Yes: 1. There are different kinds of happy (one for each drive that is being satisfied), and they probably have different smile-incidence. (Imagine: postcoital vs post vanquishing your enemy.) 2. People show different amount of emotion if others are present (but they also show when others are absent, or when they are themselves blind). Thus, smile may additionally result from a communicative intention (share emotion, allow synchronization, demonstrate submission to group norms etc.).
