

██████████ / Patient by referral - Accompanied by mother Cynthia ██████████
██████████ / Patient was not tested by Dr Adriana Le, Immunologist / Allergist during the appointment dated 31st January 2022, following Dr Adriana receiving an Extensive Medical

History of Acute allergy reactions to several medications and immunisations, and in accordance with the referral received from Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical Association. ██████████ /

Patient was advised by Dr Adriana to have the Pfizer Comimaty Covid-19 immunisation and was referred to the Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic

Patient was advised by Dr Adriana Le that she did not require testing for an allergy reaction to the Covid-19 immunisation and that "testing hurts anyway"

██████████ / Patient recognised that Dr Adriana Le could not look her in the eyes with confidence during the appointment in the Clare practice and felt uneasy about the specialists expertise and advise because of the lack of eye contact, which she had not experienced with any doctor before.

██████████ / Patient continued to trust the expert opinion of Dr Adriana Le although trepidatious and proceeded to attend the appointment at the Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic, dated 8th February 2022.

██████████ was very apprehensive about having the immunisation Covid-19 due to her extensive medical history of Acute allergy reactions to several medications and immunisations and having suffered the affects several times as a result, including suffering from 2 events of Anaphylaxis, one event being from the Influenza Immunisation 2014, even following the expert opinion from Dr Adriana Le, Immunologist / Allergist, appointment in the Clare Practice.

Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic

Dated : 8th February 2020

Covid-19 Immunisation : Pfizer - As recommended by Dr Adriana Le, Immunologist / Allergist

Prior to immunisation being administered : Allergist of the Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic

██████████ / patient was spoken to by the Allergist of the Specialist Vaccination Clinic, who proceeded to assess the patients Medical History of previous Acute allergy reactions to several medications, including the Influenza Immunisation in 2014 of which resulted

RAH Allergist proceeded to assess the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] reaction to the medication Olanzapine which she was informed resulted in an allergy reaction of swollen lips, swollen tongue and respiratory distress 20 minutes following administration of the medication

RAH Allergist stated to the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] following being informed of the allergy reaction to Olanzapine "that's cause for concern" (Red Flag not to proceed with the immunisation)

RAH Allergist then informed the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] following the "Cause for concern" statement to proceed with the Covid-19 immunisation. The patient trusted the Allergist Professional assessment and proceeded to follow her professional medical advice

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was then administered the Covid-19 Immunisation following the assessment by the RAH Allergist and was kept in observation for an extended time for a 45 minute period as a precaution because of her Extensive Medical History of developing an Allergy reaction to the vaccine. The immunisation was administered at 10.35am - K Jones on the 8th February 2022 Batch # FL7649

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] did not suffer from any initial reaction to the immunisation, except for the usual informed symptoms of the immunisation of flu like symptoms for 2 days

8 day delayed Immune response to the Covid-19 Immunisation on the 8th February 2022 On the advice of the 2 allergists involved and RAH, Adelaide Specialist Vaccination Clinic

Eight days following administration of the Covid-19 Immunisation on the advice of the two allergist and the RAH Specialist Vaccination Clinic, and without the testing being conducted according to the referral received by Dr Adrian Le from Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical association the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] began to show symptoms of a progressing Allergy reaction to the Immunisation. Symptoms included feeling unwell, swelling and congestion in the nasal, a rash that resembled a hive like rash, which was intensely itchy that covered the facial regions, arms, chest and legs, slight swelling in the facial regions. All symptoms that had been recorded in the Covid-19 Immunisation pamphlet of an Allergy reaction to the vaccine

The symptoms of the progressing allergy reaction progressed severely over a five day period, resulting in severe symptoms of the hive like rash progressing to appear as severe skin lesions on her facial, neck, chest, arms, stomach and leg regions, severe swelling of the facial region, including nasal area, eye area, cheeks, lips, neck, a severe feeling of being unwell, severely swollen nasal passages (could not breath through nasal passages), congestion within nasal passages, a bronchitis type cough, severe tightness in the chest (respiratory system), shooting pressure type headaches in all areas of the head, severe burning and itching of the skin (couldn't stand to be touched on the skin without pain, which included bed sheets), Respiratory distress, Insomnia, restlessness, irritability, dizziness that came and went, nausea that came and went

