## Intersession Courses\* – January 3 – 20, 2012

**Integrated Skills – Tuesday-Friday, (9:10-11:50, with 10 minute break) 12 hours/week \* \$480**

*Intermediate* INTISIN (levels 3 & 4) Kim Bayer

*High-intermediate* INTISHI (levels 5 & 6) James Willimetz

These small classes are designed to help students increase their fluency in speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Course materials will provide a jumping off point for students to practice and refine their abilities. There will be no tests or grades (pass/fail only). Instead, all of the time will be used for extensive practice of the language. Enrollment limited to 9-15 students.

**Speaking and Reading Workshops – Wednesday & Friday, (1:10-2:50pm) 4 hours/week \* \$160**

**A Midwinter Night's Dream** INTCW1—*Intermediate (levels 3 & 4)* Nicole Nordlicht  
Students will read and discuss a few short Shakespeare stories. We will also watch and talk about short clips of movies based on Shakespeare's plays. There will be activities and role plays to help improve overall fluency. There will be no tests/grades in this class, so enjoy some Shakespeare in the snow! The focus of the course is on developing fluency (pass/fail only). Enrollment limited to 9-15 students.

**Culture Surprises in the Movies** INTCW2—*High-Intermediate (levels 5-9)* Fiore Sireci  
Students will watch film clips and use them as the basis for conversation and discussion. They will talk about stereotypes. The emphasis will be on speaking about a variety of topics and issues to develop fluency beyond the basics. There will be no tests or grades (pass/fail only). Enrollment limited to 9-15 students. \$160.

**Celebrating New York City** INTCW3—*All levels* James Willimetz

Students will practice speaking English while learning about this great city—its industries, its neighborhoods, its history. This course includes field trips to special places. Students must pay entrance fees (not expensive).

**TOEFL Workshops—Tuesday & Thursday, (1:10-3:50pm, with 10 min break) 6 hours/week \* \$240**

**Preparing for the TOEFL iBT** INTCW4—*Advanced (levels 6, 7 & 8)* Gary Sarala  
Students will become familiar with the question types used in the reading, writing, speaking, and listening sections of the test. They will practice taking the test and analyze their results to determine their areas of strength and weakness.

**Speaking and Listening for the TOEFL iBT** INTCW5 —*Intermediate (levels 4 & 5)* James Willimetz. Students will become familiar with the listening and speaking sections of the TOEFL iBT. They will practice taking the test and analyze their results to determine their areas of strength and weakness.

These are part-time courses that are open to everyone and do not affect your level or visa status
