:00 p.m.?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. 2:00 p.m. Or maybe  
12 3:00 p.m.

13 MR. [REDACTED] When did you come back on  
14 shift?

15 MR. [REDACTED] 6:00 a.m. in the morning.

16 MR. [REDACTED] On August 10th?

17 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

18 MR. [REDACTED] And what do you recall  
19 happened on August 10th?

20 MR. [REDACTED] As soon as I came to the  
21 front door, I heard a body alarm on 10 South.  
22 And then I ran up to the body alarm on 10  
23 South. I mean 9 South.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: 10 South?

25 MR. [REDACTED] I mean 9 South.

1 MR. [REDACTED] And who hit the body  
2 alarm?

3 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know. I guess the  
4 officer whoever's on 10 - uh 9 South.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And when you got up there  
6 what did you see?

7 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know. I saw -  
8 what did you see? We were all just -. I don't  
9 know. What did I see...? I got up there.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Let's start off then. Who  
11 was up there when you got up there?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Uh when I got up  
13 there. I got on the elevator with -. Who did  
14 I get on the elevator with ...? I think Ms.  
15 [REDACTED] from food service was there. [REDACTED]  
16 Officer [REDACTED] was there. And [REDACTED]. And I  
17 think the lieutenant at that time was -  
18 Lieutenant [REDACTED] when I got upstairs. Those are  
19 the officers that I remember. And then the  
20 officers that were on the unit were Officer  
21 Thomas and Officer MS. Noel. And then I just  
22 remember us saying we needed to get the  
23 stretcher from the hallway. And an AD machine.  
24 And then they took him and put him on the  
25 stretcher. And I think after a little while -

1 the medical PA - came upstairs. And then  
2 started working on him. And then me and [REDACTED]  
3 were still doing chest compressions. We took  
4 him to the second floor until the ambulance  
5 came.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. I'm going to step  
7 back a little bit.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

9 MR. [REDACTED] So when the body alarm  
10 went off, right. And you were in the elevator  
11 with [REDACTED] and -

12 MR. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and I think  
13 Ms. [REDACTED].

14 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED] When you got  
15 up there, who was up there?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: I think lieutenant [REDACTED] I  
17 think was upstairs already. Maybe not. And  
18 then I know MS. Noel was there.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Noel is that Noel?

20 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know how to say  
21 that name right.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Tova Noel

23 MR. [REDACTED] Tova Noel. She was there  
24 and uh Thomas was there.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Is that Michael

1 Thomas?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Michael Thomas. Yes.

3 MR. [REDACTED] So you were one of the  
4 very first people on the scene.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Possibly the first maybe  
7 lieutenant [REDACTED]

8 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. They probably -. I  
9 think they might have got up there before we  
10 did. I'm not too sure.

11 MR. [REDACTED] When you say "they," was  
12 there someone other than -

13 MR. [REDACTED]: There was everybody in the  
14 elevator and it was just like a malaise or -.

15 MR. [REDACTED] But you said you were one  
16 of the first. So when you arrived to the cell  
17 what did you see?

18 MR. [REDACTED] I saw Thomas picking him  
19 up and people were helping him put him on a  
20 stretcher.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So when did you  
22 start doing the chest compressions?

23 MR. [REDACTED] I think like right away.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: On the stretcher though?

25 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. But not on the  
2 floor?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: No I don't believe on the  
4 floor.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Sorry I'll turn it back  
6 over to you.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: No it's the same question.  
8 So when you walk in. Let's say you walk into  
9 the SHU. Was the gates open already?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: The tier where he was on  
11 was open. And I don't remember if the Sally  
12 port door was open because the inner door - I  
13 think somebody had to open that door.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you walk in,  
15 and you head right up to the tier.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Because we know that  
17 was the tier something was happening on .

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Who was standing there?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I believe Thomas.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Thomas was inside or was  
21 outside?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: I think he was inside the  
23 tier.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Was anybody outside the  
25 tier?

1 MR. [REDACTED] I think Noel was outside  
2 the tier. Because usually the way SHU works is  
3 one officer in the tier and one officer outside  
4 of the tier with a key.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And out of the few people  
6 that came up in the elevator, were you the  
7 first one in the room or was there somebody  
8 else?

9 MR. [REDACTED] I think lieutenant [REDACTED]  
10 was there. He was pretty much directing  
11 everybody what to do.

12 MR. [REDACTED] And you come in. you walk  
13 up the stairs for L Tier.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Um M Tier. He was on M  
15 Tier I think which is the top.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: L Tier.

17 MR. [REDACTED] L Tier. Yes.

18 MR. [REDACTED] And do you recall which  
19 cell it was?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the first one. As soon  
21 as you go to the tier.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: So you get up there. You  
23 look in. What do you see?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Um what do I see? Epstein  
25 like not - uh - not tangible like not moving

1 not doing anything. And then everybody's like  
2 gathered around him and then we tried to move  
3 him to the stretcher. And then we started  
4 working on him on the stretcher.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Was anyone performing CPR  
6 when you walked in?

7 MR. [REDACTED] No I don't believe so.  
8 Because I think they were trying to cut him  
9 down before I got up there. I'm not saying I  
10 don't know exactly what happened. But I'm  
11 pretty sure they were cutting him down because  
12 he did have some stuff wrapped around him. So  
13 I think that's what happened.

