1 MR. [REDACTED]: This is Special Agent
2 [REDACTED]. Today is Thursday, July 15,
3 2021. The time is 2:15 p.m. My name is [REDACTED]
4 [REDACTED]. I'm a Special Agent with the U.S.
5 Department of Justice Office of the Inspector
6 General New York Field Office. And these are
7 my credentials. This interview is with Federal
8 Bureau of Prisons [REDACTED].

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Hmph.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: And it is being conducted
11 as part of an official U.S. Department of
12 Justice Office of the Inspector General
13 investigation. Today is July 15, 2021. The
14 time is 2:16 p.m. The interview is being
15 conducted at Metropolitan Correctional Center
16 located at 150 Park Row. We are in the
17 executive assistant's office. Also present is
18 DOJ OIG Senior Special Agent [REDACTED].
19 And the - also this interview will be recorded
20 by me, Special Agent [REDACTED]. Could
21 everyone please identify themselves for the
22 record and spell your last name. To start,
23 again I am Special Agent [REDACTED], [REDACTED]
24 [REDACTED].
25 [REDACTED]: My name is Senior Special

1 Agent [REDACTED], [REDACTED].

2 And these are my credentials. Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED] can you, if
4 you can, state your first and last name and
5 spell them both for the record.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: My first name is [REDACTED]
7 [REDACTED]. And the last name is [REDACTED], [REDACTED]
8 [REDACTED]. And my title is electronics
9 technician.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: So it's [REDACTED] without [REDACTED]
11 [REDACTED].

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Without [REDACTED].

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I apologize for
14 that. This is an official DOJ OIG
15 investigation into the death of Inmate Jeffrey
16 Epstein and the surrounding circumstances. You
17 are being asked to voluntarily provide answers
18 to our questions. Will you agree to a
19 voluntary interview?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Please review DOJ OIG Form
22 3-26226-2. The form states, U.S. Department of
23 Justice Office of the Inspector General
24 Warnings and Assurances to Employee Requested
25 to Provide Information on a Voluntary Basis.

1 You are being asked to provide information as
2 part of an investigation being conducted by the
3 Office of the Inspector General. This
4 investigation is being conducted pursuant to
5 the Inspector General Act of 1978 as amended.
6 This investigation pertains to job performance
7 failure and security failure. I'm writing that
8 in here.

9 [REDACTED]: And that doesn't mean
10 your job performance failure. That means
11 that's what the investigation is involving.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: This is a voluntary
13 interview. Accordingly, you do not have to
14 answer any questions. No disciplinary action
15 will be taken against you if you choose not to
16 answer any questions. Any statement you
17 furnish may be used as evidence in any future
18 criminal proceedings or agency disciplinary
19 proceedings or both. The waiver states I
20 understand the warnings and assurances stated
21 above and I am willing to make a statement and
22 answer questions. No promises or threats have
23 been made to me. And no pressure or coercion
24 of any kind has been used against me. Please
25 review the form. And if you understand it,

1 please sign where it says employee signature.
2 And print your name below it. Do you
3 understand the form?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I understand the
5 form.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Mr. [REDACTED] is
7 signing the form. All right. Special Agent
8 [REDACTED] is signing under line for signature of
9 the Office of Inspector General Special Agent.

10 [REDACTED]: And I'm Senior Special
11 Agent [REDACTED] and I am signing as a
12 signature of witness and I will write the date
13 as July 15, 2021, and the time is 2:19 p.m. at
14 the MCC New York.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Before starting the
16 interview I would like to place you under oath.
17 Mr. [REDACTED] can you please raise your right
18 hand? Do you swear to tell the truth and
19 nothing but the truth during this interview?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: During the interview if
22 you don't understand any of the questions I
23 ask, please ask me. Please let me know. I'll
24 rephrase it or I'll try to repeat it for you.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: I want to clarify. This
2 interview is specifically regarding Inmate
3 Jeffrey Epstein on August 9th and 10th and the
4 circumstances that surround it. What is your
5 current home address?

6 major you were -?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Electrical engineer.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. What did you do
9 prior to working for the BOP?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I worked at TSA. I was a
11 transportation security officer.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And do you have any
13 military service?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Four years. Active
15 duty from 2000 to 20014. United States Marine
16 Corps. I was a 2846 Regular Repairman.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: And was it an honorable
18 discharge?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: How long have you served
21 with the Federal Bureau of Prisons?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh since March 24, 2013 to
23 present.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: March 24, 2013. And you
25 were working at TSA directly before this?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: All right. What was your
3 Enter on Duty Date?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: To here is March 24, 2013
5 I believe.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: When did you graduate from
7 BOP training?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. That was
9 probably I don't know. Probably the following
10 March. So maybe March of 2014.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And were you with
12 the MCC the whole time?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh no. I started off in
14 Brooklyn as a correctional officer 2013 to
15 2015. And in 2015 to about 2017, I went to
16 Terre Haute. And that's when I became an
17 electronics technician.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Where did you go?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh Terre Haute, Indiana.
20 So Federal complex.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Another prison. And
23 that's where I became an electronics technician
24 and I stayed there for about a year and a half.
25 Then I moved back to New York City.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Did you come back to the
2 MCC?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: MCC New York as an
4 electronics technician.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: What year did you come
6 back to the MCC?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe four or five
8 years ago, so 2016 around that time - 2017.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure of the
11 dates.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: And you've been here at
13 the MCC since then?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I've been here since
15 then.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: And what was your - what's
17 your current position?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Electronics technician.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And what shift were
20 you on?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Normally. What's your
23 normal?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: My normal day is 6:00 to
25 2:00.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: 6:00 to 2:00?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Day watch.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

4 [REDACTED]: Just before we go on. As
5 an electronics technician, when did you
6 actually become that?

7 [REDACTED]: Um of 2015 - in March of
8 2015.

9 [REDACTED]: And does that not involve
10 like specialized training?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh yes. What the Bureau
12 gives you and my background because I did a -
13 before I started with the Bureau I had about 15
14 years in electronics with the military and
15 government contractor and in the private
16 sector. I did electronics for about 15 years
17 before.

18 [REDACTED]: Okay. So what training
19 did you receive specifically in that field?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: IN the Bureau? Or -?

21 [REDACTED]: Just overall.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

23 [REDACTED]: Since you said you only
24 did - you did college. I mean it doesn't have
25 to be specifically.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

2 [REDACTED]: I mean just like in
3 general.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Well I could troubleshoot
5 certain cores at component level like a
6 starter. Use hand tools.

7 [REDACTED]: So are you talking about
8 like on the job experience?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Everything's pretty
10 much on the job. And then in the Marine Corps
11 I went for training for about a year in
12 electronics.

13 [REDACTED]: Oh. So one electronic -
14 one year with the Marine Corps and then what
15 about with the BOP? Did they provide training?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Um it's pretty much on the
17 job.

18 [REDACTED]: Okay.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: I went to one telephone
20 school and that was about it. And a fire alarm
21 training.

22 [REDACTED]: Okay.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: But everything is pretty
24 much on the job.

25 [REDACTED]: Thank you.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Anything else on that?
2 [REDACTED]: Hm-mm.
3 MR. [REDACTED]: On August 9, 2019, were
4 you working?
5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. August 9th. That's
6 the Friday or the Saturday?
7 MR. [REDACTED]: Friday.
8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.
9 MR. [REDACTED]: And what was your position
10 on that day?
11 MR. [REDACTED]: Electronics Technician.
12 MR. [REDACTED]: What schedule were you on?
13 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe 6:00 to 2:00.
14 MR. [REDACTED]: 6:00 to 2:00 meaning
15 morning watch?
16 MR. [REDACTED]: 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
17 That's day watch. Or - yeah. Day watch.
18 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And what does your
19 position entail? What's your daily duties?
20 MR. [REDACTED]: I just well I make sure
21 anything in the building as far as
22 communication is working. So the first thing
23 you do is check the phones, radios, telephones,
24 radios I said, make sure the cameras are
25 recording if they're working. And what ese.

1 Anything communication-wise. If anybody's
2 having a problem, they usually get to me. Even
3 something as simple as a voice mail. They'll
4 say he my machine isn't working and I go take a
5 look at it. And where somebody's computer is
6 not working. So.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: And since you mentioned
8 also daily when you come on the job at 6:00
9 a.m. you check to see if the phone, cameras,
10 everything is working?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't have to check.
12 It's - there's no set standard or like okay you
13 should come in and check it. You just like
14 kind of look to see what's going on. You kind
15 of know what hasn't been working and what's
16 been working. You kind of make a checklist for
17 yourself. There's no set standard of what you
18 should do at that time. Now there is more stuff
19 that you do. Day to day. Where before there
20 was really no standard of okay you come in, you
21 start, and this is the first thing you've got
22 to go and do. And no. There was never
23 anything written down as far as what should be
24 done during your shift.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: When did that change?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: After Epstein pretty much.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

4 MR. LARGENT: So that day when you came
5 in, do you recall - I know it's been two years.
6 Do you recall doing a checklist? Trying to see
7 if everything was working.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: I usually - because I
9 don't get a radio in the morning. I usually -
10 first thing I do is I call for the elevator so
11 I know the phones are working.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: And then I go downstairs,
14 turn on the radio, listen to radio traffic so I
15 know the radios are working. And as far as the
16 camera goes, I have - that time I had like the
17 old system that had a (Indiscernible
18 *00:10:18). And make sure the um -. Because
19 it went to analog matrix. It's going to sound
20 a little confusing when I say analog matrix and
21 digital matrix because the old system we had
22 was a mixture of both. And kind of like the
23 new system too. It takes the old analog
24 cameras because we had a lot of old analog
25 cameras. It takes all of that. and then it

1 transfer it to make it digital so you can start
2 recording. And that's how you - we'll get a
3 video and look back for video. But everything
4 was analog. So I would have the analog system
5 in my office. And I would pretty much look and
6 see if that's working. If that was working I
7 know I was pretty much good.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Now the analog - if -
9 before it was converted over to digital.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm-hmm.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: How would the analog be
12 recorded?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Um the analog -. I wasn't
14 here -. Well it's -. It's not really - well
15 it is converted. It's used - well they use the
16 encoder to take the analog signal and make it a
17 digital signal and put it on a recorder.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And what was it
19 recorded on?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: The old hard drives. It
21 was two of them - two hard drives.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Was it on a server or -?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: It was pretty much like a
24 server. Yeah. It was two computers pretty
25 much.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And once it was
2 recorded, do you remember checking the cameras
3 that day? Seeing if it was working?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: I checked them later in
5 the day. I went up to the video room. Because
6 we were having - the thing about this whole
7 process was when I came here, the first thing I
8 saw was the video room. And the biggest thing
9 was all the equipment in that room was out of
10 date. It was old. It was - I came from
11 another institution. Like I said before where
12 everything kind of was modern but it was more
13 up to date than this. And so like the camera
14 system I had was maybe five to ten years old.
15 And when I came here, this one was over ten
16 years old and it was 365 a day. Like 24 hours
17 for the like the last 12 years. The system was
18 always on. And something as simple as shutting
19 down the time and change - because you got to
20 get recording times right. When the seasons
21 change, you would have to wait like a whole day
22 to shut down a recorder. It takes a whole day
23 or it to come back up after shutting it down.
24 And where I came from, that was not the
25 standard. Like it should be like an hour maybe

1 thirty minutes. Maybe even ten minutes if it's
2 a newer system. You shouldn't even have that
3 much down time as far as it recording. So one
4 of the first things I did when I came here was
5 I addressed that - the recorders being
6 upgraded. And -.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Who did you address that
8 with?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Um my Facility Manager. I
10 talked to upper management.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Who?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: But like during this whole
13 time I was doing -. I actually started the
14 camera project and that's why I was doing
15 overtime around this time. And we had people
16 come from other institutions. There was a
17 camera project to upgrade the cameras.
18 Everybody's fear was the actual cameras not the
19 recording software of the cameras. But I
20 stated over and over again the problem you're
21 going to have is the recorders. And we even
22 had the new recorders. They were in the
23 warehouse. We have them stockpiled. They was
24 ordered. But we were on the bottom of the list
25 as far as install. So even if we had the new

