BODY

The corpse section confirmed that American financier and billionaire Jeffrey Epstein, who was found dead in his prison cell last Saturday, committed suicide. It is clear from a sparingly worded report by a New York medical examiner that Epstein hanged himself, most assuredly using the sheets to do so. The expert's conclusions are "not satisfied" lawyers for the deceased," the Reuters Agency reported.

Epstein, accused of soliciting prostitution and sexually abusing underage girls, died on Saturday 10 August at the morning. He was unresponsive when guards found him in the cell of federal investigative custody in Manhattan, New York, so he was transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced dead.

Two investigations are underway into the billionaire's death \* the Inspector General of the Ministry of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Clarification on the matter was demanded by members of the U.S. House of Representatives justice committee.

Epstein's death sparked an avalanche of speculation immediately. Although authorities announced Saturday that he most assuredly committed suicide, many suggested he had been murdered.

According to US media, Epstein was left alone in the cell, while there were always going to be at least two people in it, and that the checks ordered every 30 minutes were not followed.

An AP agency caller says Epstein was taken off surveillance before taking his own life. However, it is unclear when this occurred. Already before, on July 24, Epstein was found in his cell half-unconscious and with marks around his neck. It is not known whether he attempted suicide at the time or was assaulted.

The 66-year-old Epstein, who maintained he was innocent, threatened up to 45 years imprisonment; his trial was due to begin in June 2020. The judge did not agree to release him on bail \* though Epstein's attorney proposed \$100 million \* out of concern that the billionaire would easily arrange for himself to escape. But also because according to investigators' findings, in recent months Epstein has attempted to bribe witnesses who could testify in his case.

In addition to evidence of attempts to silence witnesses, investigators recently discovered obscene photographs of an underage girl referred to as the billionaire's "sex slave" in Epstein's residences. American TV channels promised recently recovered footage of the start of the party in 1992, which featured 28 young women and only two men: current US President Donald Trump and Epstein. Trump called brought in for the woman's reception "calendar girls."


According to the indictment, Epstein was supposed to bring underage girls to his residences, including Manhattan and Palm Beach, Florida, between 2002 and 2005. He paid some of the girls and his co-workers to recruit further victims.

12 years ago, Epstein was charged in Florida with soliciting minors into prostitution, but he managed to strike an out-of-court plea that saw him sentenced instead to life in prison only to 13 months in prison.
