Dear Jeffrey,


Thank you very much for giving me the opportunity to participate at a safari. It was a truly wonderful experience, something I have dreamt of since I was a child.

I went on walking safaris a few times, which I found interesting. I walked for hours and had a guard with weapons with me. It was a very special feeling and I felt close to the nature.




I saw impalas every day, and they got really close to the tent where I lived.



I found the light in Africa very special, it was a beautiful light I never seen before. Between 5 pm and 7 pm was the best time.








