All flights are operated by Associated Aircraft Group, Inc. on FAA Air Carrier certificate number AYP340S.

Please advise all passengers that carrying hazardous materials or dangerous goods is not permitted. Dangerous goods are defined as substances that pose a significant risk to health, safety or property when transported by air. Many everyday materials are classified as dangerous goods and may be harmful to our passengers, employees, or aircraft. Items such as pressurized gases, corrosive substances, flammable liquids, spare lithium-ion batteries, and explosives are considered dangerous goods. The use of e-cigarettes is prohibited.

As of April 24, 2017 an FAA regulation requires all passengers on Part 135 helicopter flights to wear life preservers when flying beyond autorotational distance from the shoreline, and the crew may take alternate routes to comply with the regulation if passengers fail to wear these life preservers. Pilots will brief passengers on the location and use of the life preservers before each flight. These life preservers clip around the waist and can be donned quickly in the event of an emergency. Although this requirement does not apply to Part 91 flights, these life preservers are a replacement of the life preservers previously available on AAG's fleet.
