- [REDACTED] said appreciated client's willingness to speak with us before, but we thought [REDACTED] needed counsel
- [REDACTED] explained that GM is charged, but investigation ongoing and looking at broader conduct; aware that [REDACTED] was associate of JE
- [REDACTED] explained that we want to speak with [REDACTED] about what [REDACTED] may have witnessed with respect to GM and JE's relationship with minors
- [REDACTED] explained that in process of issuing subpoena to [REDACTED], identified one or two emails that touched on subject matter of our investigation; gave us some pause about interviewing her without counsel
 - Individual filed lawsuit [REDACTED]; allegations that plaintiff had been victim as a minor, [REDACTED] name came up in that lawsuit
 - [REDACTED] read to [REDACTED] June 1, 2016 email from [REDACTED] to JE describing [REDACTED] consenting to sexual acts and referring to herself as adult in room
- [REDACTED] explained that we want to ask [REDACTED] about contacts with [REDACTED], understanding of sexual relationship between victim and JE & GM
- [REDACTED] asked about [REDACTED] criminal exposure
- [REDACTED] explained could not give answer at this time; need to know facts
- [REDACTED] suggested attorney proffer may be helpful in first instance
- [REDACTED] said that would be helpful; said [REDACTED] is not a target; as to where [REDACTED] falls on witness to subject spectrum, under Justice Manual, a subject is defined broadly; hard to give answer without more color on [REDACTED] conduct; attorney proffer would be helpful and could discuss next steps from there
