- [REDACTED]: calling because [REDACTED] [REDACTED] received grand jury subpoena from SDNY, [REDACTED] represents [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED]: Wants to know why we would seek her testimony, because he does not believe [REDACTED] has any information relevant to our investigation, as she did not witness any misconduct with minors and does not know anything. [REDACTED] was a professional masseuse, and worked for Epstein in a professional capacity, nothing more, and was not involved in sexual contact with him. [REDACTED] ended contact with Epstein in late 1990s
- [REDACTED]: it is often the case that it is useful for us to speak with individuals who were around and the time of certain events, even if those individuals themselves do not believe they have useful information. Indictment against Maxwell alleges crimes occurred in 1990s, and in particular alleges crimes against minors involving travel. We have reason to believe your client may have traveled with Epstein in the 1990s, and possibly may have met one or more minor victims. During an interview, we would anticipate generally asking about her recollection from that time period, who she recalls meeting, and about any travel she participated in.
