Subject: High Resolution Forecast for Wednesday 6/20


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Corn up 5% today on weather concerns.

Below is the explicit model forecast from the NWS North American Mesoscale (NAM) short term model valid Wednesday afternoon across the Midwest to East. While this may be a bit aggressive, it does highlight the risk and coverage of 95+ temperatures (with some areas near 100F in NYC/Boson/Philly). The model only goes out 60 hours...Thursday will likely be the hottest day.

We will be fine tuning the bal week on subsequent model updates, but the more important part of the forecast is likely in the late 6-10 and 11-15 Day period as models have struggled with how long to keep cool air over the Midwest/East next week (in the wake of the near term heat spike) as it appears likely that more heat will expand into the Midwest / East during the first half of July, perhaps as early as early next month.