14 MR. [REDACTED] So described it. What was  
15 he wearing?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Uh.

17 MR. [REDACTED] I know it's kind of tough.  
18 But.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Uh he had his orange  
20 boxers and uh the orange t-shirt. And I don't  
21 know if he had socks on or not.

22 MR. [REDACTED] So he had orange boxers  
23 and he had an orange t-shirt on?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED] And what else did he have

1 on him?

2 MR. [REDACTED] I think whatever was  
3 wrapped around him. They were trying to cut  
4 that off. And move that out of the way.

5 MR. [REDACTED] So was it around his neck?

6 MR. [REDACTED] When I go there I didn't  
7 see. I can't tell you what it was wrapped  
8 around.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

10 MR. [REDACTED] But when I did see him, I  
11 did see his neck was a little bit bruised  
12 though.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Did he have anything on  
14 his head? Headphones anything like that? Do  
15 you recall?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Not that I recall, no.

17 MR. [REDACTED] And then where was he  
18 laying when you walked in?

19 MR. [REDACTED] I think it was - by the  
20 time I got in they were moving him and it was  
21 just get the stretcher and the AED.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And CPR was done  
23 and then he was taken out?

24 MR. [REDACTED] We were working on him and  
25 then medical came up and kept working on him.

1 And then we took him downstairs.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall how many  
3 mattresses were on the floor if there were any?

4 MR. [REDACTED] I don't recall.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Is there anything  
6 about when you walked in that stood out to you  
7 about that cell?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Mm. No. Nothing really  
9 distinctive. Just a SHU cell.

10 MR. [REDACTED] And you mentioned you saw  
11 bruising. Where did you see bruising?

12 MR. [REDACTED] Around his neck.

13 MR. [REDACTED] On all sides or just one  
14 side?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I think around all sides.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And after they took  
17 him to medical, did you follow them down?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. I was - it was me  
19 and [REDACTED]. We were doing chest compressions on  
20 him until the second floor. And then we were in  
21 medical. And [REDACTED] was making his phone  
22 calls and notifications. And I don't know if  
23 [REDACTED] gave him a shot but we had to keep  
24 working on him.

25 MR. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is in medical?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: And the medical guy. And  
2 then um they tried to give him the AED machine  
3 upstairs and it didn't work. And I think the  
4 AED machine was still working on him when we  
5 took him downstairs. We were still pumping on  
6 his chest.

7 MR. [REDACTED] And after the medical  
8 office was be brought to the hospital?

9 MR. [REDACTED] That part I don't know  
10 about. After all that happened, I just knew  
11 that everything was short-staffed and since I  
12 came in to do my job, there was nobody in  
13 custody. So after all that I went up to the  
14 Special Housing Unit and I worked there for  
15 about an hour.

16 MR. [REDACTED] You went back to the SHU?

17 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

18 MR. [REDACTED] What did you do?

19 MR. [REDACTED] Settled inmate population  
20 down. They get a little rowdy when they see  
21 stuff happen and don't know what's going on.  
22 So you've got to kind of just do custody work.

23 MR. [REDACTED] Who was in the SHU when  
24 you were up there?

25 MR. [REDACTED] It was me, Lieutenant

1 [REDACTED], I believe. She came up from  
2 somewhere. Lieutenant [REDACTED] was there. And  
3 um Officer Noel was there also.

4 MR. [REDACTED] She was still there?

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED] What was she doing?

7 MR. [REDACTED] She just looked like a  
8 little disheveled like she didn't know what was  
9 going on. Just stressed. Because that was her  
10 first suicide. So when you see something like  
11 that you kind of don't know how you would uh  
12 react.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Did you talk to her about  
14 it?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I don't believe so. I  
16 just kind of let her do her thing. And I just  
17 had to get to - because they were feeding in  
18 the morning time. So you have to you know try  
19 to settle everything down.

20 MR. [REDACTED] When you got up there and  
21 um initially, do you recall if Officers Michael  
22 Thomas or Noel, Tova Noel made any statements,  
23 any comments to Lieutenant [REDACTED]?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't really recall. It  
25 was like a mess. I don't really know what was

1 said.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Did you assist Anderson-  
3 Lane in giving out food?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Were you in the same tier  
6 with them when she handed out the food?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall any  
9 interactions between her and the inmates?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Uh there was a lot of  
11 things saying inmates said that were heard -  
12 not right.

13 MR. [REDACTED] So what kind of stuff did  
14 the inmates say?

15 MR. [REDACTED] You killed him. What they  
16 say. You killed him. You weren't making  
17 rounds. You killed him. You weren't making  
18 rounds. You guys got to get a new job. You  
19 guys are done. A lot of fuck you this - your  
20 mother this. You know. it was just a -.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Did [REDACTED] say  
22 anything back to them?

23 MR. [REDACTED] I don't believe so. I  
24 don't know what she said to the inmates. Like  
25 I said it was just like a - I don't know what

1 was said back and forth.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall if any  
3 comments were made about providing an alibi for  
4 the CO's?

