

Interview Notes for [REDACTED]

On June 13, 2019, [REDACTED], Assistant US Attorney (AUSA) for the Northern District of Georgia telephonically met with [REDACTED], a victim in the Jeffrey Epstein case. Present during the call were Deputy Chief [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], Senior Criminal Investigator (Contractor). Also present during the call were attorneys [REDACTED] representing Ms. [REDACTED].

At the beginning of the call, AUSA [REDACTED] summarized the Crime Victims' Rights Act civil action and explained that the government was interested in hearing from victims about possible remedies in the action. AUSA [REDACTED] asked [REDACTED] if she had any thoughts about how the government should proceed. [REDACTED] stated that she was willing to cooperate with any legal proceedings against Jeffrey Epstein.

[REDACTED] stated that she was 22 years old when she first met Epstein. She reported that she met Epstein in Little St. James, Virgin Islands. She added that they traveled to New York [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. While in [REDACTED], Epstein requested that she recruit other young girls. [REDACTED] reported that she kept emails between her and Epstein regarding his request for the young girls. She advised that she was never interviewed or approached by law enforcement officials concerning the Epstein investigation.

[REDACTED] asked AUSA [REDACTED] if he was a representative for the US government. She continued to ask if the United States had a responsibility to keep the citizens of allied countries safe and protected while in the country. AUSA [REDACTED] explained that the US Attorney's Office in the Northern District of Georgia had a limited role in this case and that he was tasked by the Department of Justice to work with the victims in determining possible civil remedies in this case based on the government failing to confer with the victims.

[REDACTED] said that from 2006 through 2007 Epstein sexually abused and trafficked her to his associates. She added that she had evidence to support her allegation. She further added that she witnessed scared young girls being made available to his friends. [REDACTED] further stated that she was aware that Epstein lives in Paris, France in which the legal age of consent for sex was 15 years of age.

Ms. [REDACTED] said Epstein's method was to select girls from broken homes. She stated that she believed Epstein and his associates should be held accountable for past crimes against women in the US and other countries. [REDACTED] questioned why a convicted pedophile was allowed to live in Paris without any consequences. She vowed that she and [REDACTED] would never stop fighting until Jeffrey Epstein is brought to justice.

Ms. [REDACTED] identified another victim named "[REDACTED]," and she stated that [REDACTED] younger sister was also victimized by Epstein on her 18th birthday. Ms. [REDACTED] believed that [REDACTED]'s sister was currently recruiting young girls for Epstein.

[REDACTED] reiterated that [REDACTED] would be willing to come back to the U.S. to participate in any future court proceedings.