1 equipment, we weren't a priority to get
2 anything installed. So we had to wait until
3 something happened.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: And you said there was a -
5 you mentioned that to your Facilities Manager.
6 Who was that?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: When I first got here it
8 was [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp. *00:13:22)
9 and [REDACTED] was a facility manager. I
10 think we were in between facility managers when
11 this happened because we didn't really have
12 anybody.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: So there was no one during
14 August 9th and 10th there was nobody?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure if my new
16 facility manager took over at that time. But I
17 don't believe he was here. I think he came
18 after. He was here visiting but I don't think
19 he took the job.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: And you mentioned it to
21 upper management too?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Who in upper management
24 did you mention it to?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: My old AW - my Associate

1 Warden - [REDACTED] - he's no longer - he's returned
2 from eh Bureau.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Who is the old AW?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Associate Warden [REDACTED]
5 (Phonetic Sp. *00:13:53). That was his last
6 name. I forgot the first name. But I
7 mentioned to him and of course I talked to the
8 wardens about it.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Who was the warden at that
10 point?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Um it was [REDACTED]. And
12 before [REDACTED] it was [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp.
13 *00:14:04). Because they wanted me like to add
14 more cameras and do upgrades. And I'm like
15 well you've got to spend money because this
16 stuff is old. Like you can't just start adding
17 cameras to old systems. It's not going to
18 work.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: And you said there was as
20 project started around that time. Before
21 Epstein's death?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Before Epstein's death.
23 Yeah.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: How far before?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: I would have to look at

1 documents. I'm not too sure. Me and pretty
2 much - we have an engineering tech - [REDACTED]
3 [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp. *00:14:25) - when we
4 started. Because we had problems with the
5 recorders before where we submitted paperwork
6 to the regional office saying hey the
7 recorder's going down. It's end of life. What
8 can we do to upgrade. What's the steps. And
9 that's why we got funded all the money that we
10 got to start the project.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Before Epstein's death, do
12 you recall what exactly the project entailed?
13 What were you guys upgrading?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh we were trying to go
15 from analog cameras to IP cameras and trying to
16 upgrade the recorders. The recorders were like
17 the main thing. Upgrading the recording
18 system.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: But not the cameras
20 itself.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Not the cameras itself.
22 Because they can still work. And they still
23 work now.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Were majority of the
25 cameras working during that time?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Pretty much all the
2 cameras were working. Maybe we had maybe ten
3 probably that weren't working. But for the
4 majority all of the cameras were working. They
5 weren't being recorded - that was the problem.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: So the cameras were
7 working but it wasn't actually --

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Recording yeah.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: -- recording into the -.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Now think. I know it's
12 been two years. Do you recall which were the
13 ten cameras were that weren't working.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: I have no idea. I would
15 have to look at that list there.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: How about during that time
17 in the SHU. Were the cameras working?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. The cameras in SHU
19 were working. They were recording. Well they
20 were working. They weren't recoding. But they
21 were working.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: So what is that? Explain
23 that to me.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you like - if -
25 so like I said. We had an analog system and a

1 digital system. The old system would never
2 show me like the recorders failed. Like if
3 there was an error on the old software. Like I
4 would have to physically be in the room to say
5 hey. Because the room was upstairs on the
6 third floor. Which I didn't have access for.
7 You would have to go in the room and then you
8 go see like - because there's a redundant
9 drive. So you have like an A side and a B
10 side. And say if the A side isn't working, you
11 have one drive goes back. That's not a
12 problem. As soon as the second drive goes bad,
13 that's when you run into problems. And after
14 the second drive runs into problems, that's
15 when you stop recording. And once that
16 happens, you have to take the drive out, and we
17 have to scrounge around for old drives and see
18 if those will work. During that time I
19 actually - prior to that I actually purchased
20 maybe 24 drives to actually redo a whole - like
21 A or the B side. I was actually going to do
22 that.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Did you know at that point
24 that SHU cameras weren't recording?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: At that point towards the

1 end of the day I did. I believe I did know at
2 the end of the day.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: On August 9th during the
4 day.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. And I called --

6 MR. [REDACTED]: It wasn't the 10th.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: -- [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp.
8 *00:16:54). That's my point of contact. I
9 usually - any time I have a problem or
10 something's not working because I wasn't really
11 familiar with the whole system. I had like a
12 newer system. It kind of worked the same, as
13 far as the software side goes, as far like as
14 like the hardware, it was different. So I
15 would always have to call them for like tech
16 support. Like okay I'm having a problem today.
17 Can you document it? You know it builds our
18 case when I have to submit stuff to Regional
19 Office. Needless to saying that doesn't work.
20 That's not going to fly. And usually they help
21 me troubleshoot through the whole process of
22 what I should have to do - A, B, C, okay take
23 this drive out, put that drive in. And like
24 previously, probably six months before that, we
25 actually had a mother board - which was my main

1 computer - like go out. And I had to actually
2 replace that and they had to walk me through it
3 over the phone. I went to scrounge round parts
4 from another institution to get it working. I
5 know I'm giving you like a lot of stuff but -.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: So let's step back. So
7 you said the - it wasn't working. There was
8 possibly a work order already created. Right?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Possibly. Yes.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Who approved the work
11 order?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Um that has to go through
13 my general foreman or facility manager.
14 Whoever's in charge.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you think - do you
16 recall if this was before Epstein's death or
17 after?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: This was probably before
19 Epstein's death. It was a few work orders
20 before Epstein's death.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: And if these work orders -
22 . Are these work orders still maintained? A
23 copy anywhere?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: They should be in the
25 facilities folder somewhere.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Who would have access to
2 it now?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Um my facility manager,
4 she'll know where they're at. And the
5 engineering tech would pretty much. Well I'm
6 not saying engineering tech. but the facility
7 manager should know if those records are kept
8 or they're maintained.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: And when this work order
10 was created, this work order specifically
11 addressed the fact that the SHU cameras weren't
12 recording?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: No. No. All of the
14 cameras. It's not going to just be SHU. It's
15 going to be all the cameras.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: All the (Indiscernible
17 *00:18:28) cameras.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So at that point,
20 how come some cameras recorded? He said
21 there's redundancy. So there's either going to
22 --

23 MR. [REDACTED]: (Indiscernible *00:18:34)

24 MR. [REDACTED]: -- A drive or B drive.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: How come some recorded on
2 -?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Oh there's going to
4 be another problem too. Okay. So there's an A
5 side and a B side. And it's supposed to be
6 redundant but it's not redundant because it's
7 not really redundant when one side goes bad so
8 it just knows to record channels. Let's say
9 one through fifty is on this side. And 51
10 through 100 is on this side. Everything is
11 working. It doesn't work. Okay. I can take
12 over for this one because it's not working.
13 But as soon as that one goes, I can kind of
14 record over here. As soon as the second drive
15 goes, I have to just record what I'm recording.
16 I can't no longer help out the other drives.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So some channels
18 inside the SHU were recording on one drive?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Some were on the other
21 drive?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: So the ones - which drive
24 was the one that stopped recording altogether?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe it was the first

1 drive. So like the A side. Like the first.
2 Because the SHU cameras are on the first -
3 they're like the first 50-some cameras. Well
4 not the whole 50 but they're on that side. In
5 this string.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: But some were also on the
7 B side?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. On the B side.
9 Yeah. And that's just because they wired it
10 the way they wired it.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I'm going to show
12 you a map of the SHU. I know this is kind of
13 old. I'm not sure if this is still exactly how
14 it is.

15 [REDACTED]: You have the updated one
16 right in front of him.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Updated one. Okay. I
18 kind of wanted you to mark off where the
19 cameras were (Indiscernible *00:19:47) right
20 here on the --

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: -- big one. So let's -
23 I'll give you both.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh that's fine.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: See if - let's point it

1 over here.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: You recognize this? Where
4 this is?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. That's the Special
6 Housing Unit.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Is this -? How many
8 levels are there?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: There's an upper tier and
10 a bottom tier.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: The one you're looking at.
12 Is that the upper tier or lower tier?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: This is 9 South upper
14 tier. Yeah.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Upper tier. Can you point
16 out -? Do you -? I know you were -.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Approximately. I know
18 where all the cameras are. Okay. So at the
19 end of Visa (Phonetic Sp. *00:20:10) there's a
20 camera here.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: So which tier is that?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh G tier.

23 [REDACTED]: You said at the end of
24 each tier?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Each tier. There's one

1 camera looking this way - looking to the front
2 of the grill. This is the grill.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: So G tier. J tier.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: J Tier. L Tier. And M
5 should be.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: And that camera. What
7 would it have shown?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Um it would just show
9 whoever's coming on to the Tier to do rounds or
10 whatever they're doing on the Tier.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And as per your
12 recollection, on August 9th, were those cameras
13 actually working? Running?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: The cameras were working.
15 The recording no.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Where else in the
17 SHU are there cameras?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Also there's one in the
19 common area I think. Oh the - let me see.
20 Okay. So you have one over here like looking
21 at the common area over here. And then you
22 have another two like looking this way.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: So you're pointing to the
24 right of L Tier?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: To the right of L Tier.

2 And that would oversee -?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Like the common area this
4 way. Yeah.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: And would that also -?
6 What's over here?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: That's the officer's
8 station.

9 [REDACTED]: Use this and just have
10 him mark on there. So if you could, these
11 numbers don't match up but the tier - the
12 letters should be the same. So can you just -?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Here. So this is L Tier.

14 [REDACTED]: And can you just mark -?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: M Tier is the top tier.
16 So.

17 [REDACTED]: Can you mark maybe like a
18 circle and then point like an arrow toward the
19 direction that it would be recording?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

21 [REDACTED]: That it would be viewing.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh.

23 [REDACTED]: And this is on August 9th
24 and 10th we're talking about.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Just um. Okay. So.

1 [REDACTED]: So if you sit at the end
2 of each tier, just where they were actually -.
3 Just maybe you can put like a start or whatever
4 you decide to make for the camera. And then
5 like an arrow pointing the direction that they
6 would be recording.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So (Indiscernible
8 *00:21:53). Second one (Indiscernible
9 *00:21:55).

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Keeping the (Indiscernible
11 *00:21:55) by arrow pointing in the direction.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yep.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: The common area. This is
15 H. And I believe they're on top of this tier.
16 There's a camera over here looking this way.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Is that the upper tier or
18 lower tier?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh upper tier. There's a
20 camera on the upper tier - on the outside of
21 the upper tier looking that way.

22 [REDACTED]: Is that the one that's
23 like outside of 10 South?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: And -.

1 [REDACTED]: Do you mind on that
2 camera that you just said that's outside of 10
3 South. Can you just put 10 S there so we know
4 what you're talking about?"

5 MR. [REDACTED]: 10 S. Um before you get
6 to 10 South, there's actually - that's the
7 camera that you guys probably show the
8 recording. That stuff 46 door. (Phonetic Sp.
9 *00:22:49).

10 [REDACTED]: That's the one that you
11 just wrote 10 S next to?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh no. It's actually --

13 [REDACTED]: Oh.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: -- up the stair. There's
15 not one -.

16 [REDACTED]: So that's not that one.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. You can't put it on
18 the drawing because of where it's at.

19 [REDACTED]: Okay. So the one that
20 you just drew actually - where is that in real
21 - relation to 10 South?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Um that would be like the
23 top of H Tier I believe.

24 [REDACTED]: Okay. So can you maybe -
25 hm. How are we going to differentiate the fact

1 that you said a different one is 10 S. Uh the
2 one that we have - that's recording.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh.

4 [REDACTED]: Can you write --

5 MR. [REDACTED]: That's not 10 South then.

6 [REDACTED]: -- that?

7 [REDACTED]: That's not 10 South. I
8 crossed it out. So that's going to be - so
9 let's say H Tier number one. And this will be
10 H Tier number two. And this would be K Tier
11 number one. And I'm not sure where the second
12 one is. I don't think it's this one. I think
13 it's maybe this one on this side. That's what
14 I'm saying is K2. On this one. And this will
15 be M Tier number one. Looking that way. And
16 the - so this would be L Tier. One. Let me
17 get G on there.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Where would the officers'
19 station be?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the officers' station
21 will be next to M Tier like right in this area.

22 [REDACTED]: Can you put a box there.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe it's right here.

24 [REDACTED]: And put OS for Officers'
25 Station.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Was there a camera pointed
2 directly at the officers' station?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe there is
4 one out here in the common area.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: And this is on August 9th
6 and 10th. Right?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I'll just write uh
8 common area. And that's there. And for the 46
9 form? Right. Because it's not on the
10 (Indiscernible *00:25:09). I'll just write it
11 up here. Top of 10 South.

12 [REDACTED]: That's perfect. And
13 that's one you're going to mark as 10 S?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. Ten.

15 [REDACTED]: And that's the one and
16 only that we have that was actually working?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. That's the 46
18 though.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Now where would the
20 entrance be? Where inmates are moved in and
21 out of the SHU?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh that's the um - the
23 front entrance right here by the elevators.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Was there a camera there?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh no. There's only a

1 camera in the hallway. There was no cameras in
2 there when they're moving back and forth.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: If someone had to come in
4 and out of the SHU and control had to bus them,
5 was there a way control buses was --

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh yeah.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: -- coming in and out?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: The way that the doors
9 work at that time was - because we changed some
10 of the cameras. But before control pops the
11 door, they pretty much acknowledge that -.
12 Well before - especially with 9 South. 9 South
13 is different because the officer has the key on
14 their hip to - there's an inner door inside
15 here. And they won't even - well they're not
16 supposed to - crack the outer door without
17 somebody in SHU calling for that door. So I
18 can't go up to 10 South - or 9 South - right
19 now and say hey, let me get the 27 door.
20 Somebody from SHU has to call for the 27 door.
21 Because the inner door they have the key before
22 you come inside of 9 South.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: But there was no cameras
24 at that point?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: No. There was a live

1 feed. There's always a live feed.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: But nothing recording.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Nothing recording. I mean
4 the live feed goes to the control center. And
5 the control center officer sees who is at the
6 door. And they will pop the door.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Where would that camera
8 be?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Um that camera would be
10 ... in the hallway. I think that camera was
11 looking this way. So 9 Sally. I just labeled
12 it 9 Sally. And it just like looks down this
13 way.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you pointed out
15 there's one on each tier. That would make it
16 six cameras.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: There is one in the corner
19 --

20 MR. [REDACTED]: In the corner.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: -- of H tier?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah I believe so.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: That would make it seven.
24 There's one in the corner of -.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure about

1 that one. I think there's one in that corner.
2 But I know there's one definitely in the common
3 area. I know these two are definitely here.
4 That other one I'm not too sure about. Because
5 I don't remember seeing that.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. That's eight
7 cameras and then there's one in the Sally.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: And where's [REDACTED]
10 camera?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: It's up here.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So nine cameras
13 total that you're aware of. That should have
14 been -.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Um. Recording yes. All
16 the cameras are working now. Because you could
17 see.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Where could you see it
19 from?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the live matrix.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: On a matrix?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Who had access to the live
24 matrix?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Um whoever would have a

1 keypad. Not a lot of people have access to
2 that. So like SIS would have it - at the time.
3 Um control center would have it. And um
4 lieutenant's office don't have it. So it's
5 SIS, SIA, I have access, and that's pretty much
6 about it. And then our command center.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Is there something that
8 they would have to key in to see? Or is it
9 just running?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: No. You would have to key
11 in the cameras to see the actual camera call
12 up. You have to call up for them hit the
13 button and know what camera it is to call up.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Did anyone like the SIS
15 office or even the control have like the
16 cameras - you know like the feed just running
17 on their screen at all times?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. But they would have
19 to go through all the cameras. They usually
20 just - it just sits on one camera. It doesn't
21 keep scrolling through all the cameras.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Do you have
23 anything on that?

24 [REDACTED]: A lot. Yes. A lot.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

1 [REDACTED]: Um. and maybe you
2 answered some of this and maybe just being a
3 layman I didn't understand. But so going back
4 to the beginning. How many cameras are in the
5 MCC? Or were there in August 9th and 10th?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: I would have to look
7 through those right now.

8 [REDACTED]: Well approximately.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Old partner would always
10 tell me there's like 200. I probably think
11 like 150 if that.

12 [REDACTED]: All right.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even think it was
14 150.

15 [REDACTED]: And you said at the time
16 there were approximately ten that were not
17 working.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: What does that mean -
20 "not working"?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: It probably needs to get
22 if we're out of focus, just the video is
23 probably grainy - not the best video.

24 [REDACTED]: Okay.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

1 [REDACTED]: So they're on but they
2 were -. So differentiate for me because you
3 said that there are cameras in the SHU were
4 working but they weren't recording.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh-huh.

6 [REDACTED]: So what's the difference
7 between working and not working when you're
8 talking about that?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So if you have a
10 camera working, you can see the video, but it's
11 not recording. That's a totally different
12 problem.

13 [REDACTED]: Okay. So the ones that
14 you say that are not working. There's a
15 problem with what you're seeing.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

17 [REDACTED]: But they are recording or
18 they're not recording?

19 [REDACTED]: It could possibly they could
20 be recording or can't be recording.

21 [REDACTED]: All right. And then when
22 we just talked about the SHU. There's
23 approximately ten --

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Technically ten cameras.

25 [REDACTED]: -- cameras in the SHU?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

2 [REDACTED]: And the cameras in the
3 SHU. Only one out of ten was not - it was only
4 one was recording.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Only one. Yes. Because
6 it was on a different recorder at the time.
7 Yes.

8 [REDACTED]: And August 9th you said
9 that you knew some were not recording. Is that
10 what you were saying?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: I knew yeah something was
12 going on. I went up to the room and I was
13 about to change everything out and I didn't
14 have access. So I have to leave for the day.

15 [REDACTED]: And that is on August
16 9th?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: August 9th. The end of
18 the day.

19 [REDACTED]: And that was the very
20 first time you knew that they were not
21 recording?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Um. That day yes.

23 [REDACTED]: Okay.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Towards the end of the
25 day.

1 [REDACTED]: And did you know all of
2 them were not recording at that time? Aside
3 from the one?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: I didn't know exactly
5 wasn't what wasn't recording on the recorder.

6 I don't know exactly. Which ones weren't
7 working. I just knew that recorder was down.

8 [REDACTED]: And how did you know
9 that?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: As soon as I went in I saw
11 the drives. Because the drives usually they're
12 green on everything that's working and amber
13 like there's an emergency or something's wrong.
14 And I saw that there was a few ambers. So like
15 it wasn't recording. Then I called [REDACTED] at
16 the company. And they said I have to start
17 rebuilding. And what start rebuilding means is
18 I have to pull that hard drive out and start
19 putting fresh hard drives in. and then the
20 system knows like it put a new hard drive in it
21 starts to sync up and does this thing where it
22 starts to go through. It does it all of its
23 checks and starts recording. And I would
24 pretty much take a day.

25 [REDACTED]: That takes like a whole

1 day to do that?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: That yes. And I was at
3 the stage of pulling everything out. That was
4 probably going to take a couple days to pull
5 all the drives out and start recording again.

6 [REDACTED]: and did you make that
7 notification that the cameras in the SHU were
8 not recording to anyone?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe I told my
10 supervisor.

11 [REDACTED]: And who would have been
12 your supervisor then?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh - there was really -
14 like I don't think there was nobody here.
15 Because we were in like the middle of a project
16 and that was kind of chaos. So .

17 [REDACTED]: Okay. Did you - but at
18 that time though you knew basically all the
19 cameras were down but one.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: No id didn't know anything
21 about the SHU cameras.

22 [REDACTED]: No-no-no. I'm talking
23 about the SHU cameras specifically.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I didn't - I don't
25 know what's on the recorders. At that time I

1 didn't know what was on the recorders. I just
2 knew -.

3 [REDACTED]: All right. So when you
4 went in, you knew that some recorders - some
5 cameras weren't recording and you didn't know
6 which ones.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Ones yeah.

8 [REDACTED]: All right. So about how
9 many were amber or telling you that they
10 weren't recording?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: That was like half of
12 them. So I'll say 50 to 60 cameras are
13 probably not recording.

14 [REDACTED]: So there were a ton in
15 that -.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm-hmm. In that slot that
17 weren't working.

18 [REDACTED]: And is there anything
19 that - was that - that just all happened on
20 that one day on August 9th?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: It happened before.
22 Multiple times before.

23 [REDACTED]: It had happened before.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Before. Yes.

25 [REDACTED]: So you have actually

1 troubleshoot it in the past?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Before yes. Same
3 problem. I have to rebuild drives and I mean
4 hey this isn't working. I've got to rebuild
5 the drive. There's really nothing I can do. I
6 just put the drive in and wait.

7 [REDACTED]: Okay.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Make sure it comes back
9 up.

10 [REDACTED]: So this was the other day
11 you said so around like 2:00 p.m. you're
12 thinking?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Um. 1:00 something.

14 [REDACTED]: One something?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: one something yeah.

16 [REDACTED]: All right. And then
17 being that it happened before, was there
18 anything that you're supposed to do if like -
19 hey I've got to notify like the captain -.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: There was no -. At my old
21 job, I'm not trying to throw anybody under the
22 bus but at my old job, if anything wasn't
23 working and I was the contact, I couldn't leave
24 the jail. Like if the fence - because we had a
25 fence system - or cameras aren't recording. I

1 would have to fix - stay there until okay, I
2 need a part. This is what we're doing. Send
3 notification. This place is run a lot
4 differently. And I've said stuff from before.
5 And my old supervisor but just like oh go home
6 [REDACTED], don't worry about it. And I'm like
7 well if I go home, nobody's going to fix it.
8 And at that time I was the only person that
9 knew what was going on. It was bad practice
10 when I got to this jail.

11 [REDACTED]: So did someone tell you
12 not to fix it and to go home on August 9th?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I'm not too sure. I
14 believe so. I'm not going to say yes or no
15 because I don't really remember that day too
16 much.

17 [REDACTED]: Were you -?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: But I did make a
19 notification that it wasn't working.

20 [REDACTED]: To who?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: And I was going to be back
22 the next day because I was doing overtime.

23 [REDACTED]: All right. So you were
24 coming back on August 10th?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. The next morning.

1 because I came at 6:00 a.m. the next morning to
2 do overtime.

3 [REDACTED]: So and is that when you
4 were planning to fix it?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Fix it yes.

6 [REDACTED]: So you were going to
7 start the next day and fix -.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: And I had the drive too at
9 that time. I do remember that.

10 [REDACTED]: And you said you made the
11 notification. Who did you make the
12 notification to?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: To my supervisor. I don't
14 know exactly which supervisor it was but I know
15 I made a notification.

16 [REDACTED]: So you're positive you
17 made it?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: And how would that
20 notification have been made?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Probably verbally.

22 [REDACTED]: Okay.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Because it's not something
24 I would broadcast over a radio or like go on a
25 phone. I would like call you in a room because

1 I don't want anybody to know that.

2 [REDACTED]: Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Can't record video.

4 That's not a good thing.

5 [REDACTED]: And I apologize. I think
6 Lance asked this question and I'm not exactly
7 sure what you meant by this. But were you
8 supposed to advise somebody like the captain or
9 the warden that the cameras were down?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh you -. Because the way
11 the recorders work, the cameras are the
12 captain's property. So you have to notify the
13 captain. Hey, the cameras aren't recording.

14 [REDACTED]: And was that your job to
15 notify him?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I notify my
17 supervisor and they notify the captain. If I
18 see the captain, I'll say something to him or
19 I'll tell the lieutenants. But other than that
20 I don't say anything about cameras being down.

21 [REDACTED]: Okay. So as far - so
22 you're positive you did notify your supervisor?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I notified somebody.
24 Because they have to know because I told them I
25 was going to come back the next day.

1 [REDACTED]: You just don't know who
2 it was.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure now. I
4 don't want to say -.

5 [REDACTED]: Is there ? How can we
6 find out who would have been your supervisor at
7 that time?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: It's documented somewhere.
9 Whoever my supervisor at the time.

10 [REDACTED]: All right. So that
11 person would have then been responsible to
12 notify someone such as the captain --

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Captain.

14 [REDACTED]: -- or the warden?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

16 [REDACTED]: Because if the captain
17 was out, or no he did work on the 9th. Right?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm-hmm.

19 [REDACTED]: So that means that around
20 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m., if you notified your
21 supervisor --

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Supervisor.

23 [REDACTED]: -- that supervisor should
24 have then notified the captain.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. And then I got

1 approved for overtime for the next day. So
2 somebody knew I was coming back.

3 [REDACTED]: Oh and is that
4 specifically why you were approved for
5 overtime?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh no I was coming back to
7 do the project. But they knew I had the drive
8 because I was going back and forth with my
9 computer service guy. Because he knows more
10 about hard drives than I do. So he was - we're
11 getting parts in. Why don't I just do this and
12 I remember that part of the day.

13 [REDACTED]: Now what would cause all
14 of those cameras to actually fail like that?
15 The recorders.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the recording. The
17 system was old. And it needed to be upgraded.
18 It was very old.

19 [REDACTED]: Was it - could it have
20 anything to do with people tampering with the -
21 -

22 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

23 [REDACTED]: -- system?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: They can't tamper. You
25 have to go in a room it's behind a lock - key -

1 a photo (Indiscernible *00:35:34) key in the
2 door.

3 [REDACTED]: So there's no reasons to
4 believe --

5 MR. [REDACTED]: There's two doors too.

6 [REDACTED]: -- that those camera.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Because you go thought the
8 front door and then there's a secondary door to
9 go in the room.

10 [REDACTED]: All right. So you said
11 the cameras are working and they're in this
12 room. Is anyone actually in that room looking
13 at the cameras?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: They used to be and that's
15 an SIS tech. I think maybe Taye was there as
16 the SIS tech for that day.

17 [REDACTED]: Now when you're - so
18 would he have known that they weren't
19 recording?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: No. um his job is pretty
21 much to look at like the live feed and um maybe
22 look at the recording. But they do stuff a
23 little bit different here so I'm not too sure
24 exactly what his function was.

25 [REDACTED]: Now would they also have

1 seen this amber -?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: No. they don't go back in
3 the room.

4 [REDACTED]: So there's a different
5 room?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. It's a different
7 room altogether. They just look at the
8 monitors in the room at the time.

9 [REDACTED]: So by looking at the
10 monitor, would they be able to have known that
11 the cameras were down?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No. As far as recording,
13 no. they would just have the live feed.

14 [REDACTED]: Okay.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: And everything looks good.

16 [REDACTED]: So for them they would
17 have no idea that there was actually --

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh yeah a problem.

19 [REDACTED]: -- no SHU cameras --

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

21 [REDACTED]: -- weren't recording?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: And then the software too.
23 Even if you look at the software at the time,
24 it wasn't even telling you that there was a
25 problem . You would think it was actually

1 working.

2 [REDACTED]: Right. So to your
3 knowledge the only people that definitively
4 knew that the cameras were down were you and
5 your supervisor?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: The supervisor. Yes.

7 [REDACTED]: And do you know if your
8 supervisor actually made the notification to
9 anyone else?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't recall. I don't
11 know who you talk to.

12 [REDACTED]: After the fact did you
13 ever find out if he did or didn't?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't remember. There
15 was a lot going on.

16 [REDACTED]: Were you ever questioned
17 with regard to what happened with the cameras?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: Who questioned you?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Um oh the next day because
21 I was here. I had to talk to the warden about
22 what was going on with the cameras.

23 [REDACTED]: And do you remember what
24 -?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: And then the FBI too. The

1 next day.

2 [REDACTED]: Okay. And otherwise he
3 was not present for that?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: The next day?

5 [REDACTED]: Yeah.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: No. There was nobody
7 here.

8 [REDACTED]: So you have spoken to
9 both the warden as well as the FBI with regard
10 to the camera situation?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: The next day. Yes I did.
12 What was going on.

13 [REDACTED]: And did you -?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: And then I had to get in
15 contact with the vendor. And they had to
16 explain stuff to the FBI too. Because what I
17 was saying wasn't making any sense.

18 [REDACTED]: They weren't following
19 what you were telling them?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Because they just
21 sent like a regular field officer. They didn't
22 send anybody technical. So what I was saying
23 was kind of just a little bit overboard. And
24 dry.

25 [REDACTED]: And possibly when you

1 were talking and I wasn't - maybe all these
2 questions were answered but I'm not sure.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

4 [REDACTED]: So that's why I'm trying
5 to put it into layman's terms. All right. So
6 it -. You said it happened before. Do you
7 know if it ever happened before whereas all but
8 one camera in the SHU went down?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even know what
10 would have went down.

11 [REDACTED]: No?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: It would have been a whole
13 bunch of cameras not recording.

14 [REDACTED]: At the time that you knew
15 that the approximately 50 to potentially 75
16 cameras weren't working, did you know what
17 cameras weren't' working? Or just that a lot
18 of cameras weren't working?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Just a lot of cameras
20 weren't. And I wasn't going to sit there and
21 try to figure out what's -.

22 [REDACTED]: Sure.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

24 [REDACTED]: So when you're making
25 that notification to your supervisor, you're

1 just saying like hey half the cameras are down?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Was down. Yeah. You've
3 got to decide what you're going to do.

4 [REDACTED]: Okay. And they at that
5 time said don't worry about it. Go home. You
6 can fix it tomorrow?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: That was the standard
8 practice. So I believe it went along those
9 lines.

10 [REDACTED]: Okay.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

12 [REDACTED]: And you said at another
13 institution that would have never -.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: That would never fly. No.
15 No. Can't have that. You've got to fix it.
16 If it's not working then you have to stay.

17 [REDACTED]: No do you believe that
18 you should have had to have stayed?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe so.

20 [REDACTED]: And did you request to
21 stay to fix it?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Um. I think I did but I
23 think I pretty much made a notification but
24 since I was going to be back the next day, it
25 didn't make sense for me to stay. Because

1 there was really nothing I could fix that day
2 anyway. Even if - and I think I - before I
3 left the two drives that were bad, I started
4 replacing them. I think I might have taken
5 them out to let them start rebuilding.

6 [REDACTED]: Okay. So was there
7 anyone in the SHU that could have known that
8 those cameras were down?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

10 [REDACTED]: No?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Because I don't talk to
12 anybody in custody as far as the cameras go
13 out. That's why I go directly to my
14 supervisor.

15 [REDACTED]: So the fact that - you
16 know, Epstein, you're most notorious --

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm-hmm.

18 [REDACTED]: -- inmate at that time -
19 is you know dies the night that the cameras are
20 down. Is there any - reasonably if there's any
21 kind of - is there any suspicion surrounding
22 the circumstances?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: No. It was just whatever
24 happened - happened. It was really no
25 tampering with the devices or somebody turned

1 off the power or -. No.

2 [REDACTED]: So to you it's just
3 completely coincidental?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Just coincidental.

5 [REDACTED]: All right. And again you
6 said that no one could have tampered with those
7 cameras to made them go down.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

9 [REDACTED]: That's great. But no one
10 could have.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: No one could have. No.

12 [REDACTED]: Okay. All right.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: And because - another
14 thing about the cameras too they're - the way
15 the SHU cameras are they're - the power supply
16 is for the old analog cameras are in a - one of
17 my closets. You would have to go in there,
18 kill the power, and then go into mess with the
19 recorder. Like it's too much stuff to try to -
20 one person to think about trying to tamper with
21 it. It's just a lot.

22 [REDACTED]: Okay.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: And like as soon as I put
24 in the new recorders, all the cameras came up.
25 So the cameras weren't tampered with at all.

1 [REDACTED]: Right. The cameras
2 themselves. But what about that room that you
3 said that's where you fix them at. Who had
4 access to that room?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: I would have -. It would
6 be SIS because that was their room. At that
7 time, I really didn't have access. And that
8 was part of the problem too. Because they were
9 leaving for the day and I didn't have access
10 to the room. I didn't have a key at that time
11 to go in the room.

12 [REDACTED]: Okay. So.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Because it's their
14 property room also.

15 [REDACTED]: But you went in to be
16 able to see that they weren't recording.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. Because somebody
18 was in the room. SIS was upstairs. Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: So SIS allowed you in the
20 room?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

22 [REDACTED]: Were they in the room at
23 the time?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Nah. I usually just go in
25 the back room by myself. I don't -.

1 [REDACTED]: And then you just ask
2 them if they can go in? Or is it - what do you
3 mean? There's like an SIS office and then
4 there's a room within the SIS office.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Next office. Yeah. They
6 have the main room but then it has a video room
7 and behind the video room, that's where the
8 recorders are.

9 [REDACTED]: Okay. So is that room
10 that you're talking about where the recorders
11 are - is that also secured?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

13 [REDACTED]: Or is it just -?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: It's secured. Yes.

15 [REDACTED]: So there's the SIS room
16 that's secured. And then there's also the TV
17 monitor room that's also secured?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: Where the recordings? So
20 did you have access to the -? Who would have
21 had access I guess to the - where the
22 recordings would have been stored?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: I guess anybody in SIS
24 with a key for SIS.

25 [REDACTED]: But only SIS?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Only SIS.

2 [REDACTED]: All right. Is there any
3 reason to believe anyone in SIS could have
4 manipulated those - that system? Or taken the
5 cameras?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: You'd have to know what
7 you're doing and I would kind of know if
8 somebody messed with it. It's not really
9 something you go in there and start
10 disconnecting. Like the only way to really do
11 anything in that room is to start disconnecting
12 stuff. And it's a spaghetti mess.

13 [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Starting to disconnect the
15 stuff is not going to - it's going to be
16 tampered with you'll see somebody did
17 something.

18 [REDACTED]: Is there anyone other
19 than SIS who could have gotten into there?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't believe so. No.

21 [REDACTED]: Does the captain, AWs,
22 and the warden have access to that room?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: they don't probably even
24 know anything that goes on in that room. The
25 only time I will tell them is like to do

1 maintenance. I'll complain and show them the
2 room. Hey, you've got to clean this up or -.

3 [REDACTED]: But do they have access?
4 Can they get into the room?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh they would have to get
6 24 keys from SIS or somebody would have to give
7 them access to get into that room.

8 [REDACTED]: But only SIS has it?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: From what I know, yes.

10 [REDACTED]: Okay.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Only SIS can get in that
12 room.

13 [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Why did you happen to go
15 in that room that day?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. I just make
17 rounds and I do stuff. Somebody said something
18 to me or I was thinking about it. Because I
19 think I ordered the drive and I just wanted to
20 see where I was at to see what I was going to
21 get started on. And plus we were doing a
22 camera project, so I was just trying to get a
23 lot of things like organized and see where we
24 were at. And what I was actually going to do.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: So I have to ask as part

1 of it. Did you happen to stop doing upgrade
2 work on it, unplug, or take down the
3 redundancy, or anything that worked --

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: -- that happened to stop
6 working at that point?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I just - it - because
8 we were having problems from before. And the
9 problem just happened again. Like just
10 coincidence.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: And nothing to do with the
12 work you were doing on it?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: No. Because I didn't
14 touch the recorders.

15 [REDACTED]: So not just the work you
16 were doing on it. Did anything you do cause
17 the cameras to go down?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: No. Not that day. No.

19 [REDACTED]: Okay. In the past it had
20 though?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: If I'm messing with a
22 recorder, it can throw some stuff off. Or if
23 I'm - yeah - moving drives around - that's why
24 I don't have to notify. Hey, the drives are
25 back. Because if I start moving stuff, I don't

1 know what's going to go down or not work or -.

2 Yeah.

3 [REDACTED]: Okay.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: The system is very old.

5 [REDACTED]: But that day on August
6 9th when all the SHU cameras went down, that
7 had nothing to do with you? It was just
8 coincidental that they went down.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: As far as the recording,
10 yes.

11 [REDACTED]: Okay. So when you
12 specified as far as the recording, can you tell
13 me why you said that? Is there anything else?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Because people believe
15 that when cameras don't work, like the camera's
16 not working. The camera could be throwing out
17 video because the live feed - like I said -
18 goes to the control center. They see the live
19 video when they're popping the door. So
20 there's live video going - getting fed. It's
21 just the digital side of it. The recording
22 side is not working.

