RE: 2017-2018 Contribution Limits

The following contribution limits apply for the 2017-2018 election cycle (note, the primary and general are treated as separate elections):

¹ An individual may contribute an additional \$101,700 per calendar year to both the building and recount accounts of each national party committee. An individual may contribute an additional \$101,700 per calendar year to the convention account of the DNC and RNC.

² Multicandidate PACs may contribute an additional \$45,000 per calendar year to both the building and recount accounts of each national party committee. A multicandidate PAC may contribute an additional \$45,000 per calendar year to the convention account of the DNC and RNC.

³ A candidate's campaign committee may only contribute \$2,000 (not \$2,700) per election to another candidate's campaign committee, and may make unlimited transfers to party committees.

⁴ This limit is shared by the DNC and the DSCC and the RNC and NRSC.
