“I was weak, had a fever of 103, couldn’t even keep down water,” Cedric Sturdevant recalled. Fifty-two years old, he has shared the story of his own H.I.V. illness over and over in his improvised role as visiting nurse, motivational coach and father figure to a growing number of young gay men and transgender women suffering from H.I.V. and AIDS in Jackson, Miss. For this week’s cover article, Linda Villarosa reports on [America’s hidden H.I.V. epidemic: Black gay and bisexual men have a higher rate of infection than any country in the world](#). Using public-health data, policy and financial research, and interviews with experts and activists, Villarosa examines the history of how the AIDS crisis first took hold decades ago, the advances in lifesaving treatment and how fateful decisions along the way led to one of the nation’s most shameful public-health failures. It’s “a present that looks like the past,” she writes — “but only for some.”

Elsewhere in the magazine, Jesse Baron profiles Andrew Left, who [hunts for corporate fraud and gets rich](#) doing it. Elisabeth Zerofsky writes about a mostly Muslim suburb of Paris where [a new political party](#) is emerging. And Annalisa Quinn writes about how the “[witch hunt](#),” which once made a scapegoat of the defenseless, has become a complaint of the powerful.




