To All TPDES Permit Holders:

As noted in the previous email on March 8, 2018, the TPDES Permitting Program provided extended reprieve from reporting requirements via NetDMR's website, as normally required by your TPDES Permit.

However, as of June 1, 2018, all data that was otherwise due between September 6, 2017 and June 1, 2018 is now due (or overdue) **with no exceptions.**

As mentioned in the previous email as well, should you still be facing internet issues, or simply issues with your NetDMR account and navigating the site and submitting data, you may contact the TPDES staff as needed for assistance.

One significant issue to note at this time: We are still getting written DMRs (either mailed or hand delivered) to our office, and EPA indicates they are still getting mailed copies of DMRs. Do not send anything via email or regular mail to either DPNR or EPA. It only wastes your time as only data submitted to the NetDMR website through your authorized account will be accepted towards your reporting obligations. There is no way for DPNR or EPA to accept data otherwise. If you haven't created an account, or haven't submitted data to the site, your facility will automatically be put in Significant Non-Compliance (SNC). If you are have having issues, again, call your local office or email and we can assist with setting up your account and getting data submitted.

Due to the still ongoing effects and issues of both Hurricane Irma and Maria, the TPDES Permitting Program is providing extended reprieve from reporting requirements via NetDMR's website, as normally required by your TPDES Permit. Attached are letters that extend the reprieve from the original January 1, 2018 deadline to March 1, 2018 and then to June 1, 2018.

This will constitute the third, **and final**, extension of reporting requirements for your DMR data. All data that was otherwise due between September 6, 2017 and June 1, 2018 is now due by June 1, 2018 with no exceptions.

To All TPDES Permit Holders:

Due to the recent effects of both Hurricane Irma and Hurricane Maria, the TPDES Permitting Program is providing some reprieve and instructions for sampling, monitoring and reporting requirements as required by your individual TPDES Permit.