23 [REDACTED]: Okay.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Was there a camera towards
25 the back room?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: What back room?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Is there a camera in the
3 SIS office?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh no. Now there is.
5 There's a camera going towards SIS. But before
6 there was no camera. It would just be the
7 third floor - 3 Sally is someone was going in
8 that general direction. But you can't even
9 make out who's going by there - the video room.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Was anybody to know who
11 went in and out of that room?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: There's a key entry or -?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

15 [REDACTED]: Two follow-up questions.
16 One, has this probable been rectified?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

18 [REDACTED]: And when was that
19 rectified?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh whenever they came and
21 did a walkaround. We added cameras slight to
22 the SIS room. Of course we upgraded our
23 recorders but there's cameras to see who goes
24 in that general area. Like if you go in the
25 room, you'll see who's going in the recording

1 room.

2 [REDACTED]: And was that like a year
3 or two ago? Or how long after the August 9th
4 incident?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: That's probably like a
6 year after that. because we were doing a lot
7 of other stuff before that.

8 [REDACTED]: So in sometime in like
9 2020 have the cameras gone down since then?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm.

11 [REDACTED]: And when I say the
12 cameras I mean the recordings.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: When I have to do
14 maintenance. I have to notify somebody like
15 the cameras are going to go down. They make
16 sure the jail is locked down and -.

17 [REDACTED]: Only intentionally.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

19 [REDACTED]: They've never gone down -
20 .

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh. We've had um - uh -
22 see I can't really say that because we've had
23 issues because we're putting in IP cameras.
24 Where - the IP cameras are like little
25 computers. And they overload the system

1 sometimes when the software isn't right. So it
2 bogs down the system. And we've had problems
3 where the recording stops, but we have a
4 redundant recorder but not all the cameras
5 would go down per se.

6 [REDACTED]: Okay.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: And the reason I'm saying
8 that also is because a lot of the cameras -
9 it's like a mix and match of old cameras and
10 new cameras - analog cameras and like more
11 computer-based cameras - IP cameras. So right
12 now when the system fails the old analog
13 cameras for the most part are going to work.
14 The problems are going to be the newer cameras
15 on the tiers. The older cameras would always
16 pretty much be recording. If we ever had an
17 issue.

18 [REDACTED]: Okay.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: And we've had a few
20 issues. Yes. But they're usually with the
21 newer cameras not with the older ones.

22 [REDACTED]: Interesting. Okay. And
23 as far as - just to make sure we are clear -
24 which of the cameras in the SHU actually were
25 recording on -.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the 46-door camera.

2 [REDACTED]: And that's the one
3 outside of 10 South?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. That's - and the
5 only reason I know that is because the first
6 day they came, they were looking for video.
7 There's was no video. And they were like
8 you've got to find video.

9 [REDACTED]: Who is "they"?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Um FBI.

11 [REDACTED]: Okay.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: And then um so I stayed
13 later the day and the night and I was trying to
14 look to see what was recording. And that's
15 when I figured out that the 46-door was
16 actually recording on 10 South.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: The 9th or the 10th?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Um.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: The 10th is the day that
20 he was found.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: I think it was in that
22 morning the next day. When I came in first
23 thing in the morning.

24 [REDACTED]: So on Saturday it looks
25 like.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Saturday. Yeah.

2 [REDACTED]: Now -.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Because I had to think
4 about what was going on. And also during that
5 day they made me move over - the cameras that
6 were recording - put them on different
7 recorders. It was like a mess.

8 [REDACTED]: Now were there any
9 cameras, recordings, or hard drives or anything
10 that were sent to try to have the recordings
11 recovered?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh well the whole thing
13 with everything not recording that day was the
14 way the system works. And we want to woke the
15 vendor and FBI because they had to talk to -
16 the way the system works is if the two drives
17 are bad it's not going to start recording
18 video. It's not going to go on a different
19 drive or you're going to see bits and pieces of
20 video from that day. You might see old video.
21 But as far as new video from that day whenever
22 it went back you're not going to see any video.

23 [REDACTED]: So we had received
24 information saying that video was attempted to
25 be recovered by the FBI.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

2 [REDACTED]: What is meant by that?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: They've got a list that
4 they could probably do but yeah nothing.

5 [REDACTED]: But did they obtain
6 anything? Any hard drives or -?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: They took all the hard
8 drives. They took everything. They took the
9 whole recorder - the whole recoding system. He
10 took the next day.

11 [REDACTED]: But there's no way it was
12 recorded - it was -. So if they say it was
13 corrupt and it was unable to be retrieved, what
14 does that mean in layman's terms?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: There's no video. It's
16 probably garbage. Just yeah.

17 [REDACTED]: But there's nothing.
18 Does that just mean that there's no recording?
19 Why would they use the word "corrupt"?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Because it's pretty much -
21 you know computer is like one to zero. So
22 probably when they finally get to that they
23 couldn't retrieve anything. Nothing like you
24 could see or make tangible. Like no real
25 video.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: See that's two different
2 things. Right? It's not like they didn't
3 retrieve anything. That just means they found
4 the file. They just couldn't open it.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: They can't see it. Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: That means something
7 recorded.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Not necessarily. It
9 could be garbage. Garbage can record anything
10 that's a good thing what is not a good thing.
11 This (Indiscernible *00:48:51) was recording.
12 That's why I say that when a camera is and or
13 good, like I can have a camera that just
14 looking at this and you're saying okay it's
15 good but it's not looking at the whole room.
16 This is nothing. This is garbage. It doesn't.
17 The camera just knows it's working until I fix
18 it and then it records the whole room. Then
19 you know it's working.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: When you went in on the
21 10th to take a look at the video, did you
22 actually see the recording files? Or did you
23 not see any files at all?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: I just know the drives
25 were bad. And I think I tried to -. Yeah

1 because they're like ex'd out when they're not
2 working. So you're not going to see any
3 recording files. You'll see the live video but
4 you won't see anything recording.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: So you use the software?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: To try to open the files.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: But you didn't actually go
10 in and try to find the actual base files for
11 the recording from that night?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: So was the cameras
15 connected to a network?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Who had access to the
18 network?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Mainly whoever had a
20 password to look at the Nice Vision. Usually I
21 give out the passwords or a computer services.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: At that point who had
23 access?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh um. I think most of
25 the lieutenants had access. The warden had

1 access. SIS had access. I had access. And I
2 believe computer services. And maybe a few
3 staff members here and there. But they just
4 looking at live video - nothing recorded or
5 (Indiscernible *00:50:08) video.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: SO that was my next
7 question. Could they have done anything when
8 they logged in to manipulate the -?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: No. You can't stop the -.
10 The newer system you can. The old system you
11 pretty much have to go in there and manually do
12 it. Like you can't just -. You would have to
13 go on the recorders and -. Yeah. I don't
14 think anybody here knew - knows how to do that.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Did anyone outside the
16 institution have access? Like because it was
17 on the network, does like someone at the
18 central office or anyone have access to or no?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: From what they told me
20 there's no back doors to it. So.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: So it was a close network.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Closed. Yeah. Closed.
23 Yeah. In house thing.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you know if any
25 situations about came up in the past where it

1 required that someone in the central office
2 needed to log in to see the video? And they
3 were able to do it remotely?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Nah. I don't know if the
5 old system. The new system you can do that.
6 The old system. I'm not sure. I don't believe
7 anybody from eh region or anybody saw video on
8 the whole system.

9 [REDACTED]: As far as when you left
10 on August 9th. You knew that a number of
11 cameras were down. When you came back on
12 August 10th, do you know if it was the same
13 cameras that were down?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. It was the same area
15 cameras that were down. It's the same
16 recorder. Just -.

17 [REDACTED]: So there weren't
18 additional cameras that were down?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: No. That would go down
20 and come back up. No.

21 [REDACTED]: All right. So when you
22 left on August 9th, it stopped recording. No
23 additional cameras went down --

24 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

25 [REDACTED]: -- between August 9th and

1 August 10th when you returned.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

3 [REDACTED]: All right. And did you -
4 do you know if anyone had any access to those
5 cameras from 6:00 a.m. to let's say 10:00 a.m.
6 on August 10th?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Well I left probably 2:00
8 that afternoon. I don't believe there's
9 anybody that would have to go in that room to
10 do anything.

11 [REDACTED]: Were you in that room
12 almost the whole time?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

14 [REDACTED]: Do you know of anybody
15 else that went into that room?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Um just the SIS tech that
17 was there. But he doesn't go in the back room.
18 He usually just goes in the front room.

19 [REDACTED]: Okay.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: And when he leaves that's
21 pretty much it. I don't - there's no reason
22 for anybody to go in the back room.

23 [REDACTED]: All right. So -.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: It's their evidence room
25 too so they kind of don't listen to anybody -

1 just walk back there.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: After the incident were
3 you the first person back there?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Um yeah. I believe so
5 yes. And nothing looked tampered with. It all
6 looked like they had left it - it looked the
7 same way.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: And it's SIS tech that was
9 back there. His name is [REDACTED]?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED]. Yeah. I believe
11 it's [REDACTED].

12 [REDACTED]: Can you spell that?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED]. He's retired now.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh, okay.

15 [REDACTED]: [REDACTED]?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: The only camera that you
18 said that was over that door in the SHU when
19 you viewed it. Was it grainy or what it a good
20 view?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Eh. I look at the cameras
22 enough I can make out something. Most people
23 say it was grainy. But you can make out enough
24 to see if anything was going on.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I've got nothing

1 more on that line.

2 [REDACTED]: Nope. (Indiscernible

3 *00:52:52)

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Now on July 23rd.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: July 23rd. That's before?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: No sorry. I take it back.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

8 [REDACTED]: Talk about the phones

9 now.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. As part of your

11 job.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Right. Do you maintain

14 the phones in the system?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes I do. The phone

16 switch or the PBX. I maintain it.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: As part - do you recall

18 after this incident. What's the = was a

19 preservation done off the phone recordings in

20 the -?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe my warned at the

22 time asked me to look up to see who um was

23 making phone calls or who possibly in SHU was

24 getting phone calls that night. And I did find

25 something.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: This is Warden [REDACTED]?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED]. Yes.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: And you did find
4 something?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: What did you find?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: It was a phone call on the
8 tier that they believe Epstein was taking a
9 shower. Because he - I guess he got a shower
10 and somebody gave him a phone call. I believe
11 they found the phone call. That's what I
12 believe. I'm not too sure who did what but.
13 There was a phone call made.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Did you provide a copy of
15 that over?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: -- to the DOJ?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I have it to my
19 actual supervisor. The warden.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Was that a recorded call?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: No. it was just a log to
22 see how long the call was. Like when the call
23 starts and when it ends. There's no recording.
24 It's a legal call. So legal calls are
25 protected. You can't give you know out the

1 legal call information.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. MR. [REDACTED]: But
3 you see who dialed it and how long that call
4 was.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Now is every phone in the
6 facility recorded? Other than legal calls?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the inmate phones are
8 recorded. Yes.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: What about from CO to CO?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: No. that's not recorded.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: None of the - let's just
12 say an inmate has access - can get to the CO
13 phone. If they make a phone call.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Well you try not to give
15 them access to it.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: But they're never recorded
17 for any reason?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Nah.

19 [REDACTED]: So when the SHU is
20 talking with control or control is talking with
21 R&D. Those calls aren't recorded.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: No. there's just a log to
23 see how long the call was - the duration - but
24 that's pretty much it. What phone picked up
25 and what phone hung up or -.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Are those logs maintained?
2 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.
3 MR. [REDACTED]: For how long?
4 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh I just had this a
5 little while ago. Probably like a month.
6 MR. [REDACTED]: That's all it is?
7 MR. [REDACTED]: That's all it is. Yeah.
8 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall if that was
9 ever -? A copy of all the logs for that day?
10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe I gave a
11 copy to somebody. Somebody with access. So
12 I'm pretty sure I gave them call logs on
13 everything.
14 MR. [REDACTED]: So this is back then?
15 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I gave logs - call
16 logs.
17 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall if it was
18 all of August 9th and 10th? Or it was just for
19 -?
20 MR. [REDACTED]: It was probably a few
21 days.
22 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.
23 [REDACTED]: Do you still maintain
24 those since you gave them?
25 MR. [REDACTED]: No I just gave them. No

1 reason for me to hold on to them.