5 MR. [REDACTED] No. I don't believe so.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Anything else on that?

7 MR. MATULEWICZ: A lot. Um so we'll just  
8 go in reverse order. So when you said you  
9 killed him, who killed him?

10 MR. [REDACTED] They like the officers  
11 killed Epstein.

12 MR. MATULEWICZ: Did they - were they  
13 referring to any specific officers?

14 MR. [REDACTED] The officers that were up  
15 there - Thomas and Noel. Yeah.

16 MR. [REDACTED] So they were saying that  
17 they killed him?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. You guys killed  
19 him.

20 MR. [REDACTED] And did they say anything  
21 specifically about how?

22 MR. [REDACTED] No. They was just - they  
23 were upset so they were just saying it but they  
24 didn't say how.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Did anyone say -?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: They didn't say that they  
2 went in the cells to try to kill him or open up  
3 the grille. They just said you guys killed  
4 him. But.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And what was -? Did you  
6 ask any follow-up questions with regard to  
7 that?

8 MR. [REDACTED] I just know not to say  
9 anything. So I just do what I have to do and  
10 don't get involved in that.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Did they provide any  
12 other information with regard to when they were  
13 saying you killed him?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Just that they didn't do  
15 rounds. And that was pretty much about it.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Did they say anything  
17 more about not doing rounds or just said that  
18 they didn't do any rounds? Or what did they  
19 say about that?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: They didn't do any rounds.  
21 They were sitting there all night. I don't  
22 think they came over here once.

23 MR. [REDACTED] They said they came over  
24 once?

25 MR. [REDACTED] They never came. They

1 never did any rounds.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: They said they never did  
3 one?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh. So they never did  
6 once?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Is that what you mean?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Did they mention  
11 when they stopped doing rounds?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: No? All right. You said  
14 that when you came back it was Noel and  
15 [REDACTED] and yourself. Just the three of you.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe so.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Was Thomas already gone  
18 then?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: All right. Did you see  
21 anyone near the officer station at that time?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I don't believe so.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you know if anybody -.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the round slips. I  
25 don't know if anybody started to write stuff

1 down or anything.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: What about with regards  
3 to Epstein's file? DO you know if anyone went  
4 into Epstein's file at that time?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even know if he  
6 had -. He had a SHU file but I don't know who  
7 would have access to that.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Wouldn't the SHU file be  
9 right there in the SHU?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. But it's usually the  
11 OIC would know where the file is.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Did you see  
13 [REDACTED] at all around that desk area?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I don't know what  
15 they were doing as far as the file or anything.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Were you with [REDACTED]  
17 [REDACTED] the whole time she was there?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I was feeding so I was  
19 kind of like by myself. Let me down the tier.  
20 I'll feed.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you - I thought  
22 you said that you were feeding with [REDACTED]  
23 [REDACTED] at the same time.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: No-no-no. She would do  
25 something else and I take this tier and she was

1 doing something else.

2 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So you would  
3 each be in your own individual tier?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Feeding. Yeah.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And feeding.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Because there were only  
7 two people to feed.

8 MR. [REDACTED] All right. And was Noel  
9 also feeding?

10 MR. [REDACTED] No. I think she was  
11 opening the grill.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: She was opening the  
13 grill. And she was standing on the outside?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

15 MR. [REDACTED] And how does that work?  
16 Are you allowed to be going and feeding by  
17 yourself? And [REDACTED] also going down -?

18 MR. [REDACTED] To feed. Yes. Because  
19 you're not opening the -. You're just opening  
20 the slot. You're not opening the door for the  
21 inmates. So that's okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So that's all  
23 right. Now did you notice anything else taking  
24 place in there aside from feeding when you were  
25 in there?

1 MR. [REDACTED] No.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Around what time were you  
3 in there?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Uh probably a little bit  
5 after 6:00 a.m.

6 MR. [REDACTED] So if he -.

7 MR. [REDACTED] And then I -.

8 MR. [REDACTED] If the body alarm gets  
9 activated at 6:33 a.m., about what time did you  
10 come back after you did the lifesaving  
11 measures?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I probably went  
13 downstairs, put my stuff away, and then I had  
14 two TDY staff with me. They stayed in the  
15 basement.

16 MR. [REDACTED] When you say the  
17 basement, what does that mean?

18 MR. [REDACTED] In my office. They were  
19 in my office. Because I didn't know anything  
20 would happen. And they just didn't need to be  
21 a part of anything that was transpired. So.

22 MR. [REDACTED] But they weren't in the  
23 SHU?

24 MR. [REDACTED] No they never went to the  
25 SHU. They never responded to the body alarm.

1 MR. [REDACTED] So do you think you were  
2 back in the SHU by about 7:00 a.m.?

3 MR. [REDACTED] Before 7:00 a.m.

4 MR. [REDACTED] So prior to 7:00 a.m. and  
5 then -.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Then you stayed in there  
8 until almost 8:00 a.m.?

9 MR. [REDACTED] I don't even know. I  
10 stayed in there for a quite a while. I'm not  
11 too sure.

12 MR. [REDACTED] By - while you were in  
13 there, did SIS or anyone else come in and start  
14 preserving evidence?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I don't believe anybody  
16 was here to start doing any of that.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So by the time you  
18 left -. You left - when you left there, who  
19 was still there?