Dr John Birss - Wallaroo Hospital Emergency Ward - 23rd February 2022

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] presented herself at the Wallaroo Emergency Ward on 23rd February 2022 in Respiratory distress (rapid breathing) and displaying the severe acute symptoms of an Allergy Reaction, including Respiratory distress of rapid breathing to the Covid-19 Immunisation that was administered by the RAH Specialist Vaccination Clinic, under the professional advice of the two allergist, Dr Adrian Le, and the RAH Allergist who assessed the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] prior to the vaccination and advised her to proceed with the vaccination without any form of medical testing for an allergy reaction and consideration for the referral from Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical Association and the provided Extensive Medical History of the patient of Acute Allergy reactions to several medications and immunisations that had resulted in Anaphylaxis previously and the "Cause for concern" for the medication Olanzapine.

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was diagnosed as Acute Allergic Oedema to the Covid-19 Immunisation administered on the 8th February 2022 at the RAH Specialist Vaccination Clinic at 10.33am by K Jones under the professional medical advice of the two allergist consulted and assessed the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] because of her extensive Medical History of Acute allergy reactions to several medications and including immunisations, which included the Influenza Immunisation in 2014 and ADT in 2020, resulting in Anaphylaxis and Allergy asthma

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was administered a prescription for the medication Prednisolone 25mg(Cortisone)and a medical plan, which involved :

2x 25mg tablets daily for 3 days

1x 25mg tablets daily for 3 days

1/2 25mg tablet for 4 days - then stop medication

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was informed to follow the medication plan for a second course if symptoms persisted

Symptoms persisted following the first course of the medication plan and under the advice of Dr John Birss the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] proceeded to administer a second course of the medication plan

Symptoms persisted following the second course of the medication plan. The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] proceeded to consult with a GP, Dr Kwan Chia, Kadina Medical Association at 9.45am , 17th March 2022 and was instructed to continue to treat the symptoms with Phenergan 25mg until symptoms are resolved. The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] proceeded to administer the medical plan advised by the GP of Phenergan 25mg until symptoms resolve.

Ongoing symptoms of the Acute Allergy Oedema following the Covid-19 Immunisation did not resolve following the applied medical plan of Phenergan 25mg

5th March 2022 - Following Medical treatments of Acute Allergy Oedema to the Covid-19 Immunisation - Conducted without the correct Medical procedure of testing by two allergists resulting in the delayed Immune system response of Acute Allergy Oedema

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] 8th March 2022 is still suffering from symptoms of allergy reaction to the administered Covid-19 immunisation and the immune response of Acute Allergy Oedema, which include, sneezing, congestion in the nasal passages, triggered allergy asthma and reoccurring hive like rash on chest region and facial region (flare ups)

28th March 2022 - Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical association

Appointment : 11am

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was advised by Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical Association that further investigation , including testing was essential to her medical safety to find the reactive allergen involving medications and immunisations and proceeded with a referral to an allergist, Dr Frank Kette, Adelaide Allergy Centre

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] cancelled the appointment involving the referral to the allergist, Dr Frank Kette, Adelaide Allergy Centre because of her suffering from Extreme Anxiety of having medical procedures conducted, as result of the Acute Allergy Oedema she suffered as a result of the administered Covid-19 Immunisation and the medical negligence and endangerment to her life of the two allergists involved, who did not conduct testing for an allergy reaction according to her Extensive medical history of allergy reactions to several medications, including immunisations prior to their medical professional opinion to proceed with the Covid-19 immunisation that resulted in the delayed immune response of Acute Allergy Oedema and the patients, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] suffering and endangerment to her life (Rapid breathing, Extreme Respiratory distress) Psychological effects of the Medical neglect and endangerment - Loss of trust in the Medical Industry and of Medical Professionals

The patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED], a Carer for her parents who suffer from Terminal Cancer and a Heart condition, and is an Author under contract with Austin Macauley Publishers, London suffered the loss of 2 months loss of work capacity and unable to care for her terminally ill parents, who were reliant on her care, as a result of the medical neglect and endangerment of the two allergists involved, which resulted in the patients suffering of Acute Allergy Oedema, as result of the administered Covid-19 immunisation conducted at the Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic on the 8th February 2022, and the neglect of conducting proper medical procedures according to the referral by Dr Daehn, Kadina Medical Association, involving being tested for allergy reactions prior to the immunisation being administered because of the patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Extensive Medical History of acute allergy reactions to several medications, which included immunisations

8 DAY DELAYED IMMUNE RESPONSE ; ACUTE ALLERGY OEDEMA CONSISTED OF;

Commencement : Symptoms

- Severe sneezing
- Hive like rash in appearance - facial, neck, chest region - progressing to arms and legs - Severely itchy
- Swelling and congestion in nasal passages - breathing difficulties
- Insomnia
- Slight dizziness - coming and going
- Slight nausea - coming and going
- Irritability

Progressing symptoms - 3 days following commencement

- Severe sinus like symptoms in nasal passages - congestion dry feeling
- Severe hives like rash progressed to all areas of the body - progressed to appear as skin lesions - Extremely itchy - painful - needle like burning pain - Can't bear to be touched by hands or fabric - sensitive to touch
- Sleeplessness
- Extreme Swelling around eye areas, lips and sinus areas
- Unable to breath through nasal passages - dry like congestion - clear mucus continuously being expelled through nasal passages without any effect of clearing the congestion
- Loss of taste
- Loss of appetite
- Pressure felt in facial regions from continuous swelling occurring

Progressing symptoms - 5 days following commencement - 8.30am Prior to presentation of the patient at the Wallaroo Hospital Emergency Ward

- Severe / extreme swelling of areas of the eyes, sinus, lips and facial regions
- Lips swollen - numb in feeling - sore to touch - sensitive to touch
- Unable to breath through nasal passages - congestion progressing to yellow in colour with blood staining
- Hive like rash progressed to skin lesions progressing to cover areas of the body, facial, neck and chest regions - Extremely painful - extremely itchy - burning needle like pain - skin feels inflamed / on fire
- Pressure in sinus and facial regions increasing to cause painful shooting pain in head region - feels like swelling of the brain - shooting all over in different areas of the head continuously
- Feeling of over active system - system scrambled - extreme alertness / over active
- Feeling of intense pressure in facial and head regions as a result of the Extreme swelling
- Extreme tightness and pain in chest region progressing to throat area, triggered allergy asthma and a bronchitis sounding cough

- Respiratory distress - having trouble breathing, catching a breath
- Rapid breathing
- Bronchitis sounding cough progressing to mucus expelled from chest through coughing
- Feeling of shakiness on the inside of the body - not visible on exterior of the body
- Feeling extremely unwell
- Feeling panicky - Respiratory distress - trouble breathing - extreme tightness and pain in chest - heart (rapid breathing)

Patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] diagnosed with Acute Allergy Oedema, as a result of the Covid-19 immunisation on conducted on the 8th February 2022 at the Royal Adelaide Hospital Specialist Vaccination Clinic - Patient, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] prescribed medication and placed on a medical plan - 8 day delayed immune response following Covid-19 immunisation Pfizer

Commencement of Treatment Plan

- **Prednisolone 25 mg**
- **2 tablets daily for 3 days**
- **1 tablet daily for 3 days**
- **1/2 tablet daily for 4 days**
- **Cease medication**

