No. The Apple TV (3<sup>rd</sup> generation- latest and greatest) does work but requires internet access.

You have internet access on board your aircraft through the Aircell system when you are above 10,000 feet over the continental USA.

Since you do not have internet access when on the ground, we tested the system using Larry's phone set up as a hot spot and played a movie that was stored on his i-Pad.