20 MR. [REDACTED] I don't even know who came  
21 up to relieve me, honestly.

22 MR. [REDACTED] No? But someone did  
23 relieve you?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Somebody did relieve  
25 me. Then I got asked about cameras and phone

1 calls and -.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Right. So it's just a  
3 whirlwind

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. Just a - yeah.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And when you saw Epstein,  
6 are you sure he had a shirt on?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Pretty sure. Did he have  
8 a shirt on? I'm not for sure. Honestly. I  
9 don't really remember that.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Can you remember yourself  
11 actually doing those chest compressions?

12 MR. [REDACTED] I was doing chest  
13 compressions.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you remember -?

15 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. We had to take his  
16 shirt off. Okay. Yeah. We had to take his  
17 shirt off.

18 MR. [REDACTED] So you actually took it  
19 off?

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Do you remember taking it  
22 off?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah because that's how  
24 you got to put on the AED. So the shirt came  
25 off.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Do you remember it  
2 actually taking it off or that it was off  
3 already?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Maybe it was off already.  
5 MR. [REDACTED] But you can't recall?  
6 MR. [REDACTED] No.  
7 MR. [REDACTED] And when you said when  
8 you arrived, you're not - there was no one  
9 doing chest compressions at the time that you  
10 arrived?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: They were - I think they  
12 were trying to cut him down and we - and I  
13 think I went to go get the stretcher and the  
14 AED so by the time I came back, whatever they  
15 were doing to try to move him --

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.  
17 MR. [REDACTED] -- by the time we got the  
18 stretcher, that's when we started working on  
19 him. Because you obviously can't work on him  
20 because he's hanging up and -.

21 MR. [REDACTED] So you believe he was  
22 actually hanging by the time - when you got  
23 there?

24 MR. [REDACTED] They were moving him down.  
25 He was in an up position and they were lowering

1 him down to whatever position.

2 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So he may not  
3 have been actually hanging but he was like  
4 sitting up?

5 MR. [REDACTED] I'm not too sure.

6 MR. [REDACTED] You don't know?

7 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Somebody was holding him  
10 so I don't know if he was -. If they were like  
11 trying to -.

12 MR. [REDACTED] So just walk me through  
13 that. What exactly did you see? When you say  
14 someone was holding him. What do you mean by  
15 holding him?

16 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So you get in the  
17 SHU. There's not a lot space in the SHU.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Totally.

19 MR. [REDACTED] So if an inmate is  
20 hanging, usually you try to hold them and make  
21 sure you know you can cut them down. And with  
22 all that going on, I think I went to get the  
23 AED and the um -. Because there was enough  
24 staff there. I didn't need to go in the cell.  
25 There's no space.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: So I just got the AED or  
3 the stretcher and bring it back.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: But you believe - there -  
5 are you confident that there were actually - he  
6 was like in an upright position when you first  
7 saw him?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I'm pretty sure. He  
9 wasn't laying down. It was (Indiscernible  
10 \*01:12:00).

11 MR. [REDACTED]: So he was not laying down  
12 yet --

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Was he laying down?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: -- and they weren't  
15 already working on him.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh. I don't really. I  
17 remember him being moved. I don't know if he  
18 was laying down when I first got there. I  
19 don't really -.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: That I can't say for sure.  
22 I know he was being moved when I initially got  
23 there. And then I went down. I can't say he  
24 was laying down because I didn't --

25 MR. [REDACTED]: All right.

1 MR. [REDACTED] -- see him.

2 MR. [REDACTED] But you do know he was  
3 being moved.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

5 MR. [REDACTED] You just don't - and you  
6 believe he was in an upright - like seated-type  
7 position.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Or whatever position he  
9 was, they were trying to move him out of that  
10 position.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

12 MR. [REDACTED] To administer first aid or  
13 whatever

14 MR. [REDACTED] So when is the first time  
15 that you know he was actually receiving chest  
16 compressions?

17 MR. [REDACTED] Uh as soon as we put him  
18 on the stretcher.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Did anyone check for  
20 breath or a pulse?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Uh the duty PA. Uh  
22 Columbo. And then he put the AED on. The AED  
23 tells you if there's a pulse or anything. And  
24 stay clear so they could do the shock.

25 MR. [REDACTED] All right. So prior -

1 that's the first you know chest compressions  
2 were ever done on him?

3 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

5 MR. [REDACTED] I've just got a follow-up  
6 on that question.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: All right.

8 MR. [REDACTED] Mm.

9 MR. [REDACTED] When you walked in and  
10 when they started doing the chest -. Where was  
11 his body being - like when you walk in -. His  
12 bunk is there.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Mm-hmm.