2 hours following commencement of treatment plan - 12.30pm

- Extreme severe swelling of eye, sinus and lip areas dissipating
- Congestion of nasal sinus passages loosening and ability be expelled - breathing through nasal passages commencing
- Skin lesion type rash becoming less itchy and sensitive
- Pressure in facial region and head region dissipating
- Pressure shooting pain in head ceasing - dissipating
- Nasal passages congestion progressing from a feeling of dryness of congestion to a feeling of being moisture / wetness of congestion
- Irritability ceasing - dissipating
- Lip swelling dissipating - numbness ceasing / dissipating / sensitivity ceasing / dissipating - soreness decreasing
- Rash on neck area decreasing / dissipating
- Congestion from nasal passages progressing from yellow in colour with blood spotting to clear in appearance
- Extreme sneezing dissipating
- Night period - Sleeplessness from severe nasal congestion and burning sensitivity of the skin on facial and body regions when in laying position present causing sleeplessness

Day 2 - Treatment Plan

- Am on waking - Severe swelling in eye areas and nasal areas reducing
- Skin type lesions reducing in redness and size - skin peeling at site of skin lesions
- Nasal congestion reducing / dissipating - ability to breath through nasal passages - congestion still present but not severe

- Facial region skin still sensitive and inflamed
- Bronchitis sounding cough still present
- Tightness in chest, respiratory system and throat not present
- Lip swelling dissipating - lip sensitivity and soreness still present
- Feeling of unwellness dissipating but still present
- Irritability dissipating but still present
- Swelling in neck and under chin areas dissipating
- 4.30pm - applied Vaseline to skin lesion rash - continued throughout medication treatment plan

1st photo - Wallaroo Hospital Emergency Ward - Prior to presenting - 8.30am prior to first course of Medical Treatment Plan

2nd photo - 2 hours following commencement of Medical Treatment Plan - 12.30pm

3rd photo - 21/2 hours following commencement of Medical Treatment Plan - 3.30pm

Day 2 - Evening / night hours - Following commencement of Medical Treatment Plan

- Rash and skin lesions - redness slightly remaining - skin tone evening out to normal tones and contours - sensitivity and soreness dissipating / decreasing
- Swelling in eye areas and nasal passages minimal and still decreasing
- Rash still slightly itchy in areas of the arms
- Nasal congestion over production still occurring in evening and night hours - nasal passages still blocked - can't breath through nasal passages
- Extreme bronchitis sounding cough / chesty cough still present - no mucus being expelled from coughing from chest / ceased - Pain and tightening in chest ceased
- Effects of medication being felt / side effects - Sleeplessness - Extreme agitation - irritability - tremors / shakiness felt throughout inside of the body but not visible on exterior of the body
Headaches - confusion - forgetfulness - a feeling of disassociation - heavy limbs - pinpoint pupils - aggression - feeling of manic nervous system - feeling of drug induced spaciness in mind and body - emotional

Day 3 - Following commencement of Medical Treatment Plan

- Effects of medication still present - manic nervous system calming / returning to normal state - aggression replaced by normal reactions and emotional state - headaches ceased - agitation and irritability ceased

Afternoon

- Body and mind returning to normality from drug induced effects of the medication
- Slight increase in thirst / dry mouth
- Rash - skin tone and swelling returning to normal
- Rash - itchiness ceased
- Bronchitis sounding cough still present but ceasing - dissipating
- Nasal congestion loosening and being expelled - breathing through nasal passages
- Sense of taste returning
- Feeling of unwellness ceasing - returning to normal wellness
- Still resting to aid recovery

Day 4 - Following commencement of Medical Treatment Plan

- Nasal congestion loose - hay fever allergy in appearance and symptoms
- Chest - Bronchitis sounding cough dissipating - slight
- Rash - ceased - skin tone returned to normal
- Swelling - no swelling present
- Feeling of unwellness ceased - normal health restoring
- No breathing difficulties
- Sleeping returning
- Appetite returning
- Taste restored

Following first course of Medical Treatment Plan - Symptoms still present

Acute Allergy Oedema as a result of the Covid-19 immunisation requiring a second course of the Medical Treatment Plan and continual medical treatment plan of Phenergan 25mg for persisting symptoms following a two course medical plan treatment of Prednisolone 25mg
