Dear [REDACTED] – I am sorry to trouble you on a Sunday, but I am hoping that you can help with a time-sensitive matter.

On October 28, 2009, I prepared a subpoena addressed to [REDACTED]. As you know, subpoenas to attorneys require Justice Department approval, and I did not receive that approval until the late afternoon on November 5, 2009. I spoke with [REDACTED] on November 6, 2009, who reported that he was willing to provide to me those items that he still had access to, but that the bulk of his file was in the custody of the U.S. Attorney's Office due to the criminal investigation of [REDACTED] was served with a copy of the subpoena on November 6, 2009, and has stated that he will produce the items that he has access to on Monday, November 9, 2009.

As counsel for the Rothstein firm, are you willing to accept service of a copy of the subpoena? And, if so, can you provide me with written authorization to allow the U.S. Attorney's Office's "taint team" to search the files that you provided to them to determine what items are responsive to the subpoena and to provide them to me?