14 MR. [REDACTED] And we know there's a --

15 MR. [REDACTED] Corner

16 MR. [REDACTED] -- corner. Right?

17 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

18 MR. [REDACTED] Which way was his head  
19 facing head? And where was his legs?

20 MR. [REDACTED] He was kind of like,  
21 somebody was just holding him. So I can't  
22 really tell if he was going this way or that.  
23 But somebody was behind him physically holding  
24 him like this trying to move him.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Were they trying to get

1 him out of the corner and bring him out?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. I believe that's  
3 what was going on. But there was no way to put  
4 him there because you can't put him on the  
5 ground to do anything. So that's when we -  
6 free to get the stretcher and AED machine.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Why couldn't they put him  
8 down on the ground?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: I usually put them down on  
10 the ground. But usually it just second nature.  
11 You always get a stretcher. Because you don't  
12 want none of the inmates seeing you work on an  
13 inmate. It never looks good. So you kind of -  
14 you just - everything is just so fast. Like it  
15 just moves just like a - it's not like you wait  
16 or hesitate. But you just kind of know what to  
17 do. There's no hesitation. But you just know  
18 what's going to happen and you never really  
19 want to work in front of the inmates or the  
20 inmates behind a door. Like that's not a good  
21 idea. So you try to move them as much so you  
22 can really start working them.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: SO you don't think anyone  
24 did CPR on him until he was moved over?

25 MR. [REDACTED] No. We did CPR on him.

1 I'm pretty sure somebody did. But it was just  
2 a process of everything was so -. Everything  
3 just happened like this where it just didn't  
4 seem like -. It seemed like it took minutes  
5 but it probably just took seconds the way  
6 everything was going.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So I guess is there any  
9 reason for you to believe that Epstein didn't  
10 take his own life?

11 MR. [REDACTED] No.

12 MR. [REDACTED] Do you believe Epstein  
13 took his own life?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. I believe so.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Were the inmates saying  
16 anything about anyone going into Epstein's  
17 cell?

18 MR. [REDACTED] No.

19 MR. [REDACTED] So all they said was that  
20 they didn't check - they didn't do their  
21 rounds?

22 MR. [REDACTED] The rounds. They didn't  
23 do anything all night.

24 MR. [REDACTED] So do you believe that's  
25 what they meant by you killed him?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. They didn't do their  
2 job.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: So they didn't do their  
4 job -.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And with them -. Yeah.  
6 They didn't. By them not doing their rounds,  
7 they can't check to see if he was breathing or  
8 what's going on.

9 MR. [REDACTED] And that's how they  
10 killed him.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. That's how they  
12 killed him.

13 MR. [REDACTED] All right. As far as  
14 when you were in there. After you come back up  
15 to the SHU, after you leave the medical unit.  
16 You said you got there before 7:00 a.m. The  
17 entire time you were in there for approximately  
18 one hour. Was [REDACTED] in there with  
19 you?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I don't recall. She  
21 might have come down and checked on things.  
22 The lieutenant came down and checked to see  
23 what was going on. And that was about it. And  
24 then we have to write our statements about what  
25 transpired.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Oh did you and [REDACTED]  
2 [REDACTED] both write statements?  
3 MR. [REDACTED] No. I wrote my own  
4 statement.  
5 MR. [REDACTED] You wrote your own  
6 statement? But you did write a statement?  
7 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.  
8 MR. [REDACTED] Did [REDACTED] also  
9 write a statement though?  
10 MR. [REDACTED] I believe so. I'm not too  
11 sure. She's a lieutenant. She should know to  
12 write a statement but I -.  
13 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.  
14 MR. [REDACTED] That's something that  
15 yeah. I don't have to write a statement.  
16 MR. [REDACTED] And where you do write  
17 statements from?  
18 MR. [REDACTED] Um my computer. I just go  
19 to my desk and -.  
20 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And would have  
21 [REDACTED] also written one though? Like  
22 did - was she one of the responding officers?  
23 Or did she just come up to help feed?  
24 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know if she came  
25 up with the body alarm. It was -. I don't

1 think she was there initially when everything  
2 happened. So I don't think, yeah.

3 MR. [REDACTED] So she wouldn't have  
4 written a statement then. Correct?

5 MR. [REDACTED] No.

6 MR. [REDACTED] So do you recall at the  
7 time that you left the SHU. Do you know if she  
8 was still in there?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Um I don't know.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: You're not sure?

11 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know. Yeah.

12 MR. [REDACTED] And again, did you see  
13 anyone that was in there around that officer  
14 station?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I just there was - working  
16 on the tier making sure I do rounds and try to  
17 talk to the inmates to settle them down as much  
18 as I could.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. But you didn't  
20 notice any files being manipulated?

21 MR. [REDACTED] No. Nobody was going by  
22 the desk or doing anything like that. Like I  
23 didn't see anybody trying to go and grab stuff  
24 or move stuff around. Like I didn't see any of  
25 that.

1 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. Okay. And you  
2 didn't see anybody actually take papers or -?

3 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. And I'm pretty sure  
4 if somebody did it, it would probably be on  
5 camera too. Because that camera was working  
6 so.

7

8 MR. [REDACTED] Well that camera that  
9 you're talking about that was working - you  
10 can't make anything out on it.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. Yeah. You can't  
12 really make anything out.

13 MR. [REDACTED] So even if someone's near  
14 there, you can't really see what they're doing.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Really see what they're  
16 doing, yeah. But I don't think anybody was  
17 going there to do anything. Because I don't  
18 even think anybody knew like what the hell was  
19 going on.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

21 MR. [REDACTED] To be honest with you. It  
22 was like what the hell just happened.

23 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. And as far as  
24 that. That is the one and only camera, that  
25 one that was up by 10 South, that was working?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. That was working.

