This is absolutely confidential as I'm sure you're aware. I have submitted something similar as a proposal to the Packard Foundation. Have a read and let me know what you think.

I would add that one thing that would be transformative would be to obtain funds that would allow us to recruit the very best graduate students to our Chemical Biology program at UCSD. This includes my lab and others. This is how you change the game at a research institute. We have great ideas, and NEED the best PhD students to pull it off.
