I spoke to Johann Sasso as it turns out GSJ never modified the permit from the original dock which was permitted in 1987. Johann talked to all his superiors and they do not want to penalize us as the new owners for what the previous owner did. So instead of a NWP they are going to be issuing us an LOP (letter of permission). The LOP will include the current dock layout so we will be covered in the future, the maintenance of the dock and the reverse osmosis line. He will be sending a consultation letter to the agencies on Monday asking if they have any concerns and as soon as he hears back from them he will write our LOP. We should probably count on this taking about 30 days all in. This is good news because

it will permit the dock that is there now for us.

Also I made sure he saw the pictures and report of how we found the bay and the damage the previous owner did.

I also had the opportunity to speak to JP about the seagrass damage as well. I just wanted to make sure everyone knows that the damage was done by the previous owner.