2 MR. [REDACTED] All right. Then nothing  
3 else. Nothing else that was ever working?

4 MR. [REDACTED] Um there was other ones in  
5 the Sally port. But nothing as far as the SHU.  
6 That was the only one in the SHU.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Um. All right. So as  
8 far as that camera though that was showing  
9 people - who was going in and out of the SHU.  
10 Was that working?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Um the 9 Sally I'm not too  
12 sure.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED] That I'm not too sure  
15 about.

16 MR. [REDACTED] You just said it was  
17 working.

18 MR. [REDACTED] I'm not - no I'm not sure  
19 if it was recording, the Sally camera was  
20 recording.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. That's what I was  
22 saying. The difference between working and  
23 recording to him is if it's actually a live  
24 feed -.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. I can't tell you.

1 Yeah. It gets confusing.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Um. But. All right.

3 And again. You believe that - sorry. Start  
4 over. You believe Epstein took his own life?

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Based on the agent's  
8 question. You said you were doing feeding.  
9 Did you do feeding on L Tier after? The tier  
10 that Epstein was found in. Did you -?

11 MR. [REDACTED] I probably did yeah.  
12 Because I don't really. I probably did.

13 MR. [REDACTED] How long were you up there  
14 for?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know.

16 MR. [REDACTED] Do you recall if his cell  
17 was secured? Or was it left open?

18 MR. [REDACTED] Initially it was probably  
19 left open and-

20 MR. [REDACTED] For how long?

21 MR. [REDACTED] I don't know. I'm not too  
22 sure. But then I think when I came back to  
23 feed - because we lock all the cells. It's  
24 probably locked when I started doing feeding.

25 MR. [REDACTED] But were there CO's going

1 in and out of there?

2 MR. [REDACTED] No. There's no reason to  
3 go inside of a cell. And everybody knows like  
4 after a suicide, it's a crime scene. So  
5 usually you just stay away from the cell.

6 MR. [REDACTED] DO you recall  
7 approximately when they came and they secured  
8 it as a crime scene?

9 MR. [REDACTED] I'm not too sure when that  
10 happened

11 MR. [REDACTED] But it wasn't secured when  
12 you left

13 MR. [REDACTED] Um when I - when I went  
14 down there for the body alarm it wasn't secure.  
15 I mean when I took him down to medical doing  
16 chest compressions. He wasn't - it wasn't  
17 secured. I don't really -. But when I came  
18 back upstairs it was secured. The door was  
19 locked I believe.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

21 MR. [REDACTED] And I know I was honing  
22 in on [REDACTED] but what about Noel? Did  
23 you see Noel near the officers' station at all?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Uh I believe she received  
25 a phone call or somebody wanted to see what was

1 going on. Asked them like what happened or -.

2 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. Did you see her  
3 manipulating any files or dealing with any  
4 paperwork?

5 MR. [REDACTED] I don't believe so.

6 MR. [REDACTED] No? All right. And then  
7 going way back to our initial conversation you  
8 said that you put in a work order for SigNet.  
9 Was that on the 9th?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Um probably before, yeah.  
11 Of July. Um.

12 MR. [REDACTED] No. That would have been  
13 August 9th. The day before Epstein was found.

14 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. I was just  
15 troubleshooting with them. I was on the phone  
16 with them. It's not really a work order. Just  
17 you know I call them up. Hey, this what's  
18 going on what should we do.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay. So there would be  
20 no paperwork showing -.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Um from - SigNet would  
22 have paperwork.

23 MR. [REDACTED] So they would show that  
24 you called --

25 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

1 MR. [REDACTED] -- and you said that  
2 these things were down.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. And I was having  
4 problems.

5 MR. [REDACTED] And do you have any of  
6 those files?

7 MR. [REDACTED] No. They have their own  
8 files they keep.

9 MR. [REDACTED] Just they would be able  
10 to like -

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. And I was on -.  
12 Since that happened, I was pretty much on the  
13 phone with them for like a week after that. So  
14 they would have records of when I called or  
15 whatever happened.

16 MR. [REDACTED] All right. And then as  
17 far as - and now we're going way to the  
18 beginning. You said that you were - you did -  
19 you were interviewed by the FBI. You said on  
20 the 10th you were also interviewed by them  
21 after the 10th of August?

22 MR. [REDACTED] Because I was the subject  
23 matter expert as far as the cameras go. So  
24 they want to know like how can you find video  
25 if you could find video. What can I do. And

1 then they came in the next day they tried to -.  
2 As soon as I found the video, that's the real  
3 video they wanted because they wanted to make  
4 sure they had something in it. Because they  
5 were pretty mad that there was no video at all.  
6 And I found that video. Because I wasn't sure  
7 what was on the recorders or what wasn't on the  
8 recorders at one point.

9 MR. [REDACTED] And that's the 10 South  
10 video?

11 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED] And um do you know if  
13 that video was ever enhanced to be able to see  
14 it more clearly?

15 MR. [REDACTED] I have no idea if they did  
16 or did not.

17 MR. [REDACTED] But you did not?

18 MR. [REDACTED] No. I did not do that.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Do you even have that  
20 ability to do that?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Not without software we  
22 have. No. Not going to happen.

