Hi- now hanging in city alone while teenage girls are at concert at Radio City! Anyway- free time...

So, my builder had a 10% discount at County Appliance in Stamford. Glen T. helped me. I would say to go there to get a 411 on different brands - what's hot, etc. I almost went with the new induction cooktop bc it heats so quickly and yet you can't burn yourself by touching it.

But I decided on double ovens, gas range top (drawers for pans underneath) and microwave drawer.

After all my research, asking for recommendations, etc. I think Wolf and Viking are very similar if you are considering 1 of the 2. I still think they are top 2, but you can find very similar for less.

We had Viking in our (new) rental townhouse and I loved them. For this house, I got Wolf ovens and range, subzero refrig (think its same company?) Asko dishwasher- it's good but don't love the touch control panel, sharp microwave drawer (which, I was told, is "the" new thing- takes up no counter space, but eats up drawer space, so...)

I actually liked the handles on Viking oven and non- touch screen controls better than Wolf. But... Wolf was offering a deal- if you got the 4 items, a range too, 2 ovens and refrig. - you got \$1500 discount.

So- I would advise, as follows:

1). Go to PC Richard & Sons (we almost bought there) and get an update on what products are out there now- what deals coming up, etc. or another big appliance chain.

2). Go to a more local appliance store (County is good and often has sales) and have someone do the same thing for you.

Then decide. Every manufacturer usually has a pkg. deal of some sort going on or coming up in Feb.

County may not have as many brands/ models, but they have the good ones.

I also did price checking online after getting the scoop from appliance stores.

It comes down to style preference. In the end , top 3 brands are all going to work great- it's impt that you like the controls, etc.

FYI- Wolf range has one back burner that is just for "simmering" - flame doesn't go full throttle.

Hope that helps - lmk if you have any more specific ??'s? I asked people too. So confusing.

And you can come look at ours if you'd like!

Where are you guys now? Any framing yet?
