Here are three options for a touchscreen white board for 71st:

This first is an iPad-driven model.

It runs off an iPad attached to it, so it runs all iPad & iPhone apps, giving an advantage of a known interface. We'd have to find a whiteboard application for it, but I'm sure that wouldn't be too difficult.

Prices @ \$10,00 for a 55" screen; \$15,000 for a 70"

The second is the Sharp AQUOS Board

It runs an embedded suite of software (including a whiteboard package), with the drivers needed to connect it to a mac mini or windows computer if desired.