23 MR. [REDACTED] : Okay.

24 MR. [REDACTED] You mentioned that, maybe  
25 I'm mistaken. You mentioned there was a work

1 order created prior to the 9th for the cameras?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. There was a few  
3 work orders that the recorders were going down  
4 or failing. We have problems.

5 MR. [REDACTED] When were those created?

6 MR. [REDACTED] Uh maybe a year before or  
7 six months before. It was just a constant  
8 thing as far as the cameras not working.  
9 Because we was trying to get upgraded. We were  
10 trying to get money spent. So we have to  
11 create - any time there's a problem, I have to  
12 create a work order or tell like the regional  
13 office like there's a problem. Because it's a  
14 work order over 10,000 so they have to put  
15 money aside to do the work. Like it's not a  
16 quick fix to fix the recorders.

17 MR. [REDACTED] And these recorders were  
18 maintained in house or only by SigNet?

19 MR. [REDACTED] The work orders we have  
20 are maintained here in house.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Who would have access to  
22 that?

23 MR. [REDACTED] Um the facility manager.

24 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

25 MR. [REDACTED] Anybody in facilities

1 pretty much would have access to it. But  
2 really facility manager.

3 MR. [REDACTED] On August 9th when you saw  
4 that the system was down. Has it gone down  
5 just like that before?

6 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

7 MR. [REDACTED] How long did it take you  
8 to fix it?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Sometimes maybe a day  
10 maybe two days - maybe a couple days. And the  
11 thing - and I have to stress also - is just  
12 because I saw it down -. Because I don't check  
13 it every day. I don't know if it was down for  
14 a week, a month, you know. It's not one of  
15 those things you check all the time. But I  
16 would - since we were having problems more  
17 readily, I would always check like once a week  
18 to make sure it was working. But before it was  
19 not like okay I've got to go up here and check  
20 it because it wasn't happening.

21 MR. [REDACTED] That was my next question.  
22 Did you just happen to walk in there that day?  
23 Or -?

24 MR. [REDACTED] I already knew we were  
25 having issues. And I think I got the hard

1 drives out. Because I was going to take them  
2 up there and see what was going on.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Now based on the fact that  
4 this happened before. Right. Was that same  
5 exact situation. Same exact -.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

7 MR. [REDACTED] Same exact drives?

8 MR. [REDACTED] Um I think it's switched.  
9 It could have been recorder one and then  
10 recorder two. I don't think it was just the  
11 same recorder all the time because one recorder  
12 was actually the whole motherboard have to get  
13 replaced. And that was again I think that was  
14 recorder two. And before drives would go out  
15 on one or two, so it was just random. They  
16 were old. They just needed to get replaced.

17 MR. [REDACTED] And at that point you knew  
18 that the drives were not recording.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Were any actions taken to  
21 make sure that is this does happen in the  
22 future that at least something would be  
23 recorded?

24 MR. [REDACTED] Yes. Exactly that.

25 MR. [REDACTED] What actions were taken?

1 MR. [REDACTED] Um now we have redundant  
2 drives. So if one drive fails, you always have  
3 a backup.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No-no. I'm talking about  
5 prior to the 9th.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. Prior to the 9th?  
7 No. There was really nothing. They just knew  
8 we had a problem. We had ordered the new  
9 system. We were online to get it installed.  
10 But we were just not lucky to get it installed.

11 MR. [REDACTED] And the record would show  
12 that there was an order for -?

13 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. And that we have  
14 the shipping stuff for the system actually. It  
15 was here. It was in the building.

16 MR. [REDACTED] You just didn't get it  
17 installed yet?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Didn't get installed. It  
19 got installed a couple - um the = happened on  
20 the 9th, 10th, or 11th. That's when the new  
21 system got installed.

22 MR. [REDACTED] I got nothing else.

23 MR. MATULEWICZ: Yeah. The other thing.  
24 We've already asked you this, but I just want  
25 to make sure. So the title of you supervisor

1 did you say facilities manager?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: And how would we again  
4 figure out who that was at the time?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh I don't know. you  
6 would just have to ask. I'm not too sure who  
7 the facility manager was.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: But you don't even know  
9 how - (Indiscernible \*01:24:08)

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I think it was [REDACTED]  
11 but I'm not too sure. Because he was maybe  
12 Acting at the time. I don't think he got the  
13 position yet.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Is he the facilities  
15 manager now?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Now, yes he is.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: And again you know you  
18 notified whoever was the facilities manager at  
19 the time.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Or my general foreman  
21 usually. It's one of those two. I usually  
22 notify both of them.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: So the general manager  
24 and/or the general foreman?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: And general foreman. Yeah.

1 I have to notify somebody. I can't just walk  
2 out of the building and not say anything.

3 MR. [REDACTED] And you said you're  
4 positive you definitely made those  
5 notifications?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I had to. Because  
7 I was coming back the next day to do work.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Um you said it was the  
9 general foreman?

10 MR. [REDACTED] Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED] Um and do you know of -?

12 MR. [REDACTED] But I don't even think we  
13 had a general foreman. I'm not too sure. It  
14 was two years ago. I'm not even sure if we had  
15 a general foreman.

16 MR. [REDACTED] And being though that  
17 this was such a big deal and these cameras were  
18 such a big part of it, did you ever learn if  
19 either of those people ever passed the  
20 information up?