2 [REDACTED]: So you physically gave it
3 to them as opposed to via email or anything?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Nah. Um. Did I scan
5 them? I might have emailed them. I'm not too
6 sure.

7 [REDACTED]: Can you do us a favor?
8 When you're done can you just check your outbox
9 around those dates --

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Okay.

11 [REDACTED]: -- and see if you have
12 those logged?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: You don't recall who you
15 provided it to? Right?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: SIS or whoever's in charge
17 of SIS. They were asking me for phone logs.

18 [REDACTED]: All right. So SIS would
19 have them then?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

21 [REDACTED]: Okay.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: If you want it's on that
23 line.

24 [REDACTED]: No. That's - so no.
25 Only inmate calls are recorded. No staff

1 member calls.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: No staff member calls are
3 recorded.

4 [REDACTED]: And that's throughout the
5 entire institution.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

7 [REDACTED]: Okay. What about coming
8 in and out of the institution. Are they
9 recorded?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: What? What do you mean?

11 [REDACTED]: So if like R&D is
12 speaking with the court or Marshals. Would
13 they be recording?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: No. that's not recorded.
15 No.

16 [REDACTED]: So nothing coming in and
17 out.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: No. It's just when the
19 inmates are talking on the phone. Their phone
20 calls are recorded. Because they get that
21 little warning to say you know you're being
22 monitored. But that's about it.

23 [REDACTED]: and I thought when I
24 called BOP facilities that it did say that this
25 line is being recorded. Is that not the case?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

2 [REDACTED]: Okay.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. Sometimes they just
4 throw that in there to -. But it's not the
5 case.

6 [REDACTED]: Okay. It's shame but.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Anything else on that
10 topic? I'm going to move on.

11 [REDACTED]: No.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: So that was August 9th.
13 You left that day what time?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Um maybe the end of my
15 shift 2:00 or maybe like an hour later.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: 2:00 p.m.?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. 2:00 p.m. Or maybe
18 3:00 p.m.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: When did you come back on
20 shift?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: 6:00 a.m. in the morning.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: On August 10th?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: And what do you recall
25 happened on August 10th?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: As soon as I came to the
2 front door, I heard a body alarm on 10 South.
3 And then I ran up to the body alarm on 10
4 South. I mean 9 South.

5 [REDACTED]: 10 South?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: I mean 9 South.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: And who hit the body
8 alarm?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. I guess the
10 officer whoever's on 10 - uh 9 South.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: And when you got up there
12 what did you see?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. I saw -
14 what did you see? We were all just -. I don't
15 know. What did I see...? I got up there.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Let's start off then. Who
17 was up there when you got up there?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Uh when I got up
19 there. I got on the elevator with -. Who did
20 I get on the elevator with ...? I think [REDACTED]
21 [REDACTED] from food service was there. [REDACTED] -
22 Officer [REDACTED] was there. And [REDACTED]. And I
23 think the lieutenant at that time was - [REDACTED]
24 when I got upstairs. Those are the
25 (Indiscernible *00:57:54) I remember. And then

1 the officers that were on the unit were Officer
2 Thomas and Officer MS. NOEL:. And then I just
3 remember us saying we needed to get the
4 stretcher from the hallway. And an AD machine.
5 And then they took him and put him on the
6 stretcher. And I think after a little while -
7 the medical PA - came upstairs. And then
8 started working on him. And then me and [REDACTED]
9 were still doing chest compressions. We took
10 him to the second floor until the ambulance
11 came.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. I'm going to step
13 back a little bit.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: So when the body alarm
16 went off, right. And you were in the elevator
17 with [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and -

18 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and I think
19 [REDACTED].

20 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED]. When you got
21 up there, who was up there?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: I think lieutenant [REDACTED] I
23 think was upstairs already. Maybe not. And
24 then I know MS. NOEL: was there.

25 [REDACTED]: Noel is that Noel?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know how to say
2 that name right.

3 [REDACTED]: Tova Noel

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Tova Noel. She was there
5 and uh Thomas was there.

6 [REDACTED]: Okay. Is that Michael
7 Thomas?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Michael Thomas. Yes.

9 [REDACTED]: So you were one of the
10 very first people on the scene.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 [REDACTED]: Possibly the first maybe
13 lieutenant [REDACTED].

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. They probably -. I
15 think they might have got up there before we
16 did. I'm not too sure.

17 [REDACTED]: When you say "they," was
18 there someone other than -

19 MR. [REDACTED]: There was everybody in the
20 elevator and it was just like a malaise or -.

21 [REDACTED]: But you said you were one
22 of the first. So when you arrived to the cell
23 what did you see?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: I saw Thomas picking him
25 up and people were helping him put him on a

1 stretcher.

2 [REDACTED]: Okay. So when did you
3 start doing the chest compressions?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: I think like right away.

5 [REDACTED]: On the stretcher though?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

7 [REDACTED]: Okay. but not on the
8 floor?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: No I don't believe on the
10 floor.

11 [REDACTED]: Sorry I'll turn it back
12 over to you.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: No it's the same question.
14 So when you walk in. let's say you walk into
15 the SHU. Was the gates open already?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: The tier where he was on
17 was open. And I don't remember if the Sally
18 port door was open because the inner door - I
19 think somebody had to open that door.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you walk in.
21 and you head right up to the tier.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Because we know that
23 was the tier something was happening on .

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Who was standing there?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I believe Thomas.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Thomas was inside or was
2 outside?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: I think he was inside the
4 tier.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Was anybody outside the
6 tier?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: I think Noel was outside
8 the tier. Because usually the way SHU works is
9 one officer in the tier and one officer outside
10 of the tier with a key.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: And out of the few people
12 that came up in the elevator, were you the
13 first one in the room or was there somebody
14 else?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I think lieutenant [REDACTED]
16 was there. He was pretty much directing
17 everybody what to do.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: And you come in. you walk
19 up the stairs for L Tier.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Um M Tier. He was on M
21 Tier I think which is the top.

22 [REDACTED]: L Tier.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: L Tier. Yes.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: And do you recall which
25 cell it was?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the first one. As soon
2 as you go to the tier.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: So you get up there. You
4 look in . what do you see?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Um what do I see? Epstein
6 like not - uh - not tangible like not moving
7 not doing anything. And then everybody's like
8 fathered around him and then we tried to move
9 him to the stretcher. And then we started
10 working on him on the stretcher.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Was anyone performing CPR
12 when you walked in?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: No I don't believe so.
14 Because I think they were trying to cut him
15 down before I got up there. I'm not saying I
16 don't know exactly what happened. But I'm
17 pretty sure they were cutting him down because
18 he did have some stuff wrapped around him. So
19 I think that's what happened.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: So described it. What was
21 he wearing?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: I know it's kind of tough.
24 But.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh he had his orange

1 boxers and uh the orange t-shirt. And I don't
2 know if he had socks on or not.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: So he had orange boxers
4 and he had an orange t-shirt on?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: And what else did he have
7 on him?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: I think whatever was
9 wrapped around him. They were trying to gut
10 that off. And move that out of the way.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: So was it around his neck?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: When I go there I didn't
13 see. I can't tell you what it was wrapped
14 around.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: But when I did see him, I
17 did see his neck was a little bit bruised
18 though.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Did he have anything on
20 his head? Headphones anything like that? do
21 you recall?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Not that I recall no.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: And then where was he
24 laying when you walked in?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: I think it was - by the

1 time I got in they were moving him and it was
2 just get the stretcher and aid the
3 (Indiscernible *01:02:10).

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And CPR was done
5 and then he was taken out?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: We were working on him and
7 then medical came up and kept working on him.
8 And then we took him downstairs.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall how many
10 mattresses were on the floor if there were any?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't recall.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. Is there anything
13 about when you walked in that stood out to you
14 about that cell?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm. no. nothing really
16 distinctive. Just SHU cell.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: And you mentioned you saw
18 bruising. Where did you see bruising?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Around his neck.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: On all sides or just one
21 side?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: I think around all sides.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. And after they took
24 him to medical, did you follow them down?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I was - it was me

1 and [REDACTED]. We were doing chest compressions on
2 him until the second floor. And then we were in
3 medical. And [REDACTED] was making his phone
4 calls and notifications. And I don't know if
5 [REDACTED] gave him a shot but we had to keep
6 working on him.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: [REDACTED] is in medical?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: And the medical guy. And
9 then um they tried to give him the AD machine
10 upstairs and it didn't work. And I think the
11 AD machine was still working on him when we
12 took him downstairs. We were still pumping on
13 the stretch.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: And after the medical
15 office was be brought to the hospital?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: That part I don't know
17 about. After all that happened, I just knew
18 that everything was short-staffed and since I
19 came in to do my job, there was nobody in
20 custody. So after all that I went up to the
21 Special Housing Unit and I worked there for
22 about an hour.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: You went back to the SHU?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: What did you do?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Settled inmate population
2 down. They get a little rowdy when they see
3 stuff happen and don't know what's going on.
4 So you've got to kind of just do custody work.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Who was in the SHU when
6 you were up there?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: It was me, Lieutenant
8 [REDACTED]. She came up from somewhere.
9 Lieutenant [REDACTED] was there. And um Officer
10 Noel was there also.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: She was still there?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: What was she doing?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: She just looked like a
15 little disheveled like she didn't know what was
16 going on. Just stressed. Because that was her
17 first suicide. So when you see something like
18 that you kind of don't know how you would uh
19 react.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Did you talk to her about
21 it?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't believe so. I
23 just kind of let her do her thing. And I just
24 had to get to - because they were feeding in
25 the morning time. So you have to you know try

1 to settle everything down.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: When you got up there and
3 um initially, do you recall if Officers Michael
4 Thomas or Noel Tova Noel made any statements.
5 Any comments to Lieutenant [REDACTED].

6 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't really recall. It
7 was like a mess. I don't really know what was
8 said.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Did you assist [REDACTED]-
10 [REDACTED] in giving out food?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Were you in the same tier
13 with them when she handed out the food?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall any
16 interaction between her and the inmates?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh there was a lot of
18 things saying inmates said that were heard -
19 not right.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: So what kind of stuff did
21 the inmates say?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: You killed him. What they
23 say. You killed him. You weren't making
24 rounds. You killed him. You weren't making
25 rounds. You guys got to get a new job. You

1 guys are done. A lot of fuck you this - your
2 mother this. You know. it was just a -.

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Did [REDACTED] say
4 anything back to them?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't believe so. I
6 don't know what she said to the inmates. Like
7 I said it was just like a - I don't know what
8 was said back and forth.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall if any
10 comments were made about providing an alibi for
11 the CO's?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I don't believe so.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Anything else on that?

14 [REDACTED]: A lot. Um so we'll just
15 go in reverse order. So when you said you
16 killed him, who killed him?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: They like the officers
18 killed Epstein.

19 [REDACTED]: Did they - were they
20 referring to any specific officers?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: The officers that were up
22 there - Thomas and Noel. Yeah.

23 [REDACTED]: So they were saying that
24 they killed him?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. You guys killed

1 him.

2 [REDACTED]: And did they say anything
3 specifically about how?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No. they was just - they
5 were upset so they were just saying it but they
6 didn't say how.

7 [REDACTED]: Did anyone say -?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: They didn't say that they
9 went in the cells to try to kill him or open up
10 the grille. They just said you guys killed
11 him. But.

12 [REDACTED]: And what was -? Did you
13 ask any follow-up questions with regard to
14 that?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I just know not to say
16 anything. So I just do what I have to do and
17 don't get involved in that.

18 [REDACTED]: Did they provide any
19 other information with regard to when they were
20 saying you killed him?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Just that they didn't do
22 rounds. And that was pretty much about it.

23 [REDACTED]: Did they say anything
24 more about not doing rounds or just said that
25 they didn't do any rounds? Or what did they

1 say about that?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: They didn't do any rounds.
3 They were sitting there all night. I don't
4 think they came over here once.

5 [REDACTED]: They said they came over
6 once?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: They never came. They
8 never did any rounds.

