That's got a native resolution of 1900x1200 — not 4K at all. They're doing pseudo-4K, which is taking 1080p content and scaling it up. The Apple TV 4K won't play nice with that (it'll act like the existing Apple TV 4 that you have).

Also, the McIntosh MX121AV won't do 4K pass through:
