 2 Q. Again, my assistant is sitting in the room.
 3 If you wouldn't mind, just --
 4 MS. YOUNG: Hi. Marissa --
 5 MS. [REDACTED]: Marissa? Hi. I'm [REDACTED]
 6 BY DR. HALL:
 7 Q. I believe that was an arrangement worked out
 8 between the lawyers that there be one person present.
 9 A. Okay.

 3 BY DR. HALL:
 4 Q. If you want to, write the name of your counsel
 5 in.
 6 A. As in Brad?
 7 Q. As in Brad, yeah.
 8 Then, also, we're going to be doing some
 9 testing later on. This is again, I think this was in
 10 the original packet we sent you. I'm not sure if you
 11 received that or not, the patient history questionnaire.
 12 A. No.
 13 Q. You did not get that?
 14 A. No.
 15 Q. We'll be filling that out later in the day
 16 then.
 17 A. Okay.
 18 Q. If I can have you read this and sign this as
 19 well saying that you realize we're going to be testing.

 5 A. Nothing on those terms.
 6 Q. Okay. And did you meet your normal
 7 developmental milestones, walking, talking on time?
 8 A. Yes.
 9 Q. Any significant childhood illnesses?
 10 A. I'm sorry?
 11 Q. Any significant childhood illnesses?
 12 A. No.
 13 Q. I mean, other than mumps is a little rarer
 14 nowadays, but I mean, chicken pox or anything like that,
 15 nothing out of the ordinary?
 16 A. No.
 17 Q. Okay. And your date of birth?
 18 A. [REDACTED]
 19 Q. And can you tell me a little bit about your
 20 parents?
 21 A. My mother's name is [REDACTED] She lives [REDACTED]
 22 in [REDACTED]
 23 Q. Okay.
 24 A. My father's name is [REDACTED]
 25 Q. Thank you.

1 health history or problems or --
 2 A. Right.
 3 Q. Okay. Roughly, how old is mom and dad?
 4 A. I can't -- my mom is -- honestly, she's lied
 5 about her age for so long time. I believe she is
 6 probably like 45 or 46. Maybe older, I'm not really
 7 positive. And my father is probably around 50 years
 8 old, give or take.
 9 Q. I'll put 45-ish.
 10 A. Okay.
 11 Q. Any brothers or sisters?
 12 A. I have one brother. Well, actually two
 13 brothers. One's my half brother, one's my biological
 14 brother. And my biological brother is [REDACTED]
 15 Q. Okay.
 16 A. And my stepbrother is [REDACTED]
 17 Q. I'm sorry, is [REDACTED]
 18 A. [REDACTED]
 19 Q. And how old is [REDACTED]
 20 A. My brother is [REDACTED] and my younger brother, I
 21 don't really have that much of a relationship with him.
 22 I believe he's [REDACTED]

 20 relationship with dad, but do you know anything about
 21 his medical history or --
 22 A. No, I don't, but I do believe that right now
 23 he's [REDACTED]

 4 A. I'm not really sure what kind of [REDACTED] but
 5 my grandfather has [REDACTED] in him on my mother's side.
 6 Q. Okay. How is your relationship with your
 7 mother?
 8 A. Very good.
 9 Q. Has it always been that way or has it
 10 sometimes been better than others?
 11 A. It's definitely been better than others.
 12 Q. But currently good?
 13 A. Correct.
 14 Q. Okay.
 15 A. Even through our ups and downs, we've always
 16 maintained a pretty good relationship. I've always
 17 confided in her.
 18 Q. Okay. And your father, you said you don't
 19 have any relationship with him now --
 20 A. Right.
 21 Q. -- but you did know him?
 22 A. No, not really. When I was younger, I would
 23 go to his house for summer, and the school year I would
 24 be with my mother, but other than that, I -- I don't
 25 have any relationship with him.

1 Q. How old were you when your -- actually, were
 2 your parents ever married?
 3 A. Yes.
 4 Q. Okay. How old were you when they divorced or
 5 separated?
 6 A. I'd say probably two to three. I don't even
 7 remember any of that, though, so it's hard to really
 8 say.
 9 Q. Okay. So your earliest memories was just with
 10 mom; dad was already out of the picture?
 11 A. Pretty much, yes.
 12 Q. And, you know, if I say something or
 13 paraphrase and it's not right, please correct me.
 14 A. Yeah, definitely. I mean, I do have some
 15 memories with my father when I was younger but, I mean,
 16 not very many; do you know what I mean?
 17 Q. Okay.
 18 A. So...
 19 Q. Were there ever any stepfathers or --
 20 A. Yes.
 21 Q. -- live-in boyfriends?
 22 A. Yes. [REDACTED]
 23 [REDACTED]
 24 Q. [REDACTED]
 25 Okay. And is your mother still with him,

1 or --
 2 A. Yes.
 3 Q. How long have they been together?
 4 A. Probably since I've been six or seven years
 5 old.
 6 Q. Okay. And how is your relationship with
 7 [REDACTED] Am I pronouncing that right?
 8 A. Yes. [REDACTED] Very good.
 9 Q. What's he do for a living?
 10 A. He -- actually, he has two jobs. Well,
 11 actually, I think right now he might have three. He
 12 does [REDACTED]
 13 Q. Okay. Man of many talents?
 14 A. Yes.
 15 Q. Now, the half brother you have, is that
 16 through your father or through your mother?
 17 A. Yes, through my father.
 18 Q. Okay. And did you ever have a stepmother or
 19 anything of that nature?
 20 A. Not for very long. Just maybe two summers
 21 when I went over there. Her name is [REDACTED] I'm not
 22 sure of her last name now.
 23 Q. Fair. Fair enough.
 24 A. Uh-huh.
 25 Q. Okay. Any stepbrothers or sisters?

1 A. Yeah. [REDACTED] had two kids, [REDACTED]
 2 [REDACTED]
 3 Q. Any relationship with them?
 4 A. I have -- I sometimes, over the computer, have
 5 talked to -- maybe two years ago, I went and seen [REDACTED]
 6 and her family. I talk to them on the computer every
 7 now and then.
 8 Q. Okay. So --
 9 A. And they're located in [REDACTED]
 10 [REDACTED] I don't know where he's located at, honestly,
 11 but I know [REDACTED] and her family are in [REDACTED]
 12 where I was born.
 13 Q. Okay. Again, I don't want to put words in
 14 your mouth: Cordial relationship, amicable, just kind
 15 of there?
 16 A. Yeah, just on and off, acquaintance, good
 17 acquaintance, I guess.
 18 Q. Does Mr. -- I apologize --
 19 A. [REDACTED]
 20 Q. Thank you. [REDACTED] yeah, does he have any
 21 children?
 22 A. No, no.
 23 Q. Okay. Kind of the extended family, has there
 24 been any issues with mental illness, depression,
 25 schizophrenia, bipolar or anxiety?

1 A. With?
 2 Q. Aunts, uncles, grandparents, cousins.
 3 A. Well, my [REDACTED]
 4 [REDACTED] so...
 5 Q. I'm sorry, your grandfather?
 6 A. Yes, my mother's dad.
 7 Q. Which [REDACTED]
 8 A. I think it was [REDACTED].
 9 Q. Do you know what he's been diagnosed with?
 10 A. No, I do not. [REDACTED]
 11 [REDACTED]

 14 know, but other than that, I know that my grandmother,
 15 my mom's mom, and she's going to be 80, she's a go --
 16 she's a, you know, she's a go-getter, she doesn't seem
 17 ill at all. She doesn't even seem 80; she seems
 18 probably 60.
 19 My father's dad, and his name is [REDACTED] as
 20 well, my grandfather, he seems okay. I do talk to some
 21 of my dad's -- like my aunts and cousins and stuff like
 22 that on my dad's side.
 23 And I'm sorry, you did ask me if I had cousins
 24 and stuff like that, didn't you?
 25 Q. If any of them had mental illness.

1 A. Oh, okay. No, not to my knowledge.
 2 Q. No, I mean, there could be hundreds.
 3 A. Right. Yeah, I do, I have a whole bunch of
 4 them.
 5 Q. We would take up eight hours just talking
 6 about each and every one of them.
 7 A. Exactly.
 8 Q. Are there any that are significant in your
 9 life that you see on a monthly basis or is it kind of
 10 family get-togethers you see them?
 11 A. Well, they're in [REDACTED] and my -- most of my
 12 dad's family. The rest them are in [REDACTED] and then
 13 me and my mom and my brother and my stepfather, [REDACTED] we
 14 live here, but -- and my [REDACTED]
 15 Q. Okay. Now, a lot of times terms get used, and
 16 what they mean by kind of general population and what
 17 they mean medically are a little different, so when you
 18 [REDACTED]

 23 Q. Okay. Who's had issues with substances?

 5 yourself.
 6 A. Okay.
 7 Q. But how about your family?
 8 A. My mother, she is a recovering addict for
 9 going on three years now.
 10 Q. Okay. Good for her.
 11 A. As well as my stepfather, [REDACTED]
 12 Q. What did mom use?
 13 A. She was addicted to crack cocaine, both her
 14 and my stepfather.
 15 Q. Okay. And do you know roughly how long she
 16 used for?
 17 A. Over 20 years.
 18 Q. Okay. And this is -- you're [REDACTED] now, so she
 19 started after you were born?
 20 A. Honestly, I don't know. I don't know if she
 21 was -- you know, was using and got pregnant with me and
 22 stopped. I don't really know the whole scenario, but...
 23 Q. Do you know one way or the other if you may
 24 have been exposed in the utero to cocaine?
 25 A. I'm sorry?

1 Q. Did she use while she was pregnant?
 2 A. She -- she's told me no, because I had asked
 3 her.
 4 Q. Okay. All right. And was it just cocaine, or
 5 did she use anything else like alcohol or marijuana
 6 or...
 7 A. No, I believe just crack cocaine.
 8 Q. How did she get clean?
 9 A. She had a -- well, she lost everything she had
 10 multiple times and she just hit rock bottom. I guess
 11 she just was ready to change, I suppose. Ever since,
 12 she's held strong and hasn't gone back to that
 13 lifestyle.
 14 (Brief interruption in proceedings.)
 15 BY DR. HALL:
 16 Q. I just had to stop there for a second due to
 17 mechanical problems with the camera.
 18 So we were talking about mom and how she had a
 19 little bit of a substance problem.
 20 A. Right.
 21 Q. How did that affect your relationship with
 22 her?
 23 A. Well, not only did it affect our relationship
 24 but it affected my whole lifestyle for when I was
 25 younger.

1 Q. Okay. In what way?
 2 A. Homeless, and every way around. I mean, I
 3 guess that's generally everything. You know, my
 4 schooling.
 5 Q. Okay. How long were you homeless for?
 6 A. I mean, they always had, as in homeless, they
 7 always had a place -- they were always -- had a place to
 8 stay. They lived in efficiencies, hotels. They would
 9 kind of jump from hotel to hotel or whatever, and I
 10 could always go stay with them, but I never wanted to go
 11 stay with them because of them using, obviously. So I
 12 don't think nobody wants to see that.
 13 Q. Right.
 14 A. So between the age of, I would say, 13, 14,
 15 around about --
 16 Q. Okay.
 17 A. -- until she got clean three years ago, I was
 18 kind of -- I was -- I mean, after I turned [REDACTED] I --
 19 well, before I was even [REDACTED] I made my own way, started
 20 so I could, you know, make money to provide for my own
 21 self. But before that, you know, I was -- stay at a
 22 friend's house, jump from friend's to friend's house.
 23 And a lot of the parents knew. You know, it wasn't a
 24 secret that -- what my situation was, so, you know, one
 25 friend in particular, her father really knew what the

1 situation was and took me in for quite a while.
 2 Q. Okay. Can I get the name of that person --
 3 A. Yeah [REDACTED]
 4 Q. Okay. And how long did you stay with the
 5 [REDACTED]
 6 A. For a while. Probably -- probably three years
 7 off and on, give or take.
 8 Q. Okay. Was DCF ever involved when you were
 9 growing up?
 10 A. No. Weird enough, no.
 11 Q. And how did your brother do with all of this?
 12 Was he also kind of --
 13 A. Actually, my brother, before my mother really
 14 got heavy into her addiction, I believe she was -- she
 15 would always kind of maintain her house, like a
 16 functioning addict. And so during that time, my brother
 17 was there, but my brother kind of was going down the
 18 wrong road. My mom seen that and he actually was sent
 19 over to the West Coast with my wild side of the family,
 20 my father's side, and he lived with my grandparents for
 21 pretty much the whole time that my mom really was out
 22 and about doing her own thing, so...
 23 Q. Okay. Was there ever episodes of violence
 24 between you and your mom related to her drug use?

 11 A. I believe I was 16.
 12 Q. Okay. Do you remember the month or year or
 13 how do you kind of keep that straight in your head time
 14 wise? Any --
 15 A. I don't really remember the month or year. I
 16 would maybe say -- I honestly -- I couldn't even tell
 17 you. I couldn't even tell you.
 18 Q. Okay.
 19 [REDACTED]
 20 Q. Okay. Yeah, I can check if I need to. I was
 21 just -- sometimes people have certain events in their
 22 lives that they remember things about --
 23 A. Right.
 24 Q. -- you know, their 16th birthday --
 25 A. Definitely. Definitely.

1 Q. -- first car, somebody they were dating --
 2 A. Right.
 3 Q. -- and they can kind of put things together
 4 that way.
 5 A. Put it together.
 6 Q. So I was wondering if you had any time stamps
 7 in your life for what you used to --
 8 A. Honestly, I -- now that I think about it, I
 9 think I was a little younger than age 16 when that all
 10 occurred.
 11 Q. I'll put a question mark next to it.
 12 A. Right, but no. I mean, I know I was -- I was
 13 probably -- I think I was probably starting to be a
 14 freshman.
 15 Q. Okay.
 16 A. I was supposed to be going to school. I think
 17 it was in the summer time, but I could be wrong.
 18 Q. Fair enough.
 19 And that would have been about seven years ago
 20 now or eight years ago?
 21 A. Well, I'm [REDACTED]
 22 [REDACTED] So, yeah, about
 23 seven or eight years ago.
 24 Q. How did you get along with your stepfather? I
 25 apologize if I've already asked that. You said

1 generally a good relationship?
 2 A. Yeah, generally good.
 3 Q. Okay. Ever get into fights with him or have
 4 any trouble --
 5 A. I mean, arguments over obviously the crazy
 6 lifestyle they were living and everything else. So
 7 arguments, but there was always unconditional love. I
 8 could always -- if there was anything ever wrong, you
 9 know, sometimes they would be kind of missing in action,
 10 but for the most part, I did know where they were. If
 11 they were in hotel rooms, we did keep contact. If there
 12 was anything ever wrong -- they were using, it sounds
 13 crazy, but they did give me unconditional love, like,
 14 you know...
 15 Q. Okay. All right. It's good to know that you
 16 felt that they were at least there.
 17 A. Definitely. They might not have been there,
 18 you know, drug-wise. I know that they were using and
 19 everything else, but my mother --
 20 Q. Do you know roughly how much they were using a
 21 day?
 22 A. No, I have no idea.
 23 Q. Okay. And it was crack so they were smoking
 24 it?
 25 A. Yes.

1 Q. Did they ever shoot it or snort it?
 2 A. I have no idea.
 3 Q. You never witnessed them doing it in front of
 4 you?
 5 A. Right.
 6 Q. Okay. I trained up in the Baltimore area, and
 7 I saw a lot of very heavy cocaine use.
 8 A. Oh, okay.
 9 Q. Folks up there usually would either go by
 10 number of rocks they were using or dollar amount.
 11 A. Oh.
 12 Q. Just like kind of an idea down in [REDACTED]
 13 [REDACTED] how much would a rock of cocaine go for?
 14 A. I'm -- I don't really know. I would guess 20
 15 bucks, 25 bucks, I think.
 16 Q. Okay. Would that be a big rock you could
 17 break up into multiples, or...
 18 A. I have no idea.
 19 Q. No idea?
 20 A. I have no idea.
 21 Q. Okay. We used to talk about \$5 and \$10 hits
 22 all the time in Baltimore.
 23 A. Okay.
 24 Q. I just want to make sure my --
 25 A. Right. I mean, they could have that down

1 here, too. I'm not really, really sure.
 2 Q. They had the eight balls, which were the big
 3 ones but again, you were supposed to break that up or do
 4 whatever.
 5 A. No.
 6 Q. Okay. Any issues with alcohol or...
 7 A. No.
 8 Q. How did they get money to support their habit?
 9 A. Like I said, my mom was always kind of like an
 10 active addict, so she always carried a job, and for the
 11 most part my stepfather did, too.
 12 Q. Okay. So there was no stealing or --
 13 A. No. My mother was always a wait --
 14 Q. -- trading sex for favors?
 15 A. No. My mother was always a waitress at --
 16 like at [REDACTED] she worked for a very long time.
 17 [REDACTED] various restaurants. She always stayed at
 18 each restaurant for a year, you know. Always long term
 19 for the most part.
 20 And my stepfather [REDACTED] ever since I could
 21 remember, he did [REDACTED] until just recently when he
 22 started [REDACTED] But he's been in
 23 the [REDACTED] business for a really long time.
 24 Q. Okay. I'm just going to...
 25 And I know we talked about this a little bit,

1 so pardon me if there is a little overlap, but in
 2 general, how would you describe your childhood?
 3 A. It could have been better, I suppose, I would
 4 say.
 5 Q. Okay.
 6 A. And more -- more of my teenage years, I guess
 7 I would say. As my childhood, I always remember happy
 8 memories and stuff like that. Like, I don't remember
 9 ever being sad or neglected or hungry or anything like
 10 that. It was more when I turned, you know, 13, when I
 11 got into my teenage years.
 12 Q. Okay. So teenage years were definitely worse
 13 for you than --
 14 A. Definitely.
 15 Q. Okay. How were you disciplined as a child
 16 growing up?
 17 A. I mean, if I did something wrong, talked back,
 18 I got put in time-out. There was definitely some form
 19 of discipline. She would never let me do whatever I
 20 wanted to but, you know, when I turned 12 and or 13, she
 21 was kind of wanting to do what she wanted to do, and she
 22 did kind of get more lenient on me where I was able to
 23 go out. Sometimes I would leave and not tell her where
 24 I was going or, you know...
 25 Q. Okay. So it was never like physical

1 were younger, I never remember us getting really
 2 physical with one another.
 3 Q. Okay. What type of activities or clubs did
 4 you belong to?
 5 A. When I was in middle school -- I was always a
 6 straight A student from elementary to middle before, and
 7 then I dropped out. I was always honor roll, straight A
 8 student, I was in a lot of activities, I was on the
 9 track team, I was the first chair trumpet player.
 10 Q. Okay.
 11 A. I was the captain of the cheerleading squad, I
 12 was a mediator.
 13 Q. Hold on one second. So captain of the
 14 cheerleading squad, first trumpet?
 15 A. First chair trumpet player.
 16 Q. And that was school band I guess, or marching
 17 band?
 18 A. Yes. It was [REDACTED] this was all
 19 at.
 20 Q. Okay.
 21 A. Where [REDACTED] that one teacher got shot
 22 at, it's the same. I don't know if you probably heard
 23 of that, around two years ago.
 24 Q. No. I didn't grow up in [REDACTED]
 25 A. Okay.

1 punishment like spankings or anything like that; it was
 2 time-out and grounding?
 3 A. Right, no. My mother has never put her hand
 4 on me [REDACTED]
 5 [REDACTED]
 6 Q. Okay. And any major physical confrontations
 7 with your brother or --
 8 A. Oh, me and him?
 9 Q. Yes.
 10 A. Yes. When we were younger, before he got sent
 11 over to the West Coast, we used to fight like cats and
 12 dogs.
 13 Q. And would that be kind of like -- it's hard to
 14 even say, because there's no such answer to normal
 15 brother/sister at times, but normal brother and sister
 16 type of things?
 17 A. Right. You know, I would use the phone and he
 18 wants to use the phone and I'm on it first and it
 19 escalated. Just very simple stupid stuff we would argue
 20 about.
 21 Q. Okay. And would it get physical or just --
 22 A. I mean, a couple of times we did honestly get
 23 physical with one another but, you know, that was kind
 24 of when I was 12, 13, before he was sent over to the
 25 West Coast, when we were a little bit older. When we

1 Q. Who is [REDACTED]
 2 A. Oh, it's a teacher that actually got shot and
 3 killed there. A lot of people know that school, that's
 4 the only reason I brought it up.
 5 Q. Did you know him?
 6 A. No, I didn't know the teacher.
 7 Q. And you said a mediator?
 8 A. Mediator.
 9 Q. Okay. I'm not familiar with that program.
 10 A. You can get it as an elective, and it's when
 11 counselors, the counselors of the school pick a
 12 selective two or three people or four people to have it
 13 as an elective, and when me as a student knows that this
 14 girl and this girl is having a problem, we would call
 15 them out of their class and put them in the counselor's
 16 office and kind of try to mediate their problem before a
 17 fight occurred or anything like that.
 18 Q. Okay. How many times did you, I guess, do
 19 peer mediation?
 20 A. Multiple -- a lot. I don't...
 21 Q. Ballpark it, 5, 10, 20?
 22 A. I would say 5 to 10 times.
 23 Q. Were you ever threatened because you did this
 24 type of work or have any negative repercussions from it?
 25 A. No.

1 When I was in middle school, I was generally
2 kind of like a popular kid, quote/unquote. I didn't
3 really have any problems with really anybody.