9 [REDACTED]: They said they never did
10 one.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

12 [REDACTED]: Oh. So they never did
13 once.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

15 [REDACTED]: Is that what you mean.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

17 [REDACTED]: Okay. Did they mention
18 when they stopped doing rounds?

19 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

20 [REDACTED]: No? All right. You said
21 that when you came back it was Noel and
22 [REDACTED] and yourself. Just the three of you.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe so.

24 [REDACTED]: Was Thomas already gone
25 then?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

2 [REDACTED]: All right. Did you see
3 anyone near the officer station at that time?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I don't believe so.

5 [REDACTED]: Do you know if anybody -.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the round slips. I
7 don't know if anybody started to write stuff
8 down or anything.

9 [REDACTED]: What about with regards
10 to Epstein file? DO you know if anyone went
11 into Epstein's file at that time?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even know if he
13 had -. He had a SHU file but I don't know who
14 would have access to that.

15 [REDACTED]: Wouldn't the SHU file be
16 right there in the SHU?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. But it's usually the
18 OIC would know where the file is.

19 [REDACTED]: Okay. Did you see
20 [REDACTED] at all around that desk area?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I don't know what
22 they were doing as far as the file or anything.

23 [REDACTED]: Were you with [REDACTED]-
24 [REDACTED] the whole time she was there?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I was feeding so I was

1 kind of like by myself. Let me down the tier.

2 I'll feed.

3 [REDACTED]: Okay. So you - I thought
4 you said that you were feeding with [REDACTED]
5 [REDACTED] at the same time.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: No-no-no. She would do
7 something else and I take this tier and she was
8 doing something else.

9 [REDACTED]: All right. So you would
10 each be in your own individual tier.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: feeding. Yeah.

12 [REDACTED]: And feeding.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Because there were only
14 two people to feed.

15 [REDACTED]: All right. And was Noel
16 also feeding?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I think she was
18 opening the grill.

19 [REDACTED]: She was opening the
20 grill. And she was standing on the outside?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

22 [REDACTED]: And how does that work?
23 Are you allowed to be going and feeding by
24 yourself? And [REDACTED] also going down -?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Still feeding. Yes.

1 Because you're not opening the -. You're just
2 opening the slot. You're not opening the door
3 for the inmates. So that's okay.

4 [REDACTED]: Okay. So that's all
5 right. Now did you notice anything else taking
6 place in there aside from feeding when you were
7 in there?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

9 [REDACTED]: Around what time were you
10 in there?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh probably a little bit
12 after 6:00 a.m.

13 [REDACTED]: So if he -.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: And then I -.

15 If the body alarm gets activated at 6:33
16 a.m., about what time did you come back after
17 you did the lifesaving measures?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I probably went
19 downstairs, put my stuff away, and then I had
20 two TDY staff on me. They stayed in the
21 basement.

22 [REDACTED]: When you say the basement
23 what does that mean?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: In my office. They were
25 in my office. Because I didn't know anything

1 would happen. And they just didn't need to be
2 a part of anything that was transpired. So.

3 [REDACTED]: But they weren't in the
4 SHU?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: No they never went to the
6 SHU. They never responded to the body alarm.

7 [REDACTED]: So do you think you were
8 back in the SHU by about 7:00 a.m.?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Before 7:00 a.m.

10 [REDACTED]: So prior to 7:00 a.m. and
11 then -.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

13 [REDACTED]: Then you stayed in there
14 until almost 8:00 a.m.?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even know. I
16 stayed in there for a quite a while. I'm not
17 too sure.

18 [REDACTED]: By - while you were in
19 there, did SIS or anyone else come in and start
20 preserving evidence?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't believe anybody
22 was here to start doing any of that.

23 [REDACTED]: Okay. So by the time you
24 left -. You left - when you left there, who
25 was still there?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't even know who came
2 up early honestly.

3 [REDACTED]: No? But someone did
4 relieve you?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Somebody did relieve
6 me. Then I got asked about cameras and phone
7 calls and -.

8 [REDACTED]: Right. So it's just a
9 whirlwind?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. Just a - yeah.

11 [REDACTED]: And when you saw Epstein,
12 are you sure he had a shirt on?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Pretty sure. Did he have
14 a shirt on? I'm not for sure. Honestly. I
15 don't really remember that.

16 [REDACTED]: Can you remember yourself
17 actually doing those chest compressions?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: I was doing chest
19 compressions.

20 [REDACTED]: Do you remember -?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh. We had to take his
22 shirt off. Okay. Yeah. We had to take his
23 shirt off.

24 [REDACTED]: So you actually took it
25 off?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

2 [REDACTED]: Do you remember taking it
3 off?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah because that's how
5 you got to put on the AD. So the shirt came
6 off.

7 [REDACTED]: Do you remember it
8 actually taking it off or that it was off
9 already?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Maybe it was off already.

11 [REDACTED]: But you can't recall?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

13 [REDACTED]: And when you said when
14 you arrived, you're not - there was no one
15 doing chest compressions at the time that you
16 arrived?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: They were - I think they
18 were trying to cut him down and we - and I
19 think I went to go get the stretcher and the AD
20 so by the time I came back, whatever they were
21 doing to try to move him --

22 [REDACTED]: Yeah.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: -- by the time we got the
24 stretcher, that's when we started working on
25 him. Because you obviously can't work on him

1 because he's hanging up and -.

2 [REDACTED]: So you believe he was
3 actually hanging by the time - when you got
4 there?

5 MR. [REDACTED]: They were moving him down.
6 He was in an up position and they were lowering
7 him down to whatever position.

8 [REDACTED]: All right. So he may not
9 have been actually hanging but he was like
10 sitting up?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure.

12 [REDACTED]: You don't know?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

14 [REDACTED]: Okay.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Somebody was holding him
16 so I don't know if he was -. If they were like
17 trying to -.

18 [REDACTED]: So just walk me through
19 that. What exactly did you see? When you say
20 someone was holding him. What do you mean by
21 holding him?

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay. So you get in the
23 SHU. There's not a lot space in the SHU.

24 [REDACTED]: Totally.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: So if an inmate is

1 hanging, usually you try to hold them and make
2 sure you know you can cut them down. And with
3 all that going on, I think I went to get the AD
4 and the um -. Because there was enough staff
5 there. I didn't need to go in the cell.

6 There's no space.

7 [REDACTED]: Okay.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: So I just got the AD or
9 the stretcher and bring it back.

10 [REDACTED]: But you believe - there -
11 are you confident that there were actually - he
12 was like in an upright position when you first
13 saw him?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I'm pretty sure. He
15 wasn't laying down. It was (Indiscernible
16 *01:12:00).

17 [REDACTED]: So he was not laying down
18 yet --

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Was he laying down?

20 [REDACTED]: -- and they weren't
21 already working on him.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh. I don't really. I
23 remember him being moved. I don't know if he
24 was laying down when I first got there. I
25 don't really -.

1 [REDACTED]: Yeah.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: That I can't say for sure.
3 I know he was being moved when I initially got
4 there. And then I went down. I can't say he
5 was laying down because I didn't --

6 [REDACTED]: All right.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: -- see him.

8 [REDACTED]: But you do know he was
9 being moved.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

11 [REDACTED]: You just don't - and you
12 believe he was in an upright - like seated-type
13 position.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Or whatever position he
15 was they were trying to move him out of that
16 position.

17 [REDACTED]: Okay.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: To administer first aid or
19 whatever.

20 [REDACTED]: So when is the first time
21 that you know he was actually receiving chest
22 compressions?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh as soon as we put him
24 on the stretcher.

25 [REDACTED]: Did anyone check for

1 breath or a pulse?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh the duty PA. Uh
3 [REDACTED]. And then he put the AD on. The AD
4 tells you if there's a pulse or anything. And
5 staying clear so they could do the shock.

6 [REDACTED]: All right. So prior -
7 that's the first you know chest compressions
8 were ever done though?

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

10 [REDACTED]: Okay.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: I've just got a follow-up
12 on that question.

13 [REDACTED]: All right.

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm.

15 MR. [REDACTED]: When you walked in and
16 when they started doing the chest -. Where was
17 his body being - like when you walk in -. His
18 bunk is there.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm-hmm.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: And we know there's a --

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Corner

22 MR. [REDACTED]: -- corner. Right?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Which way was his head
25 facing head? And where was his legs?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: He was kind of like
2 somebody was just holding him. So I can't
3 really tell if he was going this way or that.
4 But somebody was behind him physically holding
5 him like this trying to move him.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Were they trying to get
7 him out of the corner and bring him out?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I believe that's
9 what was going on. But there was no way to put
10 him there because you can't put him on the
11 ground to do anything. So that's when we -
12 free to get the stretcher and AD machine.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Why couldn't they put him
14 down on the ground?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I usually put them down on
16 the ground. But usually it just second nature.
17 You always get a stretcher. Because you don't
18 want none of the inmates seeing you work on an
19 inmate. It never looks good. So you kind of -
20 you just - everything is just so fast. Like it
21 just moves just like a - it's not like you wait
22 or hesitate. But you just kind of know what to
23 do. There's no hesitation. But you just know
24 what's going to happen and you never really
25 want to work in front of the inmates or the

1 inmates behind a door. Like that's not a good
2 idea. So you try to move them as much so you
3 can really start working them.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: SO you don't think anyone
5 did CPR on him until he was moved over?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: No. We did CPR on him.
7 I'm pretty sure somebody did. but it was just
8 a process of everything was so -. Everything
9 just happened like this where it just didn't
10 seem like -. It seemed like it took minutes
11 but it probably just took seconds the way
12 everything was going.

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

14 [REDACTED]: So I guess is there any
15 reason for you to believe that Epstein didn't
16 take his own life?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

18 [REDACTED]: Do you believe Epstein
19 took his own life?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. I believe so.

21 [REDACTED]: Were the inmates saying
22 anything about anyone going into Epstein's
23 cell?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

25 [REDACTED]: So all they said was that

1 they didn't check - they didn't do their
2 rounds?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: The rounds. They didn't
4 do anything all night.

5 [REDACTED]: So do you believe that's
6 what they meant by you killed him?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. They didn't do their
8 job.

9 [REDACTED]: So they didn't do their
10 job -.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: And with them -. Yeah.
12 They didn't. By them not doing their rounds,
13 they can't check to see if he was breathing or
14 what's going on.

15 [REDACTED]: And that's how they
16 killed him.

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. That's how they
18 killed him.

19 [REDACTED]: All right. As far as
20 when you were in there. After you come back up
21 to the SHU, after you leave the medical unit.
22 You said you got there before 7:00 a.m. The
23 entire time you were in there for approximately
24 one hour. Was [REDACTED] in there with you?

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I don't recall. She

1 might have come down and checked on things.
2 The lieutenant came down and checked to see
3 what was going on. And that was about it. And
4 then we have to write our statements about what
5 transpired.

6 [REDACTED]: Oh did you and [REDACTED]
7 [REDACTED] both write statements?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I wrote my own
9 statement.

10 [REDACTED]: You wrote your own
11 statement? But you did write a statement?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

13 [REDACTED]: Did [REDACTED] also
14 write a statement though?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I believe so. I'm not too
16 sure. She's a lieutenant. She should know to
17 write a statement but I -.

18 [REDACTED]: Okay.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: That's something that
20 yeah. I don't have to write a statement.

21 [REDACTED]: And where you do write
22 statements from?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Um my computer. I just go
24 to my desk and -.

25 [REDACTED]: Okay. And would have

1 [REDACTED] also written one though? Like
2 did - was she one of the responding officers?
3 Or did she just come up to help feed?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know if she came
5 up with the body alarm. It was -. I don't
6 think she was there initially when everything
7 happened. So I don't think yeah.

8 [REDACTED]: So she wouldn't have
9 written a statement the. Correct?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

11 [REDACTED]: So do you recall at the
12 time that you left the SHU. Do you know if she
13 was still in there?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I don't know.

15 [REDACTED]: You're not sure?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. Yeah.

17 [REDACTED]: And again, did you see
18 anyone that was int her around that officer
19 station?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: I just there was - working
21 on the tier making sure I do rounds and try to
22 talk to the inmates to settle them down as much
23 as I could.