21 MR. [REDACTED] Mm no.

22 MR. [REDACTED] So no, that was never  
23 spoken of?

24 MR. [REDACTED] No.

25 MR. [REDACTED] And you guys didn't - you

1 never had that conversation with those  
2 supervisors after the fact?

3 MR. [REDACTED] Uh it was -. Did we have  
4 a conversation after? I never really asked if  
5 it got -. They - I'm pretty sure everybody  
6 knew it wasn't working because I came back the  
7 next day. So -.

8 MR. [REDACTED] So did they ever - did  
9 anyone ever say anything to you about like hey  
10 why didn't tell me?

11 MR. [REDACTED] No. I don't get that.  
12 no.

13 MR. [REDACTED] No?

14 MR. [REDACTED] No. I'm not going to get  
15 that.

16 MR. [REDACTED] All right.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Because I would have told  
18 somebody. I'm not going to leave.

19 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Because I came from  
21 another jail. I can't just leave and not say  
22 anything. That's -.

23 MR. [REDACTED] So like SIS or the  
24 captain never came up to you and said he what's  
25 happened? Why didn't you let anybody know?

1 MR. [REDACTED] No.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: So. Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED] Because it was a known  
4 problem that the recorders were going down. So  
5 I'd have to say hey, this is what's going on.

6 MR. [REDACTED] Gotcha.

7 MR. [REDACTED] I'm trying to fix it.  
8 I'll be back tomorrow.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I think that's all  
10 I've got.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: That's all I have. Is  
12 there anything else you think we should have  
13 asked you that we didn't ask?

14 MR. [REDACTED] Um. It's an investigation  
15 I just - I just hope this never happens again.  
16 I'm mean I was comfortable because I came from  
17 another institution. I knew what I was doing  
18 as far as the cameras and recorders. And I  
19 know how all that stuff works. But I just wish  
20 the Bureau would be more proactive as far as  
21 maintenance and buying new stuff. Like I know  
22 now they are like more on top everything. But  
23 it's not really - it's not good.

24 MR. [REDACTED] All right.

25 MR. [REDACTED] That's just my only thing.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: So still to date?

2 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah. They still got to  
3 do a lot of improvements.

4 MR. [REDACTED] Okay.

5 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

6 MR. [REDACTED] So you don't believe it's  
7 actually been rectified? There still needs a  
8 lot of work?

9 MR. [REDACTED] Oh yeah. I've been to  
10 other institutions. There's a lot of camera  
11 work that needs to get done. As far as -.  
12 Yeah.

13 MR. [REDACTED] To just to keep up to  
14 date with other institutions.

15 MR. [REDACTED] Uh no. This institution  
16 is fine. I've did a lot of overtime here.

17 MR. [REDACTED] Oh. Oh. Sure. I  
18 thoughts that what you were saying. I thought  
19 you meant MCC's not up to speed.

20 MR. [REDACTED] No. We're up to speed.  
21 We're ahead of the curve. We got IP cameras  
22 pretty much everywhere. But I'm just saying  
23 overall I just wish the Bureau was more  
24 proactive. And like when I came to this  
25 institution for instance like there was only

1 one camera in a housing unit. When I was in  
2 Brooklyn, I was custody, it was cameras all  
3 over the place. I went to Indiana and I was a  
4 contact at a complex which was a high, medium,  
5 low, there's a camp, there's a death row.  
6 There's cameras everywhere. I come to this  
7 jail, New York City. And I'm expecting cameras  
8 everywhere. And one of the first things was  
9 like, oh, we don't have money for that. We  
10 don't have money for this. We don't have money  
11 for that. And I just kept saying hey, you guys  
12 got to do something. This is a problem. God  
13 forbid this is what happened. But I just wish  
14 there was more proactivity. Like -.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: But right now, MCC is up  
16 to speed?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: We're good. Yeah we're  
18 good. We don't have any issues.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: So when you made that  
20 statement, you're talking about other  
21 facilities.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Other facilities in  
23 general. I wish the Bureau would invest more  
24 money.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

1 MR. [REDACTED] And training too. Like  
2 just getting new equipment. That's not it.  
3 Also train the staff. Because even like when I  
4 learned how to do the cameras stuff, it was  
5 just me over the phone with SigNet. I never  
6 really went to a physical training. Hey,  
7 Daniel this is the system you have. Take this  
8 drive out, do X, Y, and Z. I'm just like I'm  
9 on the phone. I'm looking at it. Okay. The  
10 light is this color. This is - I'm a smart  
11 guy. I could figure it out. But at the same  
12 time like -.

13 MR. [REDACTED] Right

14 MR. [REDACTED] Somebody that's not really  
15 savvy, is -. Yeah. Going to be lost.

16 MR. [REDACTED] All right. Thank you so  
17 much for taking your time. I know you just had  
18 that leave training. So I really appreciate  
19 that.

20 MR. [REDACTED] Yeah.

21 MR. [REDACTED] Thank you Mr. Daniel  
22 again. So if there's nothing else, this is  
23 Special Agent [REDACTED] The time is 3:44  
24 p.m. on Thursday July 15, 2021. I am turning  
25 off the recorder. Ending the interview and

1 turning off the recorder.