4 Q. I actually put the quote/unquote there.

5 Okay. And outside of school, what would you
6 like to do?

7 A. I did all kinds of stuff when I was, you
8 know -- most the time I was after -- after school, I
9 would be at school because I did do cheerleading and I
10 did play the trumpet and I would do track and I did, you
11 know, a lot of stuff. So generally, in school, after
12 school, it kept me busy, you know, so...

13 Q. What did you run when you ran track?

14 A. I'm sorry?

15 Q. What type of track did you do, was it
16 sprinting or long distance?

17 A. It was long, like the mile runs.

18 Q. Do you have a faith?

19 A. I'm sorry?

20 Q. Do you have a faith? Do you attend a church
21 or are you spiritual?

22 A. Oh, yes. I'm a [REDACTED]

23 Q. Did you attend church as a child growing up?

24 A. No.

25 Q. Do you attend now?

1 A. Once in a while. My mom goes on Sundays and
2 Wednesdays each week, so sometimes I go with her.

3 Q. And again, ballpark, is that like once a week
4 type thing, once a month, four or five times a month?

5 A. I would say two to three times a month.

6 Q. Better than my friend who considers himself a
7 Christmas candle/Easter lily. He shows up on two --

8 A. That's funny.

9 Q. Actually, I think it's his pastor who
10 considers him that and he keeps reminding people to come
11 more often.

12 As a child growing up, were you ever
13 physically or sexually abused?

14 A. Yes, I was.

15 Q. Could you tell me about that?

16 A. It's -- I -- only one time I was sexually
17 abused, when I was introduced to Jeffrey Epstein.

18 Q. Okay. Before Jeffrey Epstein, were you ever
19 sexually or physically abused?

20 A. No.

21 Q. Okay, and we'll get more into Epstein later.

22 A. Okay.

23 Q. I'm not ignoring that. I'm trying to group
24 all of that at one time.

25 A. Right.

1 Q. Did you ever witness any domestic violence in
2 either your family or your friends?

3 A. No. As in relationship, mother and father
4 fighting?

5 Q. Mother and father fighting.

6 A. Right, no.

7 Q. Okay. Anything else about your childhood,
8 through probably middle school and before, that I should
9 know or come to mind or I haven't directly asked about
10 that you think is important for me to understand?

11 A. That's pretty much it. I think we covered
12 most everything.

13 Q. Anybody important in your life that passed
14 away during that time?

15 A. No.

16 Q. Sometimes I --

17 A. Right.

18 Q. -- questions pop in mind.

19 A. No.

20 Q. And no traumas during that period of time?

21 A. No.

22 Q. Or anything that you would consider --

23 A. Right, as trauma, no.

24 Q. Because that can be a very broad word.

25 Okay. I apologize, you were telling me a

1 little bit about your educational history. Let me get a
2 little more in depth there.

3 A. Okay.

4 Q. Have you ever been in any special education
5 classes?

6 A. No.

7 Q. And you said you were a good student?

8 A. Yeah. I was definitely, like, the top of my
9 class from elementary to middle. I always had As and
10 Bs, sometimes a C.

11 Q. Okay. But then primarily A, B?

12 A. Yeah.

13 Q. Okay. And then what happened when you went
14 from middle into high school?

15 A. Well, a lot happened. When I was in middle
16 school, you know, they put me in all honor classes, so
17 when I went to high school, I was in all honors classes
18 and it seemed to be just kind of too fast paced for me
19 and I kind of tried to talk to one of the teachers, my
20 language arts teacher about it, and she just kind of
21 said, you know, you can handle it, stick to it, but
22 really it was just too fast for me and it kind of made
23 me feel discouraged.

24 And around that period of time, you know, I
25 did not really have a stable place, that I considered a

1 stable place to live so I was kind of, you know, friend
 2 to friend's house. And you know, around that time
 3 period, I was introduced to Mr. Epstein and, you know, I
 4 would go to his house and he would obviously pay me for
 5 obvious things. I think we all know.
 6 And once I started making money through him
 7 and doing business with him, quote/unquote, I dropped
 8 out of school and it was kind of my way of living for a
 9 while.
 10 Q. Okay. What would you have done if you hadn't
 11 met him?
 12 A. That's a good question. Honestly --
 13 Q. It may not be one you can answer.
 14 A. Right, because I don't know.
 15 Q. Would you have stayed in school or would you
 16 have gone elsewhere or gone over to the West Coast like
 17 your brother did?
 18 A. Possibly. Possibly. I don't know. I
 19 couldn't answer that.
 20 Q. Were you ever suspended or expelled from
 21 school?
 22 A. No.
 23 Q. Did you ever get into fights with authority
 24 figures, teachers or school officers, principals?
 25 A. No.

1 Q. Did you ever repeat any years?
 2 A. No.
 3 Q. Ninth grade is the last grade you were in or
 4 completed?
 5 A. No. Eighth grade was the last grade I
 6 completed.
 7 Q. Have you tried to get back to school or get a
 8 GED?
 9 A. Yes.
 10 Q. When was that?
 11 A. Actually, I'm waiting to take the test. It
 12 should be sent to my house either today or tomorrow,
 13 so... and it's a correspondence school that I'm going
 14 through, a Christian correspondence school.
 15 Q. Okay. How long have you been doing that for?
 16 A. For the past month I've been studying for it.
 17 Q. Okay. How do you feel your chances are?
 18 A. No, I'm ready to take the test.
 19 Q. You're ready to take it?
 20 A. Yes.
 21 Q. Good.
 22 Any problems with reading or math or --
 23 A. Yeah, I do have a little bit of difficulties.
 24 A lot of this stuff I just kind of forgot about, just
 25 basic stuff. But now that I went to Barnes & Noble's

