In a previous FOIA litigation (17-cv-3956 Radar Online), we switched to 7A and lumped the NPA and the majority of the other documents pertaining to the MM case file as pending and kept the overarching 7A on those. I am not so sure that would fly with this Plaintiff, unless the NPA would truly impact your ongoing investigations surrounds Epstein and his actions. If we are able to process the NPA for release, I am not quite sure how we would tackle that yet.
