EMPLOYEE 25, was interviewed at [REDACTED], New York, NY, 10007 (US Attorney's Office, Southern District of New York). Present at the interview was Office of the Inspector General (OIG) Special Agent (SA) [REDACTED], Assistant U.S. Attorney (AUSA) [REDACTED], and FBI SA [REDACTED]. After being advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the nature of the interview, [REDACTED] EMPLOYEE 25 provided the following statement:

EMPLOYEE 25 has a PhD Psychology

EMPLOYEE 25 interned at in Metropolitan Detention Center in 2004.

EMPLOYEE 25 started working at Metropolitan Detention Center in 2005.

EMPLOYEE 25 transferred to Metropolitan Correctional Center in 2009.

EMPLOYEE 25 conducts Forensic Psychological Evaluations of inmates for the Bureau of Prisons.

EMPLOYEE 25 conducted an intake interview of EPSTEIN on July 8, 2019. During the interview, EPSTEIN denied any mental health history, suicide history, and substance abuse history. EPSTEIN stated, although he was in the "shoe", he was doing fine. (A copy of EMPLOYEE 25 July, 8, 2019, intake screening of EPSTEIN will be maintained in a 1A associated with this serial).

On August 9, 2019 at approximately 1:00pm, EMPLOYEE 25, acting for DR. [REDACTED], was present during a meeting regarding EPSTIEN. During the meeting, EPSTEIN's attorney was opposed EPSTEIN having a cell mate. During the meeting, [REDACTED] and EMPLOYEE 25 explained to EPSTEIN's attorney, that because EPSTEIN was in the "shoe", and he was a sex offender,