1 and I got the GED test and I read it from front to back
 2 twice, and they have a CD rom that it comes with as
 3 well, so I'm pretty -- generally, I'm pretty good. I'm
 4 not -- sometimes I have problems with spelling but
 5 reading overall, I'm pretty good.
 6 Q. Okay. So you had some, but you think that may
 7 have been school rust for a lack of a better word?
 8 A. Right, exactly.
 9 Q. Okay. You ever been diagnosed with dyslexia
 10 or a learning disability or anything like that?
 11 A. No.
 12 Q. Okay. When you were younger, any problems
 13 with fire setting, cruelty to animals, bedwetting?
 14 A. No.
 15 Q. What type of jobs have you had?
 16 A. I've waitressed, I've -- when I was younger, I
 17 busbed tables, waitressed, hostess, everything in the
 18 restaurant business, bartender, I have danced.
 19 Q. What do you mean by danced?
 20 A. Exotic dancer.
 21 Q. Okay. Where have you danced at?
 22 A. It was [REDACTED]
 23 Q. Spelling is not one of my strong suits either,
 24 so how do you spell [REDACTED]
 25 A. I think it's [REDACTED] -- honestly, I'm not really

1 sure, [REDACTED] It was called [REDACTED] before it
 2 got shut down, but it's gone out of business. I worked
 3 there. I worked at [REDACTED]
 4 Q. Two places [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
 5 [REDACTED]
 6 A. No. I've worked at -- do you want me to name
 7 them all?
 8 Q. Yes.
 9 A. Okay. I'm trying to think of -- [REDACTED]
 10 [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] I told you about, I worked at [REDACTED]
 11 [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]
 12 Q. That's two different ones?
 13 A. Yeah.
 14 Q. Okay.
 15 A. And right here in [REDACTED] there was off of
 16 [REDACTED] there was a club. I kind of forgot the
 17 name of it. That's when I first danced when I was -- I
 18 was even way too young, but they never checked my ID, so
 19 I was able to. It was, I think, the [REDACTED]. The
 20 [REDACTED] something [REDACTED] I've worked at [REDACTED]
 21 [REDACTED] in [REDACTED] I've worked at a lot of the clubs.
 22 Q. Okay.
 23 A. And a lot of them were just for a day, do you
 24 what I mean? I went there to check it out so I don't
 25 know if you want me to list all of those because a lot

1 of the other ones I just worked at -- generally, those
 2 are the ones that I worked at.
 3 Q. Again, I don't know much about how that
 4 business works. So I mean how would you get a job at
 5 one of those places?
 6 A. You just go in and you ask them if you -- that
 7 you want a job dancing. And most of the times I asked
 8 if I could work that day, and a lot of the times they
 9 would say, okay, if you want to go in the back and get
 10 dressed. And they audition you on the stage just, you
 11 know, make sure that you're not all crazy looking, I
 12 suppose, and either they hire you or they don't.
 13 Q. Okay. And do you basically work for tips or
 14 do they pay you or --
 15 A. No.
 16 Q. Do you pay for your stage time?
 17 A. No, it's all tips and then we pay. And then
 18 you have to pay them obviously to work there, like
 19 house. And if we do the dances, \$25, you have to
 20 give -- the house gets 5, you know. But on stage, you
 21 get to keep all your tips.
 22 Q. Okay. And how much did you make a day
 23 dancing?
 24 A. It varies. You can -- nowadays, you can't --
 25 I can't make very much money, but in the past I've made

1 Q. Okay. Have you ever had any problems with a
 2 patron being too fresh or out of control?
 3 A. What, like a customer?
 4 Q. Customer.
 5 A. Yes, I have had problems with that.
 6 Q. And how do you deal with that or --
 7 A. There are bouncers. It's always -- nothing
 8 has ever gotten out of control where, you know -- if I
 9 ever had a problem with the customer, I just go up to
 10 the closest floor guy, bouncer that there is. Normally,
 11 they handle it.
 12 Q. When I've talked with some people who've done
 13 this type of work, and usually they were more at one
 14 place --
 15 A. Right.
 16 Q. -- they said that they would have a very close
 17 relationship with the bouncers.
 18 A. Right.
 19 Q. Did you have anybody in particular or any of
 20 the bouncers that you felt were very protective of you?
 21 A. Yeah, definitely. I -- when I worked at
 22 [REDACTED] the bouncer, [REDACTED] and also
 23 another bouncer [REDACTED] I was very close with them.
 24 Q. Okay. And usually folks describe them almost
 25 like a brother/sister type of relationship.

1 anywhere from \$100 to 1,000. I mean, it really varies.
 2 Q. Okay. Are you still dancing currently?
 3 A. Once in a while. The last time I danced was
 4 two weeks ago.
 5 Q. Okay. Where was that at?
 6 A. At [REDACTED] And before -- I mean,
 7 I really haven't -- I mean, before that, before two
 8 weeks ago, I hadn't danced in like two months, so...
 9 Q. Okay. Was there any place where you were kind
 10 of like a regular that you were working out for like a
 11 month or a year or --
 12 A. Yeah, that was at [REDACTED] the
 13 [REDACTED] the same club. I worked there for a very
 14 long time.
 15 Q. Okay. Were you ever fired from a club or --
 16 A. No. There was clubs that I walked out of,
 17 so...
 18 Q. Which ones were those?
 19 A. I've walked out of [REDACTED] before, the last
 20 time I worked there.
 21 Q. Okay. Why would you walk out?
 22 A. I just felt like it was a number -- there was
 23 so many girls, there wasn't -- it was just kind of a
 24 waste of my time. I wasn't making any money, I was
 25 frustrated.