24 [REDACTED]: Okay. But you didn't
25 notice any files being manipulated.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: No. nobody was going by
2 the desk or doing anything like that. like I
3 didn't see anybody trying to go and grab stuff
4 or move stuff around. Like I didn't see any of
5 that.

6 [REDACTED]: Okay. Okay. And you
7 didn't see anybody actually take papers or -?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. And I'm pretty sure
9 if somebody did it, it would probably be on
10 camera too. Because that camera was working
11 so.

12

13 [REDACTED]: Well that camera that
14 you're talking about that was working - you
15 can't make anything out on it.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. Yeah. You can't
17 really make anything out.

18 [REDACTED]: So even if someone's near
19 there, you can't really see what they're doing.

20 MR. [REDACTED]: Really see what they're
21 doing yeah. But I don't think anybody was
22 going there to do anything. Because I don't
23 even think anybody knew like what the hell was
24 going on.

25 [REDACTED]: Okay.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: To be honest with you. It
2 was like what the hell just happened.

3 [REDACTED]: Okay. And as far as
4 that. that is the one and only camera? That
5 one that was up by 10 South that was working.

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. That was working.

7 [REDACTED]: All right. Then nothing
8 else. Nothing else that was ever working.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: Um there was other ones in
10 the Sally portion. But nothing as far as the
11 SHU. That was the only one in the SHU.

12 [REDACTED]: Um. All right. So as
13 far as that camera though that was showing
14 people - who was going in and out of the SHU.
15 Was that working?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Um the 9 Sally I'm not too
17 sure.

18 [REDACTED]: Okay.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: That I'm not too sure
20 about.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: You just said it was
22 working.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not - no I'm not sure
24 if it was recording. When that Sally camera
25 was recording.

1 [REDACTED]: Yeah. That's what I was
2 saying. The difference between working and
3 recording to him is if it's actually live feed
4 -.

5 [REDACTED]: Yeah. I can't tell you.
6 Yeah. It gets confusing.

7 [REDACTED]: Um. But. All right.
8 And again. You believe that - sorry. Start
9 over. You believe Epstein took his own life.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

11 [REDACTED]: Okay.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Based on the agent's
13 question. You said you were doing feeding.
14 Did you do feeding on L Tier after? The tier
15 that Epstein was found in. Did you -?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: I probably did yeah.
17 Because I don't really. I probably did.

18 MR. [REDACTED]: How long were you up there
19 for?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Do you recall if his cell
22 was secured? Or was it left open?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Initially it was probably
24 left open and-

25 MR. [REDACTED]: For how long?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't know. I'm not too
2 sure. But then I think when I came back to
3 feed - because we lock all the cells. It's
4 probably locked when I started doing feeding.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: But were there CO's going
6 in and out of there?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: No. there's no reason to
8 go inside of a cell. And everybody knows like
9 after a suicide, it's a crime scene. So
10 usually you just stay away from there. So.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: DO you recall
12 approximately when they came and they secured
13 it a crime scene?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: I'm not too sure When that
15 happened.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: But it wasn't secured when
17 you left?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Um when I - when I went
19 down there for the body alarm it wasn't secure.
20 I mean when I took him down to medical doing
21 chest compressions. He wasn't - it wasn't
22 secured. I don't really -. But when I came
23 back upstairs it was secured. The door was
24 locked I believe.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

1 [REDACTED]: And I know I was honing
2 in on [REDACTED], but what about Noel? Did
3 you see Noel near the officers' station at all?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh I believe she received
5 a phone call or somebody wanted to see what was
6 going on. Asked them like what happened or -.

7 [REDACTED]: Oh. Did you see her
8 manipulating any files or dealing with any
9 paperwork?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: I don't believe so.

11 [REDACTED]: No? All right. And then
12 going way back to our initial conversation you
13 said that you put in a work order for [REDACTED].
14 Was that on the 9th?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Um probably before yeah.
16 Of July. Um.

17 [REDACTED]: no. that would have been
18 August 9th. The day before Epstein was found.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I was just
20 troubleshooting with them. I was on the phone
21 with them. It's not really a work order. Just
22 you know I call them up. Hey, this what's
23 going on what should we do.

24 [REDACTED]: Okay. So there would be
25 no paperwork showing -.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Um from - saying that they
2 have paperwork.

3 [REDACTED]: So they would show that
4 you called --

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

6 [REDACTED]: -- and you said that
7 these things were down.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. And I was having
9 problems.

10 [REDACTED]: And do you have any of
11 those files?

12 MR. [REDACTED]: No. They have their own
13 files they keep.

14 [REDACTED]: Just they would be able
15 to like -.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. And I was on -.
17 Since that happened, I was pretty much on the
18 phone with them for like a week after that. so
19 they would have records of when I called or
20 whatever happened.

21 [REDACTED]: All right. And then as
22 far as - and now we're going way to the
23 beginning. You said that you were - you did -
24 you were interviewed by the FBI. You said on
25 the 10th you were also interviewed by them

1 after the 10th of August?

2 MR. [REDACTED]: Because I was the subject
3 matter expert as far as the cameras go. So
4 they want to know like how can you find video
5 if you could find video. Or could I do. And
6 then they came and the next day they tried to -
7 . As soon as I found the video, that's the
8 real video they wanted because they wanted to
9 make sure they had something in it. Because
10 they were pretty mad that there was no video at
11 all. And I found that video. Because I wasn't
12 sure what was on the recorders or what wasn't
13 on the recorders at one point.

14 [REDACTED]: And that's the 10 South
15 vide?

16 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

17 [REDACTED]: And um do you know if
18 that video was ever enhanced to be able to see
19 it more clearly?

20 MR. [REDACTED]: I have no idea if they did
21 or did not.

22 [REDACTED]: But you did not?

23 MR. [REDACTED]: No. I did not do that.

24 [REDACTED]: Do you even have that
25 ability to do that?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Not without software we
2 have. No. Not going to happen.

3 [REDACTED]: Okay.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: You mentioned maybe I'm
5 mistaken. You mentioned there was a work order
6 created prior to the 9th for the cameras.

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. There was a few
8 work orders that the recorders were going down
9 or failing. We have problems.

10 MR. [REDACTED]: When were those created?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh maybe a year before or
12 six months before. It was just a constant
13 thing as far as the cameras not working.
14 Because we was trying to get upgraded. We were
15 trying to get money spent. So we have to
16 create - any time there's a problem, I have to
17 create a work order or tell like the regional
18 office like there's a problem. Because it's a
19 work order over 10,000 so they have to put
20 money aside to do the work. Like it's not a
21 quick fix to fix the recorders.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: And these recorders were
23 maintained in house or only by [REDACTED]?

24 MR. [REDACTED]: The work orders we have
25 are maintained here in house.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Who would have access to
2 that?

3 MR. [REDACTED]: Um the facility manager.

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Okay.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: Anybody in facilities
6 pretty much would have access to it. But
7 really facility manager.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: On August 9th when you saw
9 that the system was down. Has it gone down
10 just like that before?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: How long did it take you
13 to fix it?

14 MR. [REDACTED]: Sometimes maybe a day
15 maybe two days - maybe a couple days. And the
16 thing - and I have to stress also - is just
17 because I saw it down -. Because I don't check
18 it every day. I don't know if it was down for
19 a week, a month, you know. it's not one of
20 those things you check all the time. But I
21 would - since we were having problems more
22 readily, I would always check like once a week
23 to make sure it was working. But before it was
24 not like okay I've got to go up here and check
25 it because it wasn't happening.

1 MR. [REDACTED]: That was my next question.
2 Did you just happen to walk in there that day?
3 Or -?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: I already knew we were
5 having issues. And I think I got the hard
6 drives out. Because I was going to take them
7 up there and see what was going on.

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Now based on the fact that
9 this happened before. Right. Was that same
10 exact situation. Same exact -.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

12 MR. [REDACTED]: Same exact drives?

13 MR. [REDACTED]: Um I think it's switched.
14 It could have been recorder one and then
15 recorder two. I don't think it was just the
16 same recorder all the time because one recorder
17 was actually the whole motherboard have to get
18 replaced. And that was again I think that was
19 recorder two. And before drives would go out
20 on one or two, so it was just random. They
21 were old. They just needed to get replaced.

22 MR. [REDACTED]: And at that point you knew
23 that the drives were not recording.

24 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Were any actions taken to

1 make sure that is this does happen in the
2 future that at least something would be
3 recorded?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes. Exactly that.

5 MR. [REDACTED]: What actions were taken?

6 MR. [REDACTED]: Um now we have redundant
7 drives. So if one drive fails, you always have
8 a backup.

9 MR. [REDACTED]: No-no. I'm talking about
10 prior to the 9th.

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Oh. Prior to the 9th?
12 No. There was really nothing. They just knew
13 we had a problem. We had ordered the new
14 system. We were online to get it installed.
15 But we were just not lucky to get it installed.

16 MR. [REDACTED]: And that recorder would
17 show that there was an order for -?

18 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. And that we have
19 the shipping stuff for the system actually. It
20 was here. It was in the building.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: You just didn't get it
22 installed yet.

23 MR. [REDACTED]: Didn't get installed. It
24 got installed a couple - um the = happened on
25 the 9th, 10th, or 11th. That's when the new

1 system got installed.

2 MR. [REDACTED]: I got nothing else.

3 [REDACTED]: Yeah. The other thing.

4 We've already asked you this but I just want to
5 make sure. So the title of you supervisor did
6 you say facilities manager?

7 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

8 [REDACTED]: And how would we again
9 figure out who that was at the time?

10 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh I don't know. you
11 would just have to ask. I'm not too sure who
12 the facility manager was.

13 [REDACTED]: But you don't even know
14 how -(Indiscernible *01:24:08)

15 MR. [REDACTED]: I think it was [REDACTED]
16 [REDACTED] (Phonetic Sp. *01:24:09) but I'm not
17 too sure. Because he was maybe Acting at the
18 time. Id don't think he got the position yet.

19 MR. [REDACTED]: Is he the facilities
20 manager now?

21 MR. [REDACTED]: Now yes he is.

22 [REDACTED]: And again you know you
23 notified whoever was the facilities manager at
24 the time.

25 MR. [REDACTED]: Or my general foreman

1 usually. It's one of those two. I usually
2 notify both of them.

3 [REDACTED]: So the general manager
4 and/or the general foreman?

5 [REDACTED]: And general foreman. Yeah.
6 I have to notify somebody. I can't just walk
7 out of the building and not say anything.

8 [REDACTED]: And you said you're
9 positive you definitely made those
10 notifications?

11 MR. [REDACTED]: Yeah. I had to. Because
12 I was coming back the next day to do work.

13 [REDACTED]: Um you said it was the
14 general foreman?

15 MR. [REDACTED]: Yes.

16 [REDACTED]: Um and do you know of -?

17 MR. [REDACTED]: Bu I don't even think we
18 had a general foreman. I'm not too sure. It
19 was two years ago. I'm not even sure if we had
20 a general foreman.

21 [REDACTED]: And being thought that
22 this was such a big deal and these cameras were
23 such a big part of it, did you ever learn if
24 either of those people ever passed the
25 information up?

1 MR. [REDACTED]: Mm no.

2 [REDACTED]: So no that was never
3 spoken of?

4 MR. [REDACTED]: No.

5 [REDACTED]: And you guys didn't - you
6 never had that conversation with those
7 supervisors after the fact?

8 MR. [REDACTED]: Uh it was -. Did we have
9 a conversation after? I never really asked if
10 it got -. They - I'm pretty sure everybody
11 knew it wasn't working because I came back the
12 next day. So -.

13 [REDACTED]: So did they ever - did
14 anyone ever say anything to you about like hey
15 why didn't tell me?

11 There's cameras everywhere. I come to this
12 jail, New York City. And I'm expecting cameras
13 everywhere. And one of the first things was
14 like oh we don't have money for that. we don't
15 have money for this. We don't have money for
16 that. and I just kept saying hey, you guys got
17 to do something. This is a problem. God
18 forbid this is what happened. But I just wish
19 there was more proactivity. Like -.

20 [REDACTED]: But right now MCC is -.

21 MR. [REDACTED]: We're good. Yeah we're
22 good. We don't have any issues.

23 [REDACTED]: So when you mad that
24 statement you're talking about other
25 facilities.
