**PLAINTIFF █'s RESPONSE TO DEFENDANT EPSTEIN'S MOTION FOR
PARTIAL SUMMARY JUDGMENT ON COUNT I OF PLAINTIFF'S
SECOND AMENDED COMPLAINT**

Plaintiff █ hereby responds to defendant Epstein's Motion for Partial Summary judgment on Count I. Epstein claims that he is entitled to summary judgment on Count 1 because there is no private right of action under various criminal statutes.