1 A. Yeah, definitely.
 2 Q. Has there ever been a bouncer that you dated?
 3 A. No.
 4 Q. What's kind of the worst thing that's happened
 5 at one of these clubs?
 6 A. As in?
 7 Q. Well, you said there were times when you would
 8 have to go get a bouncer.
 9 A. Just like, you know, you're giving a dance to
 10 a guy, and they're not supposed to touch you, they're
 11 supposed to keep their hands by their side. They try
 12 touching you. You know, I try to be nice about it and
 13 say, I'm sorry, but you can't touch me as I'm dancing,
 14 and they'll try to get a cheap shot in, you know, grab
 15 your private parts or whatever if they get the chance
 16 to. And basically anytime that's happened, I stopped
 17 what I'm doing, go get a bouncer and make them give me
 18 the money for, you know -- and either give me the money.
 19 Sometimes they give me the money and then they kick them
 20 out or, you know, or that's the fullest extent of it,
 21 really. I've never had anything outlandish, crazy, you
 22 know.
 23 Q. So nobody has ever dumped you off or slapped
 24 you or --
 25 A. No.

1 Q. But somebody would try to grab you? Did they
 2 ever try to insert a finger in your vagina or anything
 3 like that?
 4 A. Right, that has happened. I mean, they've
 5 tried but never succeeded, but anytime that's ever
 6 happened, I've always stopped what I'm doing and walked
 7 away and get the bouncer and let them handle it.
 8 Q. Okay. Have you ever been propositioned while
 9 you were working at one of these clubs?
 10 A. As in?
 11 Q. As in doing something extra after hours or
 12 prostitution or --
 13 A. Right, no.
 14 Q. -- sexual favors, or...
 15 A. No.
 16 Q. It sounds like we're getting a little bit of a
 17 tropical depression.
 18 Anything else, any work that you did that you
 19 think I should know or that would be helpful for me to
 20 understand?
 21 A. I guess that's about it. I think we covered
 22 pretty much the basics.
 23 Q. Okay. Now, I understand that a lot of times
 24 there could be a lot of drugs and stuff in those clubs.
 25 A. Definitely.

1 Q. Okay. What other types of jobs have you had
 2 besides, I guess, the exotic dancing, you said?
 3 A. Right.
 4 Q. I know you said waitressing, but where else
 5 have you worked?
 6 A. I worked at a bagel shop not too long ago. I
 7 was a waitress there for about a year. I opened up my
 8 own business. It's called [REDACTED] I cleaned
 9 houses.
 10 Q. Okay.
 11 A. I've bartended.
 12 Q. Do you know the name of the bagel shop? Was
 13 it like Einstein Brothers or --
 14 A. No, it was called [REDACTED] was actually
 15 the name of it.
 16 Q. Truth in advertising.
 17 A. Yes.
 18 Q. [REDACTED] Okay.
 19 And how long did you do that for?
 20 A. The [REDACTED] I did that for about a
 21 year, a little over a year.
 22 Q. Now, was that like a franchise thing or was
 23 that your own business?
 24 A. No, that was just my own business.
 25 Q. And how many clients did you have?

1 Q. Have people come up and offered you drugs
 2 while you've been working?
 3 A. Yeah, definitely.
 4 Q. Have you ever used while working?
 5 A. Yes.
 6 Q. What would they offer you and what have you
 7 used?
 8 A. I've used in the past. I was addicted to
 9 pills.
 10 Q. Okay. Prescription medicines --
 11 A. Right.
 12 Q. -- not like heroin or cocaine?
 13 A. No, nothing ever like that, never.
 14 Q. Okay. And how old were you when you started
 15 doing that type of work?
 16 A. I was 16.
 17 Q. And how much would you do when you were 16 --
 18 A. Actually, I was 15 when my -- the first club I
 19 ever worked at was that [REDACTED]
 20 that I was telling you about, that I don't really
 21 remember. I was 15.
 22 Q. And were you working like one night a week or
 23 was this like a weekend --
 24 A. No. I was working as much as I could because
 25 at that time, I needed the money.

1 A. I would have, at the end, I had probably 30.
 2 Q. That's a good number.
 3 A. Yeah. A lot of them came from [REDACTED]
 4 which that was right at [REDACTED] so older
 5 people. So a lot of the times it was a mixture of
 6 cleaning their house, going grocery shopping for them,
 7 you know what I mean, kind of helping them out, their
 8 laundry, you know.
 9 Q. Why did you give that up?
 10 A. I actually moved farther down south. I
 11 actually got out of a relationship I was with and --
 12 with my ex, so I kind of just left this area.
 13 Q. Okay. So that's the reason you shut down?
 14 A. Yeah. That happened about a year ago. I quit
 15 all that a year ago.
 16 Q. So [REDACTED] housecleaning, bartending.
 17 Where did you attend bar at?
 18 A. Right now I'm actually still tending bar.
 19 It's call the [REDACTED] and it's in [REDACTED] And
 20 right now, it's not -- you know, I don't have a set
 21 schedule. It's more of the, you know, whenever somebody
 22 calls out or can't really make it, I'm staying right
 23 there -- literally right behind the [REDACTED] so...
 24 Q. If they need someone, it's --
 25 A. Right, it's more of a call-in, yeah, at the

1 [REDACTED]
 2 Q. Any other jobs or anything else you've done
 3 for work?
 4 A. I mean, like I said, bartended, cocktail
 5 waitressed, I've cleaned houses, I have...oh, I did
 6 telemarketing for a while. I was selling [REDACTED]
 7 Q. What's the longest job you've had?
 8 A. I would say probably -- other than dancing?
 9 Q. Sure.
 10 A. I would say when I worked at [REDACTED]
 11 and I had my own business.
 12 Q. Okay. And when you were dancing, what's the
 13 longest you stayed at any one club or --
 14 A. I stayed at [REDACTED] until -- from --
 15 round about from 16 to 20.
 16 Q. So for about four years then?
 17 A. Uh-huh.
 18 Q. Okay. And I know you said in the beginning it
 19 was kind of like an every-night type of thing. On
 20 average, how many nights would you go in?
 21 A. Actually, longer than -- I mean, for probably
 22 two years, or even three years, I would try to go almost
 23 every night. I would say about three nights on average
 24 a week.
 25 Q. Okay. Were you ever in the military?

1 Q. When did the first one start?
 2 A. The first one started -- I'm trying to go
 3 backwards here. Probably when I was like 15.
 4 Q. Okay. How long did that last for?
 5 A. Not very long. Probably like a month or so.
 6 We just kind of dated.
 7 Q. Okay.
 8 A. He was like my first boyfriend.
 9 Q. Can I get his name, if you remember?
 10 A. Yeah, [REDACTED] (phonetic).
 11 Q. Okay. And you dated him for a month?
 12 A. Give or take. Maybe longer, maybe a month,
 13 two months.
 14 Q. Okay. Next one?
 15 A. I'm trying -- I was with [REDACTED]
 16 (phonetic).
 17 Q. Could you spell that?
 18 A. [REDACTED] -- I think it's [REDACTED] but I could
 19 be wrong.
 20 Q. You'll get a question mark next to it.
 21 A. Okay.
 22 Q. How long did you date [REDACTED] for?
 23 A. I dated him for over a year.
 24 Q. Okay. All right. And the one after that?
 25 A. I dated -- his name is [REDACTED] and I dated him

1 A. No, no.
 2 Q. Did you ever take the ASVABs or anything like
 3 that in school?
 4 A. No.
 5 Q. Ever date anyone in the military?
 6 A. No.
 7 Q. Okay. I'm just going to talk a little bit
 8 about your relationship history some.
 9 A. Okay.
 10 Q. What age did you start dating?
 11 A. I started dating when I was probably like --
 12 probably around 14, 14, 15.
 13 Q. Okay. And what type of dates would those be?
 14 A. Just, you know, kind of more like crushes,
 15 going to the movies, you know, just kind of hanging out,
 16 nothing...
 17 Q. Okay. How many significant relationships have
 18 you had?
 19 A. As in sexual relationships, or --
 20 Q. No, just significant.
 21 A. Like long-term dating --
 22 Q. Long-term dating.
 23 A. -- you would say? I would say -- I'm trying
 24 to do -- probably -- one, two, three -- like four or
 25 five. Four or five.

1 for about six months or so.
 2 Q. Okay. Do you know [REDACTED] last name?
 3 A. [REDACTED]
 4 Q. Okay.
 5 A. And then I was -- I'm trying...
 6 Q. So I got [REDACTED]
 7 A. And I dated [REDACTED]
 8 Q. [REDACTED]
 9 A. [REDACTED]
 10 Q. [REDACTED]
 11 A. [REDACTED] And I was with him for a while,
 12 actually. We always liked each other, but I was with
 13 him for over two years.
 14 Q. Okay.
 15 A. But we had kind of through, you know, that
 16 whole timeline, we always talked and always liked each
 17 other, but we never did anything with one another.
 18 Q. So you knew him for at least --
 19 A. Yeah, I knew him when I was --
 20 Q. -- 12 or 13 --
 21 A. Yes.
 22 Q. -- or are we talking -- is that earlier?
 23 A. No. I knew him when I was probably 12 or 13
 24 years old.
 25 Q. Okay.

1 A. And I just -- we just broke up last -- it's
 2 been a year now that we haven't been together.
 3 Q. All right. Have you been dating since then,
 4 or --
 5 A. Yeah. I -- my boyfriend [REDACTED]
 6 Q. I'm sorry, [REDACTED]
 7 A. [REDACTED]
 8 Q. Okay.
 9 A. And I've been dating him for a little under a
 10 year.
 11 Q. Okay. Just kind of going through, why did
 12 things break up with [REDACTED]
 13 A. We were -- I was just young and so was he.
 14 Q. Okay. But I mean, did anything happen or did
 15 you just say, yeah, it's --
 16 A. Yeah, we just really weren't into each other.
 17 I guess we thought we liked each other, and...
 18 Q. Okay. How about [REDACTED]
 19 A. [REDACTED] had a drug addiction problem, and he went
 20 to rehab for it. And when he went to rehab for it,
 21 we -- me and his mother drove to Louisiana and dropped
 22 him off at the rehab, and it was best that we didn't
 23 have a relationship at that time so he could better
 24 himself.
 25 Q. Okay. What was he using?

1 A. I believe it was cocaine. He was really
 2 sneaky, so honestly I don't -- I don't know --
 3 Q. Question mark.
 4 A. -- what he was doing, right.
 5 Q. [REDACTED]
 6 A. Me and him, I've known him from when I was
 7 very young, like, probably eight, nine growing up in an
 8 old neighborhood that I used to live in. So me and him
 9 were really good friends and tried to do the whole
 10 dating thing, but it wasn't really working out so we
 11 kind of, you know, just went back to being friends, you
 12 know. We didn't want to mess that up.
