The documents we will need are:

1. [REDACTED] birth certificate with a certified English translation,
2. A complete copy of [REDACTED] passport (even the blank pages),
3. A copy of [REDACTED] form I-94 (the white card in your passport)-- I already have this;
4. 8 passport style photos of [REDACTED] and 2 of [REDACTED] (you can have them taken at Kinko's, Walgreen's, Eckerds, etc.)
6. Copy of your marriage license,
7. Copy of [REDACTED] birth certificate and US passport photo page
8. Copy of divorce certificates, if you guys ever got married before
9. [REDACTED] sealed medical examination- you need to go to a designated doctor for this, you can find the list of the doctors at:

Just enter your zip code. This may take a few days and they may not be able to give an appointment immediately, so start working on it now. The fee for this service differs from doctor to doctor-- so shop around.
